in the late ninth century while england was fighting off viking incursions alfred the great devoted time and resources not only to military campaigns but also to a campaign of translation and education unprecedented in early medieval europe the king s english explores how alfred s translation of boethius s consolation of philosophy from latin into old english exposed anglo saxon elites to classical literature history science and christian thought more radically the boethius as it became known told its audiences how a leader should think and what he should be providing models for leadership and wisdom that live on in england to this day it also brought prestige to its kingly translator and enshrined his dialect west saxon as the literary language of the english people nicole
