between global englishes the spread and use of diverse forms of english within processes of globalization and transcultural flows the movements changes and reuses of cultural forms in disparate contexts this wide ranging study focuses on the ways english is embedded in other linguistic contexts including those of east asia australia west africa and the pacific islands drawing on transgressive and performative theory pennycook looks at how global englishes transcultural flows and pedagogy are interconnected in ways that oblige us to rethink language and culture within the contemporary world global englishes and transcultural flows is a valuable resource to applied linguists sociolinguists and students on cultural studies english language studies tefl and tesol courses

an alternative approach to mapping the world offers a new way to contest capitalism and globalization shangri la the bermuda triangle transylvania the golden triangle far flung in popular conception these anomalous places nonetheless occupy the same mysterious zone a mythography of unruly cartographic practices and because this mythography becomes associated with a particular area of the earth's surface it may well suggest an alternative means of mapping the world dissociated from the dominant geographical paradigms of nation state economic region and the global local marketing nexus large scale nonnational geographical spaces that find their genesis in popular feeling mystery and belief these four sites provide brett neilson with the basis not only for rethinking the current global reorganization of space and time but also for questioning the dominant narrative by which globalization marks the victory of capitalism free trade in the bermuda triangle moves between analysis of popular fantasies and engagement with on the ground realities weaving together topics as diverse as airplane disasters off the u.s. atlantic coast the global drug trade vampire culture in postsocialist europe and the search for utopia in chinese occupied tibet the study of globalization is largely a solemn affair occupied with increasing economic polarities environmental degradation and global insecurity free trade in the bermuda triangle maintains a critical focus on these sobering issues but at the same time asks how popular pleasure and enjoyment can create viable alternatives to the current global order neilson takes seriously the proposition that capitalism must be contested at its own level of generality finding provisional grounds for resistance in nonlocal transnational spaces that embody quotidian hopes desires and anxieties by studying the real and imagined dimensions of these popular geographies his book seeks resources for social betterment in the fallen mythologies of the contemporary postutopian world

the use of english as a global lingua franca has given rise to new challenges and approaches in our understanding of language and communication one area where elf english as a lingua franca studies both from an empirical and theoretical orientation have the potential for significant developments is in our understanding of the relationships between language culture and identity elf challenges traditional assumptions concerning the purported inexorable link between a language and a culture due to the multitude of users and contexts of elf communication the supposed language culture and identity correlation often conceived at the national level appears simplistic and naïve however it is equally naïve to assume that elf is a culturally and identity neutral form of communication all communication involves participants purposes contexts and histories none of which are neutral thus we need new approaches to understanding the relationship between language culture and identity which are able to account for the multifarious and dynamic nature of elf communication

a lingua franca perspective into english language teaching in brazil has only recently taken flight as an emerging economy the country faces enormous challenges when it comes to

in national healing author claude hurlbert persuasively relates nationalism to institutional racism and contends that these are both symptoms of a national ill health afflicting american higher education and found even in the field of writing studies teachers and scholars even in progressive fields like composition are unwittingly at odds with their own most liberatory purposes he says and he advocates consciously broadening our understanding of rhetoric and writing instruction to include rhetorical traditions of non western cultures threading a personal narrative of his own experiences as a student professor and citizen through a wide ranging discussion of theory pedagogy and philosophy in the writing classroom hurlbert weaves a vision that moves beyond simple polemic and simplistic multiculturalism national healing offers a compelling new aesthetic epistemological and rhetorical configuration
