singers generating cultural identity from k pop to beverly sills around the world and across time singers and their songs stand at the crossroads of differing politics and perspectives levils gibbs edits a collection built around the idea of listening as a political act that produces meaning contributors explore a wide range of issues by examining artists like romani icon esma red epova indian legend lata mangeshkar and pop superstar teres teng topics include gendered performances and the negotiation of race and class identities the class related contradictions exposed by the divide between highbrow and pop culture links between narratives of overcoming struggle and the distinction between privileged and marginalized identities singers ability to adapt to shifting notions of history borders gender and memory in order to connect with listeners how the meanings we

read into a singer s life and art build on one another and technology s ability to challenge our ideas about what constitutes music cutting edge and original social voices reveals how singers and their songs equip us to process social change and divergent opinions contributors christina d abreu michael k bourdaghs kwame dawes nancy guy ruth hellier john lie treva b lindsey eric lott katherine meizel carol a muller natalie sarrazin anthony seeger carol silverman andrew simon jeff todd titon and elijah wald

train to pakistan is one of the most excellent novels written on the theme of partition and is khushwant singh s paramount novel it was written in london during a time when he was functioning with krishna menon and they apprehended each other in reciprocated dislike

in 2015 the aam aadmi party aap was elected to govern delhi promising to improve public services including education through government schools that would be the equal of private school provision media reports along with the party s re election in 2020 suggest strong public confidence that aap are delivering on that promise but is this success reflected by experience in schools delhi s education revolution offers a critical evaluation of the aap s education reforms by exploring policy and practice through the eyes of one key group the government school teachers tasked with making the aap s pledge a reality drawing on 110 research interviews conducted via zoom during the covid pandemic in the summer of 2020 teachers explain how the reforms have changed their profession and practice and whether education really has improved for children of all backgrounds analysis of views about critical issues such as inclusion and the pressure of achievement targets in classrooms that often contain more than 50 students informs their observations about the reform programme itself the study paints a more qualified picture of success than suggested elsewhere and makes a valuable contribution to the understanding of education reforms in india and most especially in delhi

translated by mahmood farooqui with notes on the mutiny papers and governance in delhi 1857 by the translator when delhi lay under siege for five harrowing months in the summer of 1857 the people of the city described the events as ghadar a time of turbulence resources within the besieged city fell dangerously low and locals found the rebelling

sepoys presence and the increased levies insufferable nonetheless an extraordinary effort was launched by the government of bahadur shah zafar to fight the british thousands of labourers and tonnes of materials were mobilized funds were gathered the police monitored food prices and a functioning bureaucracy was vigilantly maintained right until the walled city s fall then as delhi was transformed by the victorious british these everyday sacrifices and the efforts of thousands of people to save their country were lost forever in this groundbreaking work mahmood farooqui presents the first extensive translations into english of the mutiny papers documents dating from delhi s 1857 siege originally written in persian and shikastah urdu the translations include such fascinating pieces as the constitution of the court of mutineers letters from soldiers threatening to leave delhi if they were not paid their salaries complaints to the police about unruly soldiers and reports of troublesome courtesans spies faqirs doctors volunteers and harassed policemen shifting focus away from the conventional understanding of the events of 1857 these translations return ordinary and anonymous men and women back into the history of 1857 besieged offers a view of how the rebel government of delhi organized the essential requirements of war food and labour soldiers salaries arms and ammunition but more than that this deeply evocative book reveals the hopes beliefs and failures of a people who lived through the tragic end of an era

in sexual states jyoti puri tracks the efforts to decriminalize homosexuality in india to show how the regulation of sexuality is fundamentally tied to the creation and enduring existence of the state since 2001 activists have attempted to rewrite section 377 of the indian penal code which in addition to outlawing homosexual behavior is often used to prosecute a range of activities and groups that are considered perverse having interviewed activists and ngo workers throughout five metropolitan centers investigated crime statistics and case law visited various state institutions and met with the police puri found that section 377 is but one element of how homosexuality is regulated in india this statute works alongside the large and complex system of laws practices policies and discourses intended to mitigate sexuality s threat to the social order while upholding the state as inevitable legitimate and indispensable by highlighting the various means through which the regulation of sexuality constitutes india s heterogeneous and fragmented sexual state puri provides a conceptual framework to understand the links between sexuality and the state more broadly

across modern history refugees have articulated their experiences and wishes against the backdrop of mass displacement brought about by world wars civil war revolution population exchange decolonisation and state formation men and women displaced in different sites from different backgrounds and at different times have played for high stakes they deliberated about what to say and to whom and they sought expected and effected a response refugee voices in modern global history places refugees at the centre of modern history it demonstrates how ordinary refugees understood their experiences of displacement and engaged with institutions that sought solutions to their predicament ranging widely across global contexts to establish what refugees had to say and to whom it shows them to have consistently been purposeful actors making it possible to transcend conventional and hackneyed depictions of crisis by adopting the term refugeedom the authors show how the voices and perspectives of refugees can be incorporated alongside the power dynamics associated with the multiple incarnations of the refugee regime that managed refugees and articulated solutions to their predicament extensive archival research across three continents makes it possible to explain in comparative terms the significance attached to the encounters between refugees and officials in modern europe south asia the middle east east asia and sub saharan africa the result is an original and in depth study of the contrasting responses of refugees to displacement and to the arrangements made on their behalf at a series of critical junctures in the past

ways of voice explores techniques of voice production in north india from bollywood to raga music to ghazal to devotional hymns and sufi song the voices in play here are not merely given but achieved singers consciously train themselves to cultivate characteristic vocal gaits sonorities and poetic attunements they adopt postures of the vocal apparatus they build habits of listening temporality and social relations the action in ways of voice revolves around several dozen north indian popular devotional classical and folk singers engaged in projects of vocal striving like most singers they are strategically working on changing refining and making their own voices the book thus highlights the ways in which singers not only have voice but actively acquire cultivate and contest particular vocal dispositions for particular kinds of listeners in framing a hindustani vocal ecumene that encompasses a diverse range of classical popular and spiritual devotional musical styles and practices it offers an expansive look at ways of voice that extend far beyond commonsense boundaries of genre and place a rich archive of audio and video examples are provided on the online companion site which can be found at weslpress org readers companions

in 1991 the collapse of the communist party and the dissolution of the soviet union launched the republics of uzbekistan kyrgyzstan and kazakhstan into an unexpected self declared independence and a precarious uncertain future emerging from almost seventy five years of soviet tutelage all three republics embarked on a process of radical change central asian women s lives have been profoundly affected during the huge upheavals of sovietization in the 1920s and democratisation in the 1990s but their experiences have gone unresearched and undocumented if central asia was generally considered to be the forgotten world of the soviet union central asian women constitute the lost voices of central asia yvonne corcoran nantes offers a timely analysis into the lives of muslim women during the soviet era and considers the impact of the shift from soviet communism to

western capitalist ideals and its impact on gender relations in the region the uneasy synthesis between socialism and islam under the soviet regime offered many women considerable status and personal freedom in public life but these gains have been rapidly eroded in the process of democratization opportunities for women have entered into serious decline in terms of employment education and socio political status unlike many commentators she offers a convincing argument that the main threat to the socio political status of women in central asia is not islamic fundamentalism but the imposition of free market principles and western liberal democratic ideals woven into the text is a also subtle and nuanced analysis of the ways in which central asian women negotiate feminism whether ushered in by soviet women during sovietization or by western ngos in the region today as a special consultant to unescap the author was one of the first researchers to undertake substantial research in the republics of kazakhstan kyrgyzstan and uzbekistan in the post independence period and this book is based on her interviews with women from the region from all sections of central asian society

the book is a pioneering study of its kind chronologically examining the novels of anita desai mostly from a feminist point of view the book excels in formally analysing indian and western traditions of feminism man woman relationship and art of characterisation in the overall context of the feminine psyche which it thoroughly examines anita desai s is a world of married women who combat to get out of the maniacles that bind them to evolve from being a mere nonentity victim to a vibrant individual capable of breaking the fetters without breaking the relationship the book is a voyage from a sense of incompetence and paranoia to self awareness and resilience to self poise and concord within the family matrix dr gupta shows how anita desai has depicted the depths of human consciousness and subconsciousness in her existential concern which makes her writings uniquely powerful through feminism hence the need and justification of the book to undertake the present study of her new perspective on feminism

in the dancer s voice rumya sree putcha theorizes how the indian classical dancer performs the complex dynamics of transnational indian womanhood putcha argues that the public persona of the indian dancer has come to represent india in the global imagination a representation that supports caste hierarchies and hindu ethnonationalism as well as white supremacist model minority narratives generations of indian women have been encouraged to embody the archetype of the dancer popularized through film cultures from the 1930s to the present through analyses of films immigration and marriage laws histories of caste and race advertising campaigns and her own family s heirlooms photographs and memories putcha reveals how women s citizenship is based on separating their voices from their bodies in listening closely to and for the dancer s voice she offers a new way to understand the intersections of body voice performance caste race gender and nation

social movements hasn t been a popular topic with researchers making up less than 3 per cent of all studies in history political science sociology and anthropology sponsored by the indian council of social science research icssr up to the mid nineties the research has had an institutional or government skew in that the study of the politics of the masses has been largely ignored there are reasons of history behind this but what has been consistently lost sight of is the fact that in the absence of an understanding of the politics of the masses the functioning of the state can be understood only partially this volume is a revised and enlarged edition of the author's review of literature on social movements in india

first commissioned by the icssr after careful deliberation on the ideal definition of a social movement the author adopts for this volume the loose idea of non institutionalised collective political action striving for social and political change on the basis of the socio economic characteristics of participants and the issues involved this volume makes a nine fold classification of social movements peasant movements tribal movements dalit movements backward caste movements women s movements working class movements students movements middle class movements and human rights and environmental movements added in this edition this book is important as much for filling a scholarly lacuna in social science studies as for proposing and executing an orderly classification of literature on social movements in modern india the original shorter monograph received an enthusiastic response from both scholars and laypersons and this volume is likely to be welcomed similarly

to produce the song sequences that are central to indian popular cinema singers voices are first recorded in the studio and then played back on the set to be lip synced and danced to by actors and actresses as the visuals are filmed since the 1950s playback singers have become revered celebrities in their own right brought to life by the voice explores the distinctive aesthetics and affective power generated by this division of labor between onscreen body and offscreen voice in south indian tamil cinema in amanda weidman s historical and ethnographic account playback is not just a cinematic technique but a powerful and ubiquitous element of aural public culture that has shaped the complex dynamics of postcolonial gendered subjectivity politicized ethnolinguistic identity and neoliberal transformation in south india

this collection of essays focuses on the post 1980s period of the indian feminist movement a moment rich in new and different modes of resistance of widespread political engagements with issues of rights of justice of identity and much more the writers here all well known activists and founders of some of the most important of feminist institutions describe their individual and collective journeys bringing attention to the movement to their struggles their campaigns their victories and the challenges they have faced in using the tools of feminist analysis a focus on life stories on oral accounts on group formation and more they also make a case for advocacy through legal and socio political means despite being one of the most dynamic of feminist movements in the world the indian feminist movement has seldom been recognized as such and yet in

addressing how women s oppression and discrimination lie at the intersection of complex inequalities of caste of region and religion of class of patriarchy race ethnicity to name only a few the writers in this volume make a case for the need for constant introspection reflection and self questioning so that the movement can learn and grow they show how in india and indeed across much of south asia it is feminists who have stood against capitalism war and violence environmental degradation and fundamentalism and have forged alliances with varied movements learning from them working strengthening them but also infusing them with a feminist analysis

introduces non western ir traditions to a western ir audience and challenges the dominance of western theory this book challenges criticisms that ir theory is western focused and therefore misrepresents much of world history by introducing the reader to non western traditions literature and histories relevant to how ir is conceptualised

in empire and poetic voice patrick colm hogan draws on a broad and detailed knowledge of indian african and european literary cultures to explore the way colonized writers respond to the subtle and contradictory pressures of both metropolitan and indigenous traditions he examines the work of two influential theorists of identity judith butler and homi bhabha and presents a revised evaluation of the important nigerian critics chinweizu jemie and madubuike in the process he presents a novel theory of literary identity based equally on recent work in cognitive science and culture studies this theory argues that literary and cultural traditions like languages are entirely personal and only appear to be a matter of groups due to our assertions of categorical identity which are ultimately both false and dangerous
