eleonora poli analyses how ideas and material interests have come to determine the evolution of antitrust policies in the usa eu japan and brics she argues that three major economic crises together with market globalisation have changed governments perceptions of market competition giving rise to a neo liberal global phase

the book critically examines the epistemological disparities between colonialism and capitalism critical cultural practices and western art institutions it does so through the lens of documenta 15 focusing on ruangrupa's lumbung approach which confronts eurocentric cultural norms and stimulates a shift towards pluriversal horizons demonstrating the transformative potential of alternative methodologies this book provides a comprehensive understanding of how collective methods and practices can cultivate pluriversal horizons in cultural institutions and policies informed by extensive field research at documenta 15 the key elements of the approach include interdisciplinary perspectives linking theory and practice and exploring under discussed dimensions of epistemological disparities it offers practical and theoretical insights into the development of frameworks for cultural practices and policies critical of coloniality and discrimination recognizes the coexistence of equally valuable epistemes and aims to dismantle eurocentric structures

in the cultural sector this valuable contribution presents relevant insights for those interested in decolonial studies diversity frameworks in cultural institutions and individuals engaged in the critique and transformation of eurocentric practices within the cultural sector it will appeal to scholars researchers and practitioners in fields such as cultural studies sociology political science cultural geography cultural policy and art education as well as professionals and policymakers

for over eighty years the arab region has been deriving massive wealth from its natural resources nevertheless its economic performance has been at the mercy of ebbs and flows of oil prices and its resources have been slowly depleting the two critical questions are why and how arab countries might escape the oil curse institutions and macroeconomic policies in resource rich arab economies focuses on the unique features of the arab world to explain the disappointing outcomes of macroeconomic policy it explores the interaction between oil and institutions to draw policy recommendations on how arab countries can best exploit their oil revenues to avoid the resource curse case studies and contributions from experts provide an understanding of macroeconomic institutions including their underlying rules procedures and institutional arrangements in oil rich arab economies and of their political economy environment which has largely been overlooked in previous research institutions and macroeconomic policies in resource rich arab economies offers novel macroeconomic policy propositions for exchange rate regimes fiscal policy and oil wealth distribution that is more consistent with macroeconomic stability and fiscal sustainability these policy reforms if implemented successfully could go a long way in helping the resource rich countries of the arab region and elsewhere to avoid the oil curse

this book presents a theory to account for why and when politics revolves around one axis of social cleavage instead of another it does so by examining the case of zambia where people identify themselves either as members of one of the country's seventy three tribes or as members of one of its four principal language groups drawing on a simple model of identity choice it shows that the answer depends on whether the country is operating under single party or multi party rule the book thus demonstrates how formal institutional rules determine the kinds of social cleavages that matter in politics

from the first vague idea to use konrad hagedorn's 60th birthday as an inspiration for taking stock of his vibrant academic contributions this joint book project has been a great pleasure for us in many ways pursuing hagedorn's intellectual development we have tried to reflect on the core questions of humanity according to ernst bloch who are we where do we come from and where are we heading in this way and without knowing it konrad hagedorn initiated a collective action process he would have very much enjoyed if he had been allowed to take part in it but it was our aim and constant motivation to surprise him with this collection of essays in his honour konrad hagedorn was reared as the youngest child of a peasant family on a small farm in the remote moorland of east frisia germany during his childhood in the poverty ridden years after the second world war he faced a life where humans were heavily dependent on using nature around them for their livelihoods meanwhile he learned about the fragility of the environment as a boy he tended a one room schoolhouse where his great intellectual talents were first recognised and used for co teaching his schoolmates these early teaching experiences might have laid the foundations for his later becoming a dedicated lecturer and mentor

writing about ideas john maynard keynes noted that they are more powerful than is commonly understood indeed the world is ruled by little else one would expect therefore that political science a discipline that focuses specifically on the nature of power would have a healthy respect for the role of ideas however for a variety of reasons not least of which is the influence of rational choice theory which presumes that individuals are self maximizing rational actors this is not the case and the literature on the topic is fairly thin as the stellar cast of contributors to this volume show ideas are in fact powerful shapers of political and social life in ideas and politics in social science research daniel béland and robert henry cox have gathered leading scholars from a variety of subdisciplines in political science and sociology to provide a general overview of the theoretical empirical and methodological issues raised by social science research on ideas and politics throughout they hone in on three central questions what is the theoretical basis for studying ideas in politics what are the best methods what sort of empirical puzzles can be solved by examining ideas and related phenomena such as discourse policy paradigms and framing processes in sum this is a state of the art academic work on both the role of ideas in politics and the analytical utility that derives from studying them

this book addresses one of the most contentious issues of postwar western Europe namely the organization of the primary and secondary stages of schooling in state education systems in examining the politics of continuity and change in postwar schooling in Britain and the Federal Republic of Germany Gregory Baldi seeks to contribute to more general understandings of education's place in the welfare state the development of social institutions and the relationship between material and ideational factors in shaping political outcomes over time

scholars have long studied how institutions emerge and become stable but why do institutions sometimes break down in this book Michael I. Ross explores the breakdown of the institutions that govern natural resource exports in developing states he shows that these institutions often break down when states receive positive trade shocks unanticipated windfalls drawing on the theory of rent seeking he suggests that these institutions succumb to a problem he calls rent seizing the predatory behavior of politicians who seek to supply rent to others and who purposefully dismantle institutions that restrain them using case studies of timber booms in Indonesia Malaysia and the Philippines he shows how windfalls tend to trigger rent seizing activities that may have disastrous consequences for state institutions and for the government of natural resources more generally he shows how institutions can

collapse when they have become endogenous to any rent seeking process
