in presenting this reader on ethical theory shafer landau philosophy u of wisconsin has made sure to cover the standard topics of the day consequentialism deontology contractarianism and virtue ethics but has also sought to include areas that are less common in sections on moral standing moral responsibility moral knowledge and works that question the very possibility of systematic ethics he also includes a section that discusses ethics and religion and another that examines prima facie duties and particularism rather than include critics views following the various theoretical presentations he has instead decided to include more works of allied thinkers in order to provide readers with a more nuanced view of the particular view in question selections from classic writers such as aristotle thomas hobbes immanuel kant and plato are accompanied by more contemporary writings annotation 2007 book news inc portland or booknews com distributed by syndetic solutions llc

the philosophical discussion of state punishment is well on in years in contrast with a large number of ethical problems which are concerned with right and wrong in relation to a narrowly specified area of human life and practice and which hav at least since the early 70 s been regarded as a legitimate part of philosophical thinking constituting the area of applied ethics reflections on punishment can be traced much further back in the history of western philosophy this is not surprising that the stately mandated infliction of death suffering or deprivation on citizens should be met with hesitation from which ethical reflections may depar seems obvious such a practice certainly calls for some persuasive justification it is therefore natural that reflective minds have for a long time devoted attention to punishment and that the question of how a penal system can be justified has constituted the central question in philosophical

discussion though it would certainly be an exaggeration to claim that the justification question is the only aspect of punishment with which philosophers have been concerned there has in most periods been a clear tendency to regard this as the cardinal issue comparatively much less attention has been devoted to the more precise questions of how and how much criminals should be punished for their respective wrong doings this may of course be due to several reasons

for nearly 200 years people have questioned the identity of shakespeare however this debate is often dismissed by most scholars as just a conspiracy theory with the life of the poet playwright being beyond doubt and yet the documented facts related to the man from stratford are meagre where they exist at all forcing biographers to rely heavily on their own imaginations what does it mean to say that the traditional stance on shakespeare s authorship is a belief as opposed to a search for knowledge what are the ethical implications of declaring that some history is beyond doubt and that no debate about it may be permitted what can theories of knowledge truth and rhetoric tell us about how knowledge of shakespeare has been constructed and justified to the extent that this belief has consequences for society can it then be said to be an ethical one finally what difference does it actually make from a pragmatic perspective who the author was highly original in its scope the shakespeare authorship question and philosophy sets out the debate s many profound philosophical dimensions concerning knowledge historiography truth and academic freedom implications that transcend the debate itself

at least one of every three americans has used an illicit drug drugs attract considerable attention in science legislation and the media nonetheless many people develop attitudes about drugs and drug users based on limited information researchers often find themselves divided into camps based on the drug they study most often which limits their ability to benefit from important work done on other drugs as a result government policies form without a complete understanding of the intoxication experience what is the nature of intoxication at first this question appears to be simple and straightforward but upon closer inspection the dichotomous distinctions between everyday awareness and its alternatives grow fuzzy an in depth examination of the subjective effects of drugs and the pursuit of altered states soon leads to age old questions about free will heredity environment and consciousness mind altering drugs is the first book to bring together chapters from leading researchers that present diverse empirically based insights into the subjective experiences of drugs and their links to addictive potential by avoiding simple depictions of psychoactive chemicals and the people who use them these recognized experts explain how modern research in many fields reveals a complex interaction between people situations and substances their work demonstrates that only a multitude of approaches can show the nuances of subjective experience and that each

substance may create a different effect with every administration in each user simple references to physiological underpinnings or positive reinforcement fail to explain the diverse responses to drugs however research has progressed to reveal broad repeatable evidence that the subjective effects of substances play an important role in our understanding of drug abuse and so should inform our decisions about policy this thorough and accessible review of the subjective effects of drugs and the dominant theories behind those effects will provide a wealth of information about the experience of intoxication for lay readers and a road map to studies in other disciplines for student and professional researchers

in recent years there have been a number of books both anthologies and monographs that have focused on the liar paradox and more generally on the semantic paradoxes either offering proposed treatments to those paradoxes or critically evaluating ones that occupy logical space at the same time there are a number of people who do great work in philosophy who have various semantic logical metaphysical and or epistemological commitments that suggest that they should say something about the liar paradox yet who have said very little if anything about that paradox or about the extant projects involving it the purpose of this volume is to afford those philosophers the opportunity to address what might be described as reflections on the liar

do numbers sets and so forth exist what do mathematical statements mean are they literally true or false or do they lack truth values altogether addressing questions that have attracted lively debate in recent years stewart shapiro contends that standard realist and antirealist accounts of mathematics are both problematic as benacerraf first noted we are confronted with the following powerful dilemma the desired continuity between mathematical and say scientific language suggests realism but realism in this context suggests seemingly intractable epistemic problems as a way out of this dilemma shapiro articulates a structuralist approach on this view the subject matter of arithmetic for example is not a fixed domain of numbers independent of each other but rather is the natural number structure the pattern common to any system of objects that has an initial object and successor relation satisfying the induction principle using this framework realism in mathematics can be preserved without troublesome epistemic consequences shapiro concludes by showing how a structuralist approach can be applied to wider philosophical questions such as the nature of an object and the quinean nature of ontological commitment clear compelling and tautly argued shapiro s work noteworthy both in its attempt to develop a full length structuralist approach to mathematics and to trace its emergence in the history of mathematics will be of deep interest to both philosophers and mathematicians

the relative merits and demerits of historically prominent views about truth such as the correspondence theory coherentism pragmatism verificationism and instrumentalism have been subject to much attention and have fueled the long lived debate over which of these views is the most plausible while diverging in their specific philosophical commitments adherents of these views are in agreement in at least one fundamental respect they are all alethic monists they endorse the thesis that there is only one property in virtue of which propositions can be true and so in this sense take truth to be one the truth pluralist on the other hand rejects this idea there are several properties in virtue of which propositions can be true the literature on truth pluralism has been growing steadily for the past twenty years this volume however is the first to focus specifically on pluralism about truth part i is dedicated to the development investigation and critical discussion of different forms of pluralism one additional reason to examine truth pluralism is the significant connections it bears to other debates in the truth literature particularly debates concerning traditional theories of truth and the deflationism inflationism divide parts ii and iii of the volume connect truth pluralism to these two debates

liberal defences of nationalism have become prevalent since the mid 1980 s curiously they have largely neglected the fact that nationalism is primarily about land should liberals throw up their hands in despair when confronting conflicting claims stemming from incommensurable national narratives and holy texts should they dismiss conflicting demands that stem solely from particular cultures religions and mythologies in favour of a supposedly neutral set of guidelines does history matter should ancient injustices interest us today should we care who reached the territory first and who were its prior inhabitants should principles of utility play a part in resolving territorial disputes was john locke right to argue that the utilisation of land counts in favour of its acquisition and should western style settlement projects work in favour or against a nation s territorial demands when and how should principles of equality and equal distribution come into play territorial rights examines the generic types of territorial claims customarily put forward by national groups as justification for their territorial demands within the framework of what has come to be known as liberal nationalism the final outcome is a multifarious theory on the ethics of territorial boundaries that supplies a workable set of guidelines for evaluating

territorial disputes from a liberal national perspective and offers a common ground for discussion including disagreement and for the mediation of claims

philosophy receives an abstract meta ethical defense from linda radzik moving solidly into the domain of normative social philosophy alice maclachlan reconsiders govier s condemnation of revenge by viewing it as a form of moral address but she notes how revenge as an act of communication contrasts with argumentation in lacking the respect that govier maintains is intrinsic to argumentation maclachlan ultimately agrees that revenge is morally indefensible the practical challenges of addressing others in the aftermath of wrongdoing especially in public contexts can make it difficult to distinguish between victims and combatants or wrongdoers alistair little and wilhelm verwoerd explain and kathryn norlock argues that forgiveness is psychologically vexed too people may recognize transformation to be in principle possible for all people norlock argues and yet we may find the evidence regarding some particular evildoer sufficient to count that person as an exception finally govier responds to the various papers
