this collection which grew out of a research conference held at arizona state universoty in november 1997 examines varieties of chicano latino homoerotic identities it includes essays by a group of scholars who are engaged in defining the parameters of these identities and who are concerned with how those identities interact with the dominate ones articulated by a hegemonic anglo society in the united states

repression in brazil is part of a larger story of reaction against perceived threats to traditional views of family gender moral standards and sexuality a story that continues in today s culture wars

based on long term field research carried out over more than 15 years beneath the equator examines the changing shape of male homosexuality and the emergence of diverse and vibrant gay communities in urban brazil drawing on detailed ethnographic description of multiple sexual worlds organized around street cruising and impersonal sex male prostitution transgender performances gay commercial markets and establishments gay rights activism and aids service provision richard parker examines the changing sexual identities cultures and communities that have taken shape in brazil in recent years also includes 15 maps

the unwritten brazilian constitution offers an unexplored topic outside portuguese language the leading cases on human rights in the brazilian supreme court supremo tribunal federal stf the brazilian constitution of 1988 represents an institutional framework able to restructure the relationship between the powers after the military dictatorship the constituents drafted the brazilian constitution in order to set an extensive system of judicial protection for fundamental rights by means of several instruments that have strengthened access to the judiciary because the brazilian constitution has an extensive list of fundamental rights the stf was called to interpret them several times and it developed an unwritten understanding of these fundamental rights these decisions are not available to the international community since they are not translated to english based on this gap this original book illustrates the main rulings on human rights analyzed by great scholars in brazil the text presents a deep discussion regarding the characteristics of the cases and demonstrates how the stf has built the legal arguments to interpret the extension of the fundamental rights

christopher dunn s history of authoritarian brazil exposes the inventive cultural production and intense social transformations that emerged during the rule of an iron fisted military regime during the sixties and seventies the brazilian contracultura was a complex and multifaceted phenomenon that developed alongside the ascent of hardline forces within the regime in the late 1960s focusing on urban middle class brazilians often inspired by the international counterculture that flourished in the united states and parts of western europe dunn shows how new understandings of race gender sexuality and citizenship erupted under even the most oppressive political conditions dunn reveals previously ignored connections between the counterculture and brazilian music literature film visual arts and alternative journalism in chronicling desbunde the brazilian hippie movement he shows how the state of bahia renowned for its afro brazilian culture emerged as a countercultural mecca for youth in search of spiritual alternatives as this critical and expansive book demonstrates many of the country s social and justice movements have their origins in the countercultural attitudes practices and sensibilities that flourished during the military dictatorship

a taboo subject in many cultures homosexuality has been traditionally repressed in latin america both as a way of life and as a subject for literature yet numerous writers have attempted to break the cultural silence surrounding homosexuality using various strategies to overtly or covertly discuss lesbian and gay themes in this study david william foster examines more than two dozen texts that deal with gay and lesbian topics drawing from them significant insights into the relationship between homosexuality and society in different latin american countries and time periods foster s study includes works both sympathetic and antagonistic to homosexuality showing the range of opinion on this topic the preponderance of his examples come from argentina brazil and mexico countries with historically active gay communities although he also includes material on other countries noteworthy among the authors covered are reinaldo arenas adolfo caminha isaac cho jos donoso sylvia molloy alejandra pizarnik and luis zapata

international perspectives on equality diversity and inclusion examines the complex nature of equality diversity and inclusion in the world of work through interdisciplinary comparative and critical perspectives

forges a new understanding of how these two lusophone nations are connected the closely entwined histories of portugal and brazil remain key references for understanding developments past and present in either country accordingly fernando arenas considers portugal and brazil in relation to one another in this exploration of changing definitions of nationhood subjectivity and utopias in both cultures examining the two nations shared language and histories as well as their cultural social and political points of divergence arenas pursues these definitive changes through the realms of literature intellectual thought popular culture and political discourse both brazil and portugal are subject to the economic political and cultural forces of postmodern globalization arenas analyzes responses to these trends in contemporary writers including jose saramago caio fernando abreu maria isabel barreno vergilio ferreira clarice lispector and maria gabriela llansol ultimately utopias of otherness shows how these writers have redefined the concept of nationhood not only through their investment in utopian or emancipatory causes such as marxist revolution women s liberation or sexual revolution but also by shifting their attention to alternative

modes of conceiving the ethical and political realms

in slavery unseen lamonte aidoo upends the narrative of brazil as a racial democracy showing how the myth of racial democracy elides the history of sexual violence patriarchal terror and exploitation of slaves drawing on sources ranging from inquisition trial documents to travel accounts and literature aidoo demonstrates how interracial and same sex sexual violence operated as a key mechanism of the production and perpetuation of slavery as well as racial and gender inequality the myth of racial democracy aidoo contends does not stem from or reflect racial progress rather it is an antiblack apparatus that upholds and protects the heteronormative white patriarchy throughout brazil s past and on into the present

the biblical story of the destruction of sodom has inspired countless literary visions the city has elicited writing from milton sade proust dostoevsky and tournier among others this work contains an anthology of sodom texts spanning several centuries paul hallam has also provided his own reading of these languages of prejudice obsession and desire in an extensive essay
