the renowned political thinker and author of the origins of totalitarianism examines the troubling consequences of humanity's increasing power a work of striking originality the human condition is in many respects more relevant today than when it first appeared in 1958 in her study of the state of modern humanity hannah arendt considers humankind in terms of its ever expanding capabilities her analysis reveals a troubling paradox that as human powers increase through technological and humanistic inquiry we are less equipped to control the consequences of our actions this new edition contains margaret canovan's 1998 introduction and a new foreword by danielle allen a classic in political and social theory the human condition offers a penetrating analysis of a conundrum that has only become more acute in the 21st century

the unique who of each agent it aims to illuminate arendt's critique of sovereign rule totalitarianism and world alienation her defense of a distinct political sphere for engaged citizen action and judgment her conception of the right to have rights and her rejection of teleological philosophies of history arendt proposes that in modern pluralistic secular public spheres no one metaphysical or religious idea can authoritatively validate political actions or opinions absolutely at the same time she sees action and thinking as revealing an inescapable existential illusion of a divine element in human beings a notion represented well by the daimon metaphor that appears in arendt's own work and in key works by plato heidegger jaspers and kant with which she engages while providing a post metaphysical theory of action and judgment arendt performs the fact that many of the legitimating concepts of contemporary secular politics retain a residual vocabulary of transcendence this book will be of interest not only to arendt scholars but also to students of identity politics the critique of sovereignty international political theory political theology and the philosophy of history

hannah arendt 1906 1975 war jüdin weltbürgerin und antifaschistin sie wurde zu einer radikalen kritikerin totalitärer herrschaft und beschrieb aus eigener anschauung die banalität des bösen mit ihrer unbestechlichen politischen urteilskraft propagierte sie den geist der aufklärung und setzte maßstäbe für ein humanistisches denken auch in finsternen zeiten das bildmaterial der printausgabe ist in diesem e book nicht enthalten

democratic theorists frequently assume that the people must have something in common or else democracy will fail this produces an ironically anti democratic tendency to emphasize the passive possession of commonality sharing democracy counters this tendency with a radical vision of democracy grounded instead in the

active exercise of political freedom

drawing on a variety of approaches this book explores historical philosophical theological cultural and institutional themes such as ignatian perspectives on halakhic spirituality and the role played in jesuit history by jews forced to convert to christianity

the ethics of territorial borders develops a distinctive line of argument drawing on political theory and geography as well as international relations unusually this book argues for the ethical significance of borders themselves pointing to their role in human diversity and the enduring appeal of territorial division

this edited volume offers a new approach to understanding social conventions by way of martin heidegger it connects the philosopher s conceptions of the anyone everydayness and authenticity with an analysis and critique of social normativity heidegger s account of the anyone is ambiguous some see it as a good description of human sociality others think of it as an important critique of modern mass society this volume seeks to understand this ambiguity as reflecting the tension between the constitutive function of conventions for human action and the critical aspects of conformism it argues that heidegger s anyone should neither be reduced to its pejorative nor its constitutive dimension rather the concept could show how power and norms function this volume would be of interest to scholars

and students of philosophy and the social sciences who wish to investigate the social applications of the works of martin heidegger

judith butler can justifiably be described as one of the major critical thinkers of our time while she is best known for her interventions into feminist debates on gender sexuality and feminist politics her focus in recent years has broadened to encompass some of the most pertinent topics of interest to contemporary political philosophy drawing on butler s deconstructive reading of the key categories and concepts of political thought birgit schippers expounds and advocates her challenge to the conceptual binaries that pervade modern political discourse using examples and case studies like the west s intervention in iraq and afghanistan and in relation to the israeli palestinian conflict schippers demonstrates how butler s philosophically informed engagement with pressing political issues of our time elucidates our understanding of topics such as immigration and multiculturalism sovereignty or the prospect for new forms of cohabitation and citizenship beyond and across national boundaries a detailed exposition and analysis of butler s recent ideas championing her efforts at articulating the possibilities for radical politics and ethical life in an era of global interdependence this book makes an important contribution to the emerging field of international political philosophy

this book offers innovative investigations of the concept of life in art and in theory it features essays that explore biopoetics and look at how insights from the natural sciences shape research within the humanities since literature works of art and other cultural products decisively shape our ideas of what it means to be human the contributors to this volume examine the question of what literature literary and cultural criticism and philosophy contribute to the distinctions or non distinctions between human animal and vegetal existence coverage combines different methodological aspects and addresses a wide field of comparative literary studies the essays consider the question of language as a distinctive feature of human existence in a number of different contexts which range from aristotle s works through several historical layers of the philosophical discourse on the origins of speech to modern anthropology and 20th century continental philosophy in addition the volume includes concrete case studies to the current post humanism debate and provides literary art historian and philosophical perspectives on animal studies the historical multiplicity of the various cultural representations of biological existence be that human animal vegetal or mixed might serve as a productive

foundation for discussing the nature and forms of literature's critical contributions to our understanding of these fundamental categories this volume opens up this subject to students and scholars of literature art philosophy ethics and cultural studies and to anyone with a theoretical interest in the questions of life

franklin delano roosevelt famously declared that the greatest duty of a statesman is to educate the central claim of why moralize upon it is that it is not only statesmen who can help educate a democratic citizenry but also novelists and filmmakers this book's title is drawn from melville's benito cereno near the end of this novella after he has put down a rebellion of enslaved africans the american captain amasa delano claims that the past is passed and thus there is no need to moralize upon it melville suggests though that it is crucial for americans to critically examine american history and american political institutions otherwise they may be blind to the existence of injustices which will ultimately undermine democracy danoff argues that novels and films play a crucial role in helping democratic citizens undertake the kind of moral reflection that they must engage in if they are to not only preserve their political community but also render it forever worthy of the saving as abraham lincoln put it contending that some of the most profound american thinking about the nature of democratic leadership has come through novels more so than treatises or essays danoff argues that the works of fiction examined in this book explore difficult questions rather than provide any easy answers because these works have an ambiguous nuanced and tragic outlook they teach citizen readers how to think through the moral complexities of the political issues on which they must render judgment the rich and multi faceted democratic education that citizens glean from outstanding works of fiction is particularly necessary at a time when the media landscape is often dominated by superficial viral moments sound bites and social media posts moreover given that we today live in an era of sharp political polarization in which partisans often demonize one another it is especially valuable for americans to be exposed to literary and cinematic works of art which remind us that none of us have a monopoly on virtue and that all of us inhabit what melville called the common continent of men

under what conditions is it possible for people with different outlooks on life and different ethnic backgrounds to live together in peace in the netherlands as in other european countries this question has been at the centre of public debate for some time and recently has focused in particular on religious diversity there are several positions but they all see differences between groups as an essential problem in this book the authors take a different approach the term conflict literally means clashing together from the latin configere to strike together wherever people come together their interests and beliefs are sure to clash and conversely

clashes only occur when there is something shared to quarrel about whether we like it or not living with each other means clashing with each other five dutch researchers share their exploration of the paradoxical situation that we cannot survive without the other because we only really learn about ourselves when we come into contact with others at the same time it is problematic to live with the other since our lives clash with the life of the other and we try to shield ourselves and draw boundaries how to live in difference and not be indifferent to the other that's the question
