one of the few books to explore lesbian parenting these hilarious heart wrenching painfully honest tales of mommyhood celebrate the ups and downs of being an lgbtqia parent in the 21st century joey solloway creator of transparent after author harlyn aizley gave birth to her daughter she watched in unanticipated horror as her partner scooped up the baby and said i m your new mommy while they both had worked to find the perfect sperm donor aizley had spent nine months carrying the baby and hours in labor so how could her partner claim to be their child s mommy many diapers later aizley began to appreciate the complexity of her partner s new role as the other mother together they searched for stories about families like their own in which a woman has chosen to forgo her own birth experience so that she might support her partner in hers they found very few now in confessions of the other mother aizley has put together an exciting collection of personal stories by women like her partner who are creating new parenting roles redefining motherhood and reshaping our view of two parent families contributors include hillary goodridge who was one of the lead plaintiffs in the case for same sex marriage in massachusetts stand up comedian judy gold and psychologist and author suzanne m johnson this candid peek into a previously unexamined side of lesbian parenting is full of stories that are sometimes humorous sometimes moving but at all times celebratory each parenting tale sheds light on the many facets of motherhood offering gay and straight readers alike a deeper understanding of what it means to love and parent in the twenty first century

this work represents a collection of the most pertinent writing of the past fifteen years in the united states and canada on the topic of lesbians and child custody articles were selected on the basis of their relevance succinctness and representativeness of the various aspects of child custody involving lesbians some of the original psychological studies comparing lesbian mothers to heterosexual mothers were sacrificed in favor of the piece by patricia falk a thorough review of the psychological literature for others the length of the manuscript was prohibitive as was the case with the thorough step by step lesbian mothers litigation manual by donna hitchens and roberta achtenberg of the national center for lesbian rights

feminist scholars of motherhood distinguish between mothering and motherhood and argue that the latter is a patriarchal institution that is oppressive to women few scholars however have considered

how mothering as a female defined and centred experience may be a site of empowerment for women this collection is the first to do so mother outlaws examines how mothers imagine and implement theories and practices of mothering that are empowering to women central to this inquiry is the recognition that mothers and children benefit when the mother lives her life and practices mothering from a position of agency authority authenticity and autonomy

bridging the gap between feminist studies of motherhood and queer theory mothering queerly queering motherhood articulates a provocative philosophy of queer kinship that need not be rooted in lesbian or gay sexual identities working from an interdisciplinary framework that incorporates feminist philosophy and queer psychoanalytic poststructuralist and postcolonial theories shelley m park offers a powerful critique of an ideology she terms monomaterialism despite widespread cultural insistence that every child should have one and only one real mother many contemporary family constellations do not fit this mandate park highlights the negative consequences of this ideology and demonstrates how families created through open adoption same sex parenting divorce and plural marriage can be sites of resistance drawing from personal experiences as both an adoptive and a biological mother and juxtaposing these autobiographical reflections with critical readings of cultural texts representing multi mother families park advocates a new understanding of postmodern families as potentially queer coalitional assemblages held together by a mixture of affection and critical reflection premised on difference

what do mothers want and need from their parenting partners their extended families their friends colleagues and communities and what can mental health professionals do to help them meet their daunting responsibilities in the contemporary world the talented contributors to what do mothers want address these questions from perspectives that encompass differences in marital status parental status gender and sexual orientation traversing the biological psychological cultural and economic dimensions of mothering they provide a compelling brief on the perplexing choices confronting mothers in the contemporary world of course mothers most basically want their children to be safe and healthy but to this end they want and need many things caring partners intergenerational and community support a responsive workplace public services and opportunities to share their experiences with other mothers and they want their feelings and actions as mothers to be understood and accepted by those around them and by society at large the role of psychotherapy in reaching these latter goals is taken up by many of the contributors they reflect on the special psychological challenges of pregnancy birth and the arrival of a newborn into a couple s whether hetero or homosexual life and they address new venues of therapeutic assistance such as brief low cost therapy for at risk mothers and infants and group interventions to help couples grow into the new role of parental couples

this book recognizes that intense public battles are being waged in the u s over the rights of lgb people to form legally and culturally recognized families their families are under a kind of sociopolitical scrutiny at this historical moment that compels us all to take stock of our strategies of family building and more broadly the meaning of family in the u s today through in depth open ended qualitative interviews with 61 self identified lesbian gay and bisexual people regarding how they came to have children or remain childless childfree this book reveals the challenges posed by homophobia and discrimination and showcases the creative strategies resilience and resourcefulness of lesbians bisexuals and gays as they build families with or without children after coming out from descriptions of how the early process of coming out affected the desire to parent or remain childfree to stories about the impact of homophobia and discrimination on the decision making process to the dynamics within couples that lead to becoming parents or remaining childfree to examining how cultural notions of the strength of biology are employed when having children to accounts of how the closet can be used strategically when bringing children into a family their voices form the heart of this book in a sociopolitical context in which gay lesbian and bisexual people often have to struggle to access the array of rights and opportunities that are afforded to most heterosexual people without question addressing the questions raised in this book is an urgent and necessary endeavor

lgbt parent families is the first handbook to provide a comprehensive examination of this underserved area reflecting the nature of this issue the volume is notably interdisciplinary with contributions from scholars in psychology sociology human development family studies gender studies sexuality studies legal studies social work and anthropology additionally scholarship from regions beyond the u s including england australia canada and south africa is presented in addition to gender and sexuality all contributors address issues of social class race and ethnicity in their chapters
