in theatre in ancient greek society the author examines the social setting and function of ancient greek theatre through the thousand years of its performance history instead of using written sources which were intended only for a small educated section of the population he draws most of his evidence from a wide range of archaeological material from cheap mass produced vases and figurines to elegant silverware produced for the dining tables of the wealthy this is the first study examining the function and impact of the theatre in ancient greek society by employing an archaeological approach

the six essays of visual identities are an important contribution to the growing field of industrial semiotics floch s major strength is his analysis of signs in a way which is both industrially relevant and textually precise until recently there have been two quite different and distinct ways of understanding commerical signs such as logos and

advertisements industry based work has tended to look at questions of marketing and has often been reduced to the mass psychology of appeal and audience research whereas the textual analysis of commercial signs has tended to come from limited positions of identity politics and criticism marxism feminism etc floch manages to find a way between and also outside these traditions in doing so he has produced a book which will interest industrial practitioners in advertising marketing and design as well as students and academics in semiotics

claude lévi strauss the father of modern anthropology and author of the classic tristes tropiques was one of the most influential intellectuals of the second half of the twentieth century dislodging sartre camus and de beauvoir from the pinnacle of french intellectual life in the 1950s he brought about a sea change in western thought and inspired a generation of thinkers and writers including michel foucault roland barthes and jacques lacan with his structuralist theories lévi strauss s bohemian childhood and later studies of the emerging discipline of anthropology in the field and the university led him to mix with intellectuals artists and poets from all over europe tracing the evolution of his ideas through interviews with the man himself research into his archives and conversations with contemporary anthropologists wilcken explores and explains lévi strauss s theories revealing an artiste manqué who infused his academic writing with an artistic and poetic sensibility

the northwest coast of north america was home to dozens of native peoples at the time of its first contact with europeans the rich artistic ceremonial and oral traditions of these peoples and their preservation of cultural practices have made this region especially attractive for anthropological study coming to shore provides a historical overview of the ethnology and ethnohistory of this region with special attention given to contemporary theoretically informed studies of communities and issues the first book to explore the role of the northwest coast in three distinct national traditions of anthropology american canadian and french coming to shore gives particular consideration to the importance of claude levi strauss and structuralism as well as more recent social theory in the context of northwest coast anthropology in addition contributors explore the blurring boundaries between theoretical and applied

anthropology as well as contemporary issues such as land claims criminal justice environmentalism economic development and museum display the contribution of frederica de laguna provides a historical background to the enterprise of northwest coast anthropology as do the contributions of claude levi strauss and marie mauze marie mauze is a senior researcher at the centre national de la recherche scientifique in paris her books include present is past some uses of tradition in native societies michael e harkin is a professor of anthropology at the university of wyoming and the editor of reassessing revitalization movements perspectives from north america and the pacific islands nebraska 2004 sergei kan is a professor of anthropology and native american studies at dartmouth college and author of memory eternal tlingit culture and russian orthodox christianity through two centuries

the first ever biography written about a woman of the northwest coast s kwakwakawakw people paddling to where i stand presents the memoirs of agnes alfred c 1890 1992 a non literate noble qwiqwasutinuxw woman of the kwakwakawakw nation and one of the last great storytellers among her peers in the classic oral tradition agnes alfred documents through myths historical accounts and personal reminiscences the foundations and the enduring pulse of her living culture but this is more than another anthropological interpretation it is the first hand account of the greatest period of change the kwakwaka wakw people experienced since first contact with europeans and alfred s memoirs flow from her urgent desire to pass on her knowledge to younger generations

drawing on broad research this study explores the different social and theatrical masking activities in england during the middle ages and the early 16th century the authors present a coherent explanation of the many functions of masking emphasizing the important links among festive practice specialized ceremonial and drama they elucidate the intellectual moral and social contexts for masking and they examine the purposes and rewards for participants in the activity the authors insight into the masking games and performances of england s medieval and early tudor periods illuminates many aspects of the thinking and culture of the times issues of identity and community performance and role play conceptions of the psyche and of the individual

s position in social and spiritual structures masks and masking in medieval and early tudor england presents a broad overview of masking practices demonstrating how active and prominent an element of medieval and pre modern culture masking was it has obvious interest for drama and literature critics of the medieval and early modern periods but is also useful for historians of culture theatre and anthropology through its analysis of masked play this study engages both with the history of theatre and performance and with broader cultural and historical questions of social organization identity and the self the performance of power and shifting spiritual understanding

ritual masking is an important institution in many traditional societies and has attracted much attention from western scholars in ritual masks pernet provides a thorough survey of masks and masking traditions in africa oceania and the americas based on a close analysis of the literature in several languages pernet s approach provides him with an opportunity to examine issues of importance to the history of religion and anthropology these include the influence of theory on the interpretation of prehistoric documents androcentrism in anthropology and the history of religions and western scholarship s recurrent problems in interpreting preliterate or traditional societies

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Decoding the 60-60-30 Triangle: More Than Just Angles
