extending the tradition of this series which has become a standard reference work in language acquisition this volume contains chapters on seven more languages including a section on ergative languages languages in this volume include georgian greenlandic k iche mayan warlpiri mandarin scandinavian and sesotho

The study of code switching has been carried out from linguistic psycholinguistic and sociolinguistic perspectives largely in isolation from each other this volume attempts to unite these three research strands by placing at the centre of the enquiry the role played by social factors in the occurrence forms and outcomes of code switching the contributions in this volume are divided into three parts code switching between cognition and socio pragmatics multilingual interaction and identity and code switching and social structure the case studies represent contact settings on five continents and feature languages with diverse linguistic affiliations they are predictive and descriptive in their research goals and rely on experimental or naturalistic data but they share the common goal of seeking to explain how social structures ideologies and identity impact on the grammatical and conversational features of code switching and language mixing and on the emergence of mixed languages given its scope this volume is a significant addition to the empirical and theoretical foundations of the study of code switching it is also of relevance to the general debate on the inter relationships between language and society

Lesotho is rather different from most other African countries for starters it is a kingdom which preserves a traditional hierarchy and customs and its population consists of one fairly homogenous ethnic group although admittedly there are differences and occasional rifts within it then it is a landlocked country completely surrounded by South Africa on which it depends heavily economically it has not been doing particularly well this partly because the country is so poorly endowed by nature and its people often eke out a living abroad politically there have been ups and downs the downs fortunately lying in the past with Lesotho doing somewhat better since the latest elections socially and culturally as hinted it is quite unique and this can be gathered from reading the book this second edition of historical dictionary of Lesotho covers the full scope of Lesotho's ancient colonial and independence eras it gives greater emphasis to the more recent period and brings the book fully up to date this is done through a chronology an introductory essay appendixes and an extensive bibliography the dictionary section has over 400 cross referenced entries on civil society key events leaders governmental international religious and other private organizations policies political movements and parties economic elements and many other areas that have shaped the country's trajectory this book is an excellent access point for students researchers and anyone

wanting to know more about lesotho

this volume is a comprehensive up to date and readable introduction to linguistic meaning while partial to conceptual and typological approaches the book also presents results from formal approaches throughout the focus is on grammatical meaning the way languages delineate universal semantic space and encode it in grammatical form subjects covered by the author include the domain of linguistic semantics and the basic tools assumptions and issues of semantic analysis semantic properties of entities events and thematic roles language and space tense aspect and the internal structure and temporal ordering of events modality negation and the epistemology of the speaker and modification and attribution in contrast to most current treatments of semantics this book is accessible to the beginning student of semantics and linguistics and also useful to the advanced practitioner a textbook and reference work in a single volume it can be used in a number of disciplines psychology computer science and anthropology as well as linguistics

modern linguistic theory has been based on the promise of explaining how language acquisition can occur so rapidly with such subtlety and with both surprising uniformity and diversity across languages this handbook provides a summary and assessment of how far that promise has been fulfilled exploring core concepts in acquisition theory including notions of the initial state parameters triggering theory the role of competition and frequency and many others across a variety of syntactic topics that have formed the central domains of investigation and debate these topics are treated from the unique perspective of central actors in each domain who have helped shape the research agenda the authors have presented a summary of the data the theories under discussion and their own best assessments of where each domain stands providing as well the agenda for future work in the field showing both particular needs and general directions that should be pursued in the coming decades

this book is about recurrent functions of applicative morphology not included in typologically oriented definitions based on substantial cross linguistic evidence it challenges received wisdom on applicatives in several ways first in many of the surveyed languages applicatives are the sole means to introduce a non actor semantic role into a clause when there is an alternative way of expression the applicative counterpart often has no valence increasing effect on the targeted root second applicative morphology can introduce constituents which are not syntactic objects and or co occur with obliques third functions such as conveying aspectual nuances to the predicate intensity repetition habituality or its arguments partitive p highly individuated p narrow focusing constituents and functioning as category changing devices are attested in geographically distant and genetically unrelated languages further this volume reveals that spatial related morphology is prone to developing applicative functions in disparate languages and phyla finally several contributions discuss the diachrony of applicative constructions and their non syntactic attested functions including a case of applicatives in the making

this volume explores linguistic metaphor identification in a wide variety of languages and language families the book is an essential read for anyone interested in researching language and metaphor from students to experienced scholars its primary goals are to discuss the challenges involved in applying the metaphor identification procedure vrije universiteit mipvu to a range of languages across the globe and to offer theoretically grounded advice and guidelines enabling researchers to identify metaphors in multiple languages in a valid and replicable way the volume is intended as a practical guidebook that identifies and discusses procedural challenges of metaphor identification across languages thus better enabling researchers to reliably identify metaphor in a multitude of languages although able to be read independently this volume written by metaphor researchers from around the world is the ideal companion volume for the 2010 benjamins book a method for linguistic metaphor identification from mip to mipvu

other aspects of developing grammars and this is indeed what the contributions to this volume do parameterization of functional categories may however be understood in different ways even if one shares the dual assumptions that substantive elements verbs nouns etc are present in all grammars and that x bar principles are part of the grammatical knowledge available to the child prior to language specific learning processes from these assumptions it follows that the child should from early on be able to construct projections on the basis of these elements the role of functional categories however may still be interpreted differently one possibility first suggested by radford 1986 1990 and by guilfoyle and noonan 1988 is that children must discover which functional categories fc need to be implemented in the grammar of the language they are acquiring another possibility first explored by hyams 1986 is that a specific category is present in developing grammars but that parameter values are set in a way deviating from the target adult grammar corresponding however to options realized in other adult systems a third option would be that these categories might be specified differently in developing as opposed to mature grammars all three are explored in the papers collected in this volume before outlining the various hypotheses in more detail however i would like briefly to sketch the grammatical context in which the following debate is situated 2

aids has devastated communities across southern africa in lesotho where a quarter of adults are infected the wide ranging implications of the disease have been felt in every family disrupting key aspects of social life in infected kin ellen block and will mcgrath argue that aids is fundamentally a kinship disease examining the ways it transcends infected individuals and seeps into kin relations and networks of care while much aids scholarship has turned away from the difficult daily realities of those affected by the disease infected kin uses both ethnographic scholarship and creative nonfiction to bring to life the joys and struggles of the basotho people at the heart of the aids pandemic the result is a book accessible to wide readership yet built upon scholarship and theoretical contributions that ensure infected kin will remain relevant to anyone interested in anthropology kinship global health and care supplementary instructor resources csbsju edu sociology faculty anthropology teaching resources infected kin teaching resources

reclaiming home is the diary of lesego malepe's travels in south africa in 2004 the 10th anniversary of south africa's democracy the book begins with malepe taking the bus from pretoria where she grew up to cape town where she visits robben island the prison where her brother served a life sentence during apartheid days she interrupts her travels to return to pretoria where she attends the ceremony marking the official settlement of land claims for her parents property and her grandmother's property in kilnerton pretoria which were confiscated by the apartheid government when malepe was four forcing her family along with the rest of their community to move to mamelodi township for africans over the course of her travels malepe traverses much of her home country visiting locales including pietermaritzburg durban port elizabeth thohoyandou the university of venda and giyani ultimately hers is a sprawling revealing journey that illuminates the ways south africa has changed and the ways it has remained the same since the end of apartheid

after forty years in academia p s groenwald leaves a rich heritage which is measured not only in terms of his impressive list of publications but also in terms of those for whom he was the academic mentor his versatility as academic is reflected in the variety of specialist fields in which his former students find themselves experts in literature and linguistics lexicographers and translators all found their niches under his tutelage in appreciation of the enormous contribution that he made towards their careers and academic schooling former students and colleagues have decided to honour him with this festschrift

in the beginning before there are words or syntax or discourse there is speech speech is an infant's gateway to language without exposure to speech no language or at most only a feeble facsimile of language develops regardless of how rich a child's biological endowment for language learning may be but little is given directly in speech not words for example as anyone who has ever listened to fluent conversation in an unfamiliar language can attest rather words and phrases or rudimentary categories or whatever other information is required for syntactic and semantic analyses to begin operating must be pulled from speech through an infant's developing perceptual capacities by the end of the first year an infant can segment at least some words from fluent speech beyond this how impoverished or rich an infant's representations of input may be remains largely unknown clearly in the debate over determinants of early language acquisition the input speech stream has too often been offhandedly dismissed as a potential source of information this volume brings together internationally known scholars from a range of disciplines linguistics psychology cognitive and computer science and acoustics who share common interests in how speech in its phonological prosodic distributional and statistical properties may encode information useful for early language learning and how such information may be deciphered by very young children these scholars offer a spectrum of viewpoints on the possibility that aspects of speech may provide bootstraps for language learning contribute important state of the art findings across a variety of relevant domains and illuminate critical directions for future inquiry the publication of this volume represents a significant step in renewing the bonds between two fields that have long been sundered speech perception and language acquisition

this monograph is the first study of the acquisition of swahili as a first language it focuses on the acquisition of inflectional affixes with a particular emphasis on subject agreement and tense other inflectional affixes are also investigated including object agreement and mood the study surveys the adult dialect in question nairobi swahili discussing social phonological morphological and syntactic properties data analyses and copious examples are presented of the naturalistic speech of four swahili speaking children the data are tested against six influential theories of child language and the results show that processing and metrical theories of telegraphic speech fail to account for the observed patterns while grammatical theories of child language fair significantly better the data and analyses presented in this book are indispensable for linguists and psychologists interested in the acquisition of inflectional material and other cross linguistic properties of child language

this book presents a new cross linguistic analysis of gender and its effects on morphosyntax it addresses questions including the syntactic location of gender features the role of natural gender and the relationship between syntactic gender features and the morphological realization of gender ruth kramer argues that gender features are syntactically located on the n head little n which serves to nominalize category neutral roots those gender features are either interpretable as in the case of natural gender or uninterpretable like the gender of an inanimate noun in spanish adopting distributed morphology the book lays out how the gender features on n map onto the gender features relevant for morphological exponence the analysis is supported by an in depth case study of amharic which poses challenges for previous gender analyses and provides clear support for gender on n the proposals generate a typology of two and three gender systems with the various types illustrated using data from a genetically diverse set of languages finally further evidence for gender being on n is provided from case studies of somali and romanian as well as from the relationship between gender and other linguistic phenomena including derived nouns and declension class overall the book provides one of the first large scale cross linguistically oriented theoretical approaches to the morphosyntax of gender

lesotho is a landlocked country located in southern africa surrounded by south africa the country has a population of approximately 2 2 million people and is known for its mountainous terrain which has earned it the nickname the kingdom in the sky lesotho is also known for being one of the highest altitude countries in the world with the lowest point in the country being 1 400 metres above sea level the country s economy is largely based on agriculture with maize sorghum and wheat being the main crops grown lesotho also has a growing textile industry which is largely supported by foreign investment despite the country s natural beauty and resources lesotho faces a number of challenges including high levels of poverty and hiv aids which is one of the highest rates in the world the government has made significant efforts to address these issues but there is still a long way to go in terms of improving the quality of life for the people of lesotho overall lesotho is a country with a rich cultural heritage and natural beauty but also faces a number of social and economic challenges that must be addressed in order for it to thrive
