at first glance the works of fedor dostoevsky 1821 1881 do not appear to have much in common with those of the controversial american writer henry miller 1891 1980 however the influencer of dostoevsky on miller was in fact enormous and shaped the latter s view of the world of literature and of his own writing the making of a counter culture icon examines the obsession that miller and his contemporaries the so called villa seurat circle had with dostoevsky and the impact that this obsession had on their own work renowned for his psychological treatment of characters dostoevsky became a model for miller lawrence durrell and anais nin interested as they were in developing a new kind of writing that would move beyond staid literary conventions maria bloshteyn argues that as dostoevsky was concerned with representing the individual s perception of the self and the world he became an archetype for miller and the other members of the villa seurat circle writers who were interested in precise psychological characterizations as well as intriguing narratives tracing the cross cultural appropriation and mis interpretation of dostoevsky s methods and philosophies by miller durrell and nin the making of a counter culture icon gives invaluable insight into the early careers of the villa seurat writers and testifies to dostoevsky s influence on twentieth century literature

texte aus verschiedenen ländern zeiten und literaturen bilden die grundlage für helmut kreuzers erstmals 1968 erschienene darstellung typischer einstellungen und verhaltensweisen der boheme er beschreibt und dokumentiert die lebensgewohnheiten und den sozialen habitus der bohemiens ebenso wie das verhältnis zur städtisch industriellen zivilisation zur bürgerlichen arbeitswelt und geldwirtschaft zum kenntlich werdenden warenstatus des kunstwerks und zur politik helmut kreuzer gelingt ein über einen zeitraum von nahezu einem jahrhundert reichendes bestechend scharfes bild antibürgerlicher protesthaltungen praised and denounced when it was first published in 1970 sexual politics not only explored history but also became part of it kate millett s groundbreaking book fueled feminism s second wave giving voice to the anger of a generation while documenting the inequities neatly packaged in revered works of literature and art of a complacent and unrepentant society sexual politics laid the foundation for subsequent feminist scholarship by showing how cultural discourse reflects a systematized subjugation and exploitation of women millett demonstrates in detail how patriarchy s attitudes and systems penetrate literature philosophy psychology and politics her incendiary work rocked the foundations of the literary canon by castigating time honored classics from d h lawrence s lady chatterley s lover to norman mailer s the naked and the dead for their use of sex to degrade and undermine women a new introduction to this edition draws attention to some of the forms patriarchy has taken recently in consolidating its oppressive and dangerous control

as an author henry miller 1891 1980 was infamous for his explicit descriptions of sex and many of his novels from the tropic of cancer to black spring were banned in the united states on grounds of obscenity but his books frequently smuggled into his native country became a major influence on the beat generation of american writers and would eventually lead to a groundbreaking series of obscenity trials that would change american laws on pornography in literary works in this new critical biography david stephen calonne goes beyond miller s notoriety to take an innovative look at the way in which the author s writings and lifestyle were influenced by his spiritual quests charting miller s cultivation of his esoteric ideas from boyhood and adolescence to later in his career calonne examines how miller remained deeply engaged with a variety of philosophies from astrology and gnosticism to eastern thinkers calonne describes not only the effects this had on miller s work but also to his complex and volatile life his marriages and love affairs with beatrice wickens june mansfield and anaïs nin his years in paris and the journey to greece that resulted in the travelogue the colossus of maroussi the book miller considered to be his greatest work after discussing miller s final residences in big sur and the pacific palisades in california calonne considers the author s involvement in the arts love of painting and music and friendships with a number of classical musicians miller calonne reveals was a quirky charismatic man of genius who continues to influence popular culture today highlighting many areas of the author s life that have previously been neglected henry miller takes a fascinating revisionary approach to the work of one of american s most controversial and iconic writers

modernist literature is inextricable from the history of obscenity the trials of figures like james joyce d h lawrence and radclyffe hall loom large in accounts twentieth century literature filthy material modernism and the media of obscenity reveals the ways that debates about obscenity and literature were shaped by changes in the history of media judgments about obscenity which hinged on understanding how texts were circulated and read were often proxies for the changing place of literature in an age of new technological media the emergence of film photography and new printing technologies shaped how literary value was understood altering how obscenity was defined and which texts were considered obscene filthy material rereads the history of obscenity in order to discover a history of technological media behind debates about moral corruption and sexual explicitness the shift from the intense censorship of the early twentieth century to the effective end of obscenity for literature at the middle of the century it argues is not simply a product of cultural liberalization but of a changing media ecology filthy material brings together media theory and archival research to offer a fresh account of modernist obscenity and novel readings of works of modernist literature it sheds new light on figures at the center of modernism s obscenity trials such as joyce and lawrence demonstrates the relevance of the discourse obscenity to understanding figures not typically associated with obscenity debates like t s eliot and wyndham lewis and introduces new figures to our account of modernism like norah james and jack kahane it reveals how modernist obscenity reflected a contest over the literary in the face of new media technologies

obelisk a history of jack kahane and the obelisk press details the history of one of the most extraordinary and controversial publishing enterprises of the twentieth century publisher simultaneously of the infamous novels of the literary elite as well as low budget erotica and dirty books jack kahane s obelisk press published the likes of henry miller james joyce anaïs nin and d h lawrence alongside a lengthy list of censor baiting eccentrics like n reynolds packard the new york daily news rome correspondent and the self styled marco polo of sex here for the first time is the story of this remarkable venture which captures some of the twentieth century s most outrageous literary personalities and their often scandalous exploits including the failed golf club society magazine run by nin miller and lawrence durrell and the tortured relationship between obelisk author marjorie firminger and wyndham lewis a richly illustrated cultural history of 1920s paris a fully narrated bibliography of works published by an unforgettable literary institution and a glimpse into the remarkable life of the press s creator jack kahane the obelisk press is a publishing event not to be missed by anyone with an interest in twentieth century literary lives and letters

culture as a way of bringing meaning into life is maintained through discourse in search of factors influencing discourse effectiveness this volume brings together young scholars from russia france pakistan slovakia and lebanon to focus on variation as an essential feature of meaning producing communication in its multiple aspects and settings the book is based on papers presented during online sessions on cross cultural discourse literary analysis and language education of the 7th international young researchers conference studying and teaching philology held in ulyanovsk russia in 2017 in part i irina zhuchkova explores variation in academic discourse on discourse in the first two chapters of part ii hibah shabkhez discusses the interaction of various culture codes and transformations of a literary character travelling from one fictional world into another and in the next chapter hibah shabkhez ibreez shabkhez and azka mahboob analyse the divergence of stances taken on the same character by its creator and the readers in the final chapters of this section ibreez shabkhez and maksim duleba uncover mechanisms of expressing conflicting stances with the result of marginalising discourse participants including the stance taker himself roksolana povoroznyuk in part iii examines the interpreter s choices in mediating cross cultural literary discourse concentrating on paratranslational techniques and terminological variation both of which involve a lot of translatorial freedom and responsibility finally part iv by christelle frangieh fenianos addresses the issue of the second language learner s freedom in choosing the ways of acquiring vocabulary which serves as a gate to the world of cross cultural communication this book will be of interest to researchers postgraduate students and advanced undergraduates working in the fields of philology discourse analysis literature and translation studies and language acquisition

in a work that will be of interest to students and scholars of american literature romanticism transcendentalism the history of ideas and religious studies brad bannon examines samuel taylor coleridge s engagement with the philosophical theology of jonathan edwards a closer look at coleridge s response to edwards clarifies the important influence that both thinkers had on seminal works of the nineteenth century ranging from the antebellum period to the aftermath of the american civil war from poe s fiction and emerson s essays to melville s billy budd and crane s the red badge of courage similarly coleridge s early espousal of an abolitionist theology that had evolved from edwards and been shaped by john woolman and olaudah equiano sheds light on the way that american romantics later worked to affirm a philosophy of supernatural self determination ultimately what coleridge offered the american romantics was a supernatural modification of edwards theological determinism a compromise that provided emerson and other nineteenth century thinkers with an acceptable extension of an essentially calvinist theology indeed a thoroughgoing skepticism with respect to salvation as well as a faith in the absolute inscrutability of providence led both the transcendentalists and the dark romantics to speculate freely on the possibility of supernatural self determination while doubting that anything other than god or nature could harness the power of causation

incorporating the novels pamphlets and letters of henry miller killing the buddha argues for miller s written work to be considered as a whole in relation to the theme of zen buddhism specifically the concept of satori awakening by reading miller s literary output and letters as a spiritual journey to awakening it is possible to chart his development as a writer and offer insight into his repetitive use of biographical material reflecting upon the influence of otto rank and henri bergson on miller s conceptualization of the role of the writer and then by examining his complex rejection of surrealism it is possible to show miller s burgeoning zen buddhism as a life long quest for acceptance and authenticity explicitly explored within his work with close readings of the obelisk trilogy of the 1930s tropic of cancer tropic of capricorn and black spring and the rosy crucifixion trilogy 1949 1960 miller s complex journey to satori is shown as a continuous progression from his early notorious novels through to the essays and pamphlets of his later career

dealing with moral political and sexual tensions this volume provides a forum for male female dialogue concerning the history dissemination and consequences of pornographic representation in film and literature aiming to challenge established views and inspire further exploration and debate

a richly illustrated look at some of the most important photobooks of the 20th century france experienced a golden age of photobook production from the late 1920s through the 1950s avant garde experiments in photography text design and printing within the context of a growing modernist publishing scene contributed to an outpouring of brilliantly designed books making strange offers a detailed examination of photobook innovation in france exploring seminal publications by brassaï henri cartier bresson robert frank pierre jahan william klein and germaine krull kim sichel argues that these books both held a mirror to their time and created an unprecedented modernist visual language sichel provides an engaging analysis through the lens of materiality emphasizing the photobook as an object with which the viewer interacts haptically as well as visually rich in historical context and beautifully illustrated making strange reasserts the role of french photobooks in the history of modern art

the articles in this volume examine historical cultural literary and political facets of translation in turkey a society in tortuous transformation since the 19th century from empire to nation state some draw attention to tradition in ottoman practices and agents of translation and interpreting while others explore the republican period starting in 1923 with the revolutionary change in script from arabic to roman coming in 1928 making a powerful impact on publication and translation practices areas covered include the german jewish academic involvement in translation traditional and current practices of translating from kurdish into turkish censorship of translated literature intralingual translations from ottoman into modern turkish pseudotranslation ideological manipulation and resistance in translation imitativeness vs originality and metonymics of literary reviewing

modernism and morality discusses the relationship between artistic and moral ideas in european and american literary modernism rather than reading modernism as a complete rejection of social morality this study shows how early twentieth century writers like conrad faulkner gide kafka mann and stein actually devised new aesthetic techniques to address ethical problems by focusing on a range of decadent naturalist avant garde and expatriate writers between 1890 and the late 1930s this book reassesses the moral trajectory of transatlantic fiction

the most current multidisciplinary and multivocal engagement with sade s enduring influences on modernism and the philosophical need for continued analysis of his work and the questions it raises from lacan to dalí through simone de beauvoir beckett horkheimer burroughs pasolini foucault deleuze up to Žižek the marquis de sade s influence and impact on modernism and modern thinking is hard to measure understanding sade understanding modernism presents its readers with a chance to reflect on the importance of this radical oeuvre from different perspectives contributors examine sadean literature and thought through some of its main texts including 120 days of sodom history of juliette the crimes of love and philosophy in the boudoir in a series of comparative essays that not only examine sade s influence in french european and american thought but also critique it in the context of some of modern philosophy s most relevant subjects ecology nature universalism and the links between ethics and aesthetics the final section identifies key concepts and notions within sade s corpus in a series of entries offering context and a discussion of their relevance for current thought

rare and previously unpublished essays and letters showcasing durrell s wit elegance philosophy joie de vivre and flaming intelligence the irish times the proverb says that whoever sees the world from the back of an elephant learns the secrets of the jungle and becomes a seer i had to be content to become a poet lawrence durrell best known for his novels and travel writing lawrence durrell defied easy classification within twentieth century modernism his anti authoritarian tendencies put him at odds with many contemporaries aesthetically and politically however thanks to a compelling recontextualization by editor james gifford these thirty eight previously unpublished and out of print essays and letters reveal that durrell s maturation as an artist was rich complex and subtle durrell fans will treasure this selection of rare nonfiction while scholars of durrell modernist literature anti authoritarian artists and the personalist movement will also appreciate gifford s fine editorial work gifford s scholarly command of the archives shows especially his working intimacy with the unpublished archived words of durrell s editors publishers and collaborators i have no doubt that this collection will serve as a starting point for any number of new critical ventures into the life and writing of lawrence durrell charles sligh university of tennessee at chattanooga

paris on the brink vividly portrays the city of light during the tumultuous 1930s from the wall street crash of 1929 to war and german occupation this was a dangerous and turbulent decade during which workers flexed their economic muscle and their opponents struck back with increasing violence as the divide between haves and have nots widened so did the political split between left and right with animosities exploding into brutal clashes intensified by the paramilitary leagues of the extreme right hitler stalin and mussolini escalated the increasingly hazardous international environment while the civil war in spain added to the instability of the times yet throughout the decade paris remained at the center of cultural creativity major figures on the paris scene such as gertrude stein ernest hemingway andré gide marie curie pablo picasso igor stravinsky and coco chanel continued to hold sway in addition to josephine baker sylvia beach james joyce man ray and le corbusier simone de beauvoir and jean paul sartre could now be seen at their favorite cafés while jean renoir salvador dalí and elsa schiaparelli came to prominence along with france s first socialist prime minister léon blum despite the decade s creativity and glamour it

remained a difficult and dangerous time and parisians responded with growing nativism and anti semitism while relying on their maginot line to protect them from external harm through rich illustrations and evocative narrative mary mcauliffe brings this extraordinary era to life

this is the first book to focus primarily on george orwell s ideas about free speech and related matters freedom of the press the writer s freedom of expression honesty and truthfulness and in particular the ways in which they are linked to his political vision of socialism orwell is today claimed by the left and right by neo conservatives and neo socialists how is that possible part of the answer as glenn burgess reveals is that orwell was an odd sort of socialism the development of orwell s socialism was from the start conditioned by his individualist and liberal commitments the hopes he attached to socialism were for a fairer more equal world that would permit human freedom and individuality to flourish completing not destroying the work of liberalism freedom of thought was a central part of this and its defence and use were essential parts of the struggle to ensure that socialism developed in a liberal humane form that did not follow the totalitarian path of soviet communism written in celebration of orwell s dictum we hold that the most perverse human being is more interesting than the most orthodox gramophone record george orwell s perverse humanity is a portrait of orwell that captures these themes and provides a new understanding of him as a political thinker and activist based on archival research and new materials that affirm his work as an activist for freedom it also uncovers a socialist ideology that has been obscured in just the way that the author feared it would be associated in many people s minds with totalitarian unfreedom
