this collection which grew out of a research conference held at arizona state universoty in november 1997 examines varieties of chicano latino homoerotic identities it includes essays by a group of scholars who are engaged in defining the parameters of these identities and who are concerned with how those identities interact with the dominate ones articulated by a hegemonic anglo society in the united states

when brazil was honored at the frankfurt book fair in 2013 the brazilian author luiz ruffato opened the event with a provocative speech claiming that literature through its pervasive depiction and discussion of otherness has the potential to provoke ethical transformation this book uses ruffato's speech as a starting point for the discussion of contemporary brazilian literature that stands in contrast to the repetition of social and cultural clichés by illuminating the relevance of humanities and literature as a catalyst for rethinking brazil the book offers a resistance to the official discourses that have worked for so long to conceal social tensions injustices and secular inequities in brazilian society in doing so it situates brazilian literature away from the exotic and peripheral spectrum and closer to a universal and more relevant ethical discussion for readers from all parts of the world the volume brings together fresh contributions on both canonical contemporary authors such as graciliano ramos rubem fonseca and dalton trevisan and traditionally silenced writing subjects such as afro brazilian female authors these essays deal with specific contemporary literary and social issues while engaging with historically constitutive phenomena in brazil including authoritarianism violence and the systematic violation of human rights the exploration of diverse literary genres from novels to graphic novels from poetry to crônicas and engagement with postcolonial studies gender studies queer studies cultural studies brazilian studies south american literature and world literature carves new space for the emergence of original brazilian thought

in this history of right wing politics in brazil during the cold war benjamin cowan puts the spotlight on the cold warriors themselves drawing on little tapped archival records he shows that by midcentury conservatives individuals and organizations civilian as well as military were firmly situated in a transnational network of right wing cultural activists they subsequently joined the powerful hardline constituency supporting brazil's brutal military dictatorship from 1964 to 1985 there they lent their weight to a dictatorship that cowan argues operationalized a moral panic that conflated communist subversion with manifestations of modernity coalescing around the crucial nodes of gender and sexuality particularly in relation to youth women and the mass media the confluence of an empowered right and a security establishment suffused with rightist moralism created strongholds of anticommunism that spanned government agencies spurred repression and generated attempts to control and even change quotidian behavior tracking how limits to cold war authoritarianism finally emerged cowan concludes that the record of autocracy and

repression in brazil is part of a larger story of reaction against perceived threats to traditional views of family gender moral standards and sexuality a story that continues in today s culture wars

based on long term field research carried out over more than 15 years beneath the equator examines the changing shape of male homosexuality and the emergence of diverse and vibrant gay communities in urban brazil drawing on detailed ethnographic description of multiple sexual worlds organized around street cruising and impersonal sex male prostitution transgender performances gay commercial markets and establishments gay rights activism and aids service provision richard parker examines the changing sexual identities cultures and communities that have taken shape in brazil in recent years also includes 15 maps

puts forward a new provocative history of queer cinema in brazil through an analysis of contemporary brazilian cinematic production cannibalizing queer brazilian cinema from 1970 to 2015 discusses which queer representations are erased and which are acknowledged in the complex processes of cultural translation adaptation and devouring that defines the brazilian understanding of sexual dissidents and minorities joão brazilian cinema studies to acknowledge the importance of 1920s modernism and of antropografia a conceptual mode of cannibalism to adopt and extrapolate a perverse form of absorption and raise the stakes on queer theory and postcolonialism and to demonstrate how they are crucial to the development of a queer tradition in brazilian cinema in five chapters and two trailers nemi neto understands the term queer through its political dimensions because the films he analyzes represent characters that conform neither to american coming out politics nor to brazilian identity politics nonetheless the films are queer precisely because the queer experiences and affection explored in these films do not necessarily insist on identifying characters as a particular sexuality or gender identity therefore attention to characters within a unique cinematic world raises the stakes on several issues that hinge on cinematic form narrative and representation nemi neto interviews and examines the work of joão silvário trevisan and provides readings of films such as aids o furor do sexo explícito aids the furor of explicit sex 1986 and dzi croquetes dzi croquetes 2009 to theorize a productive overlap between queer and antropofagia moreover the films analyzed here depict queer alternative representations to both homonormativity and heteronormativity as forms of resistance at the same time as prejudice and heteronormativity remain present in contemporary brazilian social practices graduate students and scholars of cinema and media studies queer studies brazilian modernism and latin american studies will value what one early reader called a point of departure for all future research on brazilian queer cinema

the unwritten brazilian constitution offers an unexplored topic outside portuguese language the leading cases on human rights in the brazilian supreme court supremo tribunal federal stf the brazilian constitution of 1988 represents an institutional framework able to restructure the relationship between the powers after the military dictatorship the constituents drafted the brazilian constitution in order to set an extensive system of judicial protection for fundamental rights by means of several instruments that have strengthened access to the judiciary because the brazilian constitution has an extensive list of fundamental rights the stf was called to interpret them several times and it developed an unwritten understanding of these fundamental rights these decisions are not available to the international community since they are not translated to english based on this gap this original book illustrates the main rulings on human rights analyzed by great scholars in brazil the text presents a deep discussion regarding the characteristics of the cases and demonstrates how the stf has built the legal arguments to interpret the extension of the fundamental rights

christopher dunn's history of authoritarian brazil exposes the inventive cultural production and intense social transformations that emerged during the rule of an iron fisted military regime during the sixties and seventies the brazilian contracultura was a complex and multifaceted phenomenon that developed alongside the ascent of hardline forces within the regime in the late 1960s focusing on urban middle class brazilians often inspired by the international counterculture that flourished in the united states and parts of western europe dunn shows how new understandings of race gender sexuality and citizenship erupted under even the most oppressive political conditions dunn reveals previously ignored connections between the counterculture and brazilian music literature film visual arts and alternative journalism in chronicling desbunde the brazilian hippie movement he shows how the state of bahia renowned for its afro brazilian culture emerged as a countercultural mecca for youth in search of spiritual alternatives as this critical and expansive book demonstrates many of the country's social and justice movements have their origins in the countercultural attitudes practices and sensibilities that flourished during the military dictatorship

a taboo subject in many cultures homosexuality has been traditionally repressed in latin america both as a way of life and as a subject for literature yet numerous writers have attempted to break the cultural silence surrounding homosexuality using various strategies to overtly or covertly discuss lesbian and gay themes in this study david william foster examines more than two dozen texts that deal with gay and lesbian topics drawing from them significant insights into the relationship between homosexuality and society in different latin american countries and time periods foster's study includes works both sympathetic and antagonistic to homosexuality showing the range of opinion on this topic the preponderance of his examples come from argentina brazil and mexico countries with historically active gay communities although he also includes material on other countries noteworthy among the authors covered are reinaldo arenas adolfo caminha isaac cho josé donoso sylvia molloy alejandra pizarnik and luis zapata

the revised edition of the gay and lesbian literary heritage is a reader's companion to this impressive body of work it provides overviews of gay and lesbian presence in a variety of literatures and historical periods in depth critical essays on major gay and lesbian authors in world literature and briefer treatments of other topics and figures important in appreciating the rich and varied gay and lesbian literary traditions included are nearly 400 alphabetically arranged articles by more than 175 scholars from around the world new articles in this volume feature authors such as michael cunningham tony kushner anne lister kate millet jan morris terrence mcnelly and sarah waters essays on topics such as comedy of manners and autobiography and overviews of danish norwegian philippines and swedish literatures as well as updated and revised articles and bibliographies

gay and lesbian themes in latin american literature have been largely ignored this reference fills this gap by providing more than a hundred alphabetically arranged entries for latin american authors who have treated gay or lesbian material in their works each entry explores the significance of gay and lesbian themes in a particular author's writings and

closes with a bibliography of primary and secondary sources the figures included have a professed gay identity or have written on gay or lesbian themes in either a positive or negative way or have authored works in which a gay sensibility can be identified the volume pays particular attention to the difficulty of ascribing north american critical perspectives to latin american authors and studies these authors within the larger context of latin american culture the book includes entries for men and women and for authors from latin american countries as well as latino writers from the united states the entries are written by roughly 60 expert contributors from latin america the u s and europe

international perspectives on equality diversity and inclusion examines the complex nature of equality diversity and inclusion in the world of work through interdisciplinary comparative and critical perspectives

forges a new understanding of how these two lusophone nations are connected the closely entwined histories of portugal and brazil remain key references for understanding developments past and present in either country accordingly fernando arenas considers portugal and brazil in relation to one another in this exploration of changing definitions of nationhood subjectivity and utopias in both cultures examining the two nations shared language and histories as well as their cultural social and political points of divergence arenas pursues these definitive changes through the realms of literature intellectual thought popular culture and political discourse both brazil and portugal are subject to the economic political and cultural forces of postmodern globalization arenas analyzes responses to these trends in contemporary writers including jose saramago caio fernando abreu maria isabel barreno vergilio ferreira clarice lispector and maria gabriela llansol ultimately utopias of otherness shows how these writers have redefined the concept of nationhood not only through their investment in utopian or emancipatory causes such as marxist revolution women s liberation or sexual revolution but also by shifting their attention to alternative

modes of conceiving the ethical and political realms

in slavery unseen lamonte aidoo upends the narrative of brazil as a racial democracy showing how the myth of racial democracy elides the history of sexual violence patriarchal terror and exploitation of slaves drawing on sources ranging from inquisition trial documents to travel accounts and literature aidoo demonstrates how interracial and same sex sexual violence operated as a key mechanism of the production and perpetuation of slavery as well as racial and gender inequality the myth of racial democracy aidoo contends does not stem from or reflect racial progress rather it is an antiblack apparatus that upholds and protects the heteronormative white patriarchy throughout brazil s past and on into the present

the biblical story of the destruction of sodom has inspired countless literary visions the city has elicited writing from milton sade proust dostoevsky and tournier among others this work contains an anthology of sodom texts spanning several centuries paul hallam has also provided his own reading of these languages of prejudice obsession and desire in an extensive essay
