humankind faces two anthropogenic threats to its survival that are closely linked the first is the end of the holocene and the start of the anthropocene which was marked by the test of a nuclear bomb on 16 july 1945 in the prevailing peace and security narrative nuclear weapons and the other country bloc or alliance pose a perceived threat to humankind s survival in the anthropocene narrative we are the threat through our way of life and the burning of fossil fuels the start of the anthropocene coincides with a change in the international order with the setting up of the un and the bretton woods institutions three stages of this order are distinguished the cold war bipolarity the post cold war era unipolarity and the end of the rule based global liberal order multipolarity on 24 february 2022 in this book ten multidisciplinary perspectives discuss complexity anthropocene geopolitics peace and security discourses and the debate on the anthropocene planetary boundaries complex crises and integrative geography in the anthropocene governance and politics and the patriacene and gender both existential threats for humankind are illustrated by cover photos of the first nuclear weapons test on 16 july 1945 and by category 5 hurricane otis an extreme weather event impacting on acapulco in mexico on 25 october 2023 the anthropocene as a new epoch of earth history coincides in 1945 with a change in the international order in the security and peace narrative the other and nuclear weapons pose an existential threat in the anthropocene narrative this dual existential change requires a rethinking of politics policy and polity in the social sciences the anthropocene is being discussed from multidisciplinary perspectives geography political science and peace security and gender studies this is an open access publication

this book is the first work to comprehensively investigate the enclaves of non japanese residents in japan in a comparative study it convincingly examines eight enclaves of five nationalities chinese korean filipino brazilian and turkish in twelve municipalities japan now leads in terms of depopulation in countries affiliated with the organisation for economic co operation and development oecd the fact that the country has been supplementing the decreased number of japanese nationals with an increase in migrants who form enclaves has attracted great attention the temporal development and status quo of such enclaves are important concerns of researchers policymakers and the general public this publication is the result of joint studies by geographers and sociologists and contributes to a more detailed understanding of these topics it thus represents a valuable achievement in the study of the segregation and enclave formation of minority nationalities the empirical validity of existing explanatory frameworks such as spatial assimilation and heterolocalism is also discussed in a japanese context

elephants rarely breed in captivity and are not considered domesticated yet they interact with people regularly and adapt to various environments too social and sagacious to be objects too strange to be human too captive to truly be wild but too wild to be domesticated where do elephants fall in our understanding of nature in wildlife in the anthropocene jamie lorimer argues that the idea of nature as a pure and timeless place characterized by the absence of humans has come to an end but life goes on wildlife inhabits everywhere and is on the move lorimer proposes the concept of wildlife as a replacement for nature offering a thorough appraisal of the anthropocene an era in which human actions affect and influence all life and all systems on our planet lorimer unpacks its implications for changing definitions of nature and the politics of wildlife conservation wildlife in the anthropocene examines rewilding the impacts of wildlife films human relationships with charismatic species and urban wildlife analyzing scientific papers policy documents and popular media as well as a decade of fieldwork lorimer explores the new interconnections between science politics and neoliberal capitalism that the anthropocene demands of wildlife conservation imagining conservation in a world where humans are geological actors entangled within and responsible for powerful unstable and unpredictable planetary forces this work nurtures a future environmentalism that is more hopeful and democratic

these topics and fields in addition the book summarises trends of the geographical sciences in china and the research level in major countries of the world through an overview of geographical education in colleges and universities the analysis of publications citations and author networks of sci ssci and cscd indexed articles and the description of sino usa sino uk and sino german cooperation this book serves as an important reference to anyone interested in geographical sciences and related fields

coined barely two decades ago the anthropocene has become one of the most influential and controversial terms in environmental policy yet it remains an ambivalent and contested formulation giving rise to a multitude of unexpected and often uncomfortable conversations this book traces in detail a broad variety of such anthropocene encounters in science philosophy and literary fiction it asks what it means to think green in a time when nature no longer offers a stable backdrop to political analysis do familiar political categories and concepts such as democracy justice power and time hold when confronted with a world radically transformed by humans the book responds by inviting more radical political thought plural forms of engagement and extended ethical commitments making it a fascinating and timely volume for graduate students and researchers working in earth system governance environmental politics and studies of the anthropocene this is one of a series of publications associated with the earth system governance project for more publications see cambridge org earth system governance

this work aims to provide unique insights into the multidisciplinary research on spatial disparities from an unconventional point of view it breaks with the conventional narrative that tends to interpret this theoretical tradition as a series of factual contributions to a better understanding of the issue instead related theories are investigated in their political economic and social contexts and spatial disparity research is presented as a political discourse it also reveals how the propagandistic problematization or de problematization of geographical inequalities serves the substantiation of political goals while taking advantage of the legitimate authority of science and the image of scientific objectivity the book explains how the discourse has functioned from 19th century social physics over the cold war period up to marxist geographies of the current neoliberal age and in what way and to what extent political considerations prevent related concepts producing objective knowledge about the complex phenomenon of spatial inequalities

the thread of energy breaks down the most influential driver of human actions and decision making energy in this book geographer martin j pasqualetti exposes the technical and fundamental influences of energy preparing scholars for the coming energy transitions that lie ahead

this book moves beyond seeing the commons in the past tense an entity passed over from the public into the private to reimagine the commons as a process a contest of force a reconstitution and a site of convening practices it highlights new spaces of gathering opening up such as the digital commons and new practices of being in common such as community economies and solidarity networks the commons is seen as a contested domain of the collective and as a changing way of being in common with the balance poised in the tensile play between political economy and social innovation the book focuses on the possibility of recovering a future in which more can be held by the many focusing on three concepts nation and nature as a commons publics and rights and bodies concerning the management of lives and livelihoods across these three passage points the book finds evidence of a commons under attack but also defended in fragile though promising ways with contributions from leading scholars this thought provoking book will be of great interest to students and scholars in geography environmental studies politics anthropology and cultural studies
