this historical fiction is based on the true story of li shimin also known as tang taizong the greatest sovereign in chinese history about 30 years younger than muhammad he grew up in a world of devastating upheaval that tore china asunder and was thrust into the role of a military commander in his father s rebel army while still a teenager in the process of vanquishing his enemies on the battlefield he proved himself to be a great military genius as emperor he encouraged critical suggestions by his court officials which he often adopted and lent support to the religions of his day notably buddhism daoism and christianity the international prestige he had won for tang china was so high that the states of central and north asia honored him with the title of heavenly khan although his father founded the dynasty it was his reign that laid the groundwork for a brilliant empire that was to endure for centuries

tang taizong li shimin 2nd emperor of the tang dynasty commissioned six statues of his favorite warhorses to be carved in stone and serve as part of his political legacy at his mausoleum zhao ling this book traces the history and significance of these statues from their creation in 7th century china through their removal from the mausoleum in the early 20th c when two made their way to the united states antiquities market through the dealer c t loo and ultimately to the penn museum their time on the art market and subsequent stewardship by the penn museum are also explored contemporaneous sources and archival records reconstruct the roles of different people chinese and westerners in the sale of and competition for these stone horses while underlining their exceptional significance and reconstructing the historical path they traversed this work serves to bridge the gaps in the shared knowledge of the historical facts pertaining to these horse reliefs and build a common foundation for intercultural dialogue and cooperation surrounding cultural heritage preservation and changing museum practice

japan comprehensively explores the history of korean victims of the 1945 atomic bombings in hiroshima and nagasaki following the bombings and korea's liberation from japanese colonial rule these korean atomic bomb victims dispersed across japan south korea and north korea and have often been left without any relief or redress for decades focusing on those korean victims living in japan the author thoroughly examines how they have struggled to achieve recognition and support based on intensive fieldwork archival research and interviews with key figures from the korean redress movement this book analyzes how their movements have been significantly affected and constrained by the cold war unresolved colonial relations between korea and japan nationalistic tensions between north korea south korea and japan and the national division both in the korean peninsula and within the korean community in japan despite these difficulties the redress movements of korean nuclear victims in japan were sustained by their unique ideal of national unification and joint efforts with korean and japanese citizens the history of which can deconstruct the mainstream narratives of hiroshima and nagasaki

zi zhi tong jian chinese 资治通鉴 english comprehensive mirror in aid of governance is a pioneering reference work in chinese historiography published in 1084 in the form of a chronicle in 1065 ad emperor yingzong of song ordered the great historian sima guang 1019 1086 ad to lead with other scholars such as his chief assistants liu shu liu ban and fan zuyu the compilation of a universal history of china the task took 19 years to be completed and in 1084 ad it was presented to his successor emperor shenzong of song the zi zhi tong jian records chinese history from 403 bc to 959 ad covering 16 dynasties and spanning across almost 1 400 years and contains 294 volumes 卷 and about 3 million chinese characters the principal text of the zizhi tongjian was recorded on 294 juan or volume chinese 卷 which are scrolls corresponding to a volume chapter or section of the work the text is a chronological narrative of the history of china from the warring states to the five dynasties sima guang left the traditional usage in chinese historiography for almost 1 000 years since the shiji was written standard chinese dynastic histories had primarily divided chapters between annals 本纪 of rulers and biographies 列传 of officials in chinese terms the book changed the format of histories from biographical style 纪传体 to chronological style 编年体 which is better suited for analysis activism and criticism according to wilkinson it had an enormous influence on later chinese historical writing either directly or through its many abbreviations continuations and adaptations the 294 juan sweep through 11 chinese historical periods warring states qin western han eastern han three kingdoms jin and the sixteen kingdoms southern and northern dynasties sui tang and five dynasties it was one of the largest historical magna opera in history the book consisted of 294 chapters of which the following number describe each respective dynastic era 1 5 chapters zhou 1046 256 bc 2 3 chapters qin 221 207 bc 3 60 chapters han 206 bc 220 ad 4 10 chapters wei 220 265 5 40 chapters jin 265 420 6 16 chapters liu song 420 479 7 10 chapters qi 479 502 8 22 chapters liang 502 557 9 10 chapters chen 557 589 10 8 chapters sui 589 618 ad 11 81 chapters tang 618 907 12 6 chapters later liang 907 923 13 8 chapters later tang 923 936 14 6 chapters later jin 936 947 15 4 chapters later han 947 951 16 5 chapters later zhou 951 960 the book includes volume 177 to 184 covering sui dynasty among a series of books of zi zhi tong jian

traces the diminishing autonomy of the country's rural populations and their subordination to larger urban networks and shared administrative structures outside chongqing's urban centers competing forces are at work in reshaping the social political and spatial organization of its villages while municipal planners and policy makers seek to extend state power structures beyond the boundaries of the city village leaders and inhabitants try to maintain control over their communities uncertain futures through strategies such as collectivization shareholding real estate development and migration as china seeks to rectify the development crises of previous decades through rapid urban growth such drastic transformations threaten to displace existing ways of life for more than 600 million residents offering an unprecedented look at the country's contentious shift in urban planning and policy the end of the village exposes the precarious future of rural life in china and suggests a critical reappraisal of how we think about urbanization

liu yuan's *lingyan ge* a woodblock printed book from 1669 re-creates a portrait gallery that memorialized 24 vassals of the early tang court liu accompanied each figure presented under the guise of a bandit with a couplet the poems written in various scripts are surrounded by marginal images that allude to a contemporary novel religious icons supplement the portrait gallery liu's re-creation is fraught with questions this study examines the dialogues created among the texts and images in *lingyan ge* from multiple perspectives analysis of the book's materialities demonstrates how *lingyan ge* embodies rather than reflects the historical moment in which it was made liu unveiled and even dramatized the interface between manuscript and printed book in *lingyan ge* authority over the book's production is negotiated asserted overturned and reinstated use of pictures to construct a historical argument intensifies this struggle anne burkus chasson argues that despite a general epistemological shift toward visual forms of knowledge in the seventeenth century looking and reading were still seen as being in conflict this conflict plays out among the leaves of liu yuan's book

over the last fifteen years local citizens movements have spread rapidly throughout japan this volume examines the growth and nature of civil society participation in local urban and environmental governance

when do we see social movements mobilize against the american military overseas and what explains their varying intensity despite increasing interest in the vast network of u.s. military bases on foreign soil it is still not well understood why some host communities resist the bases in their backyards while others remain compliant in base towns claudia junghyun kim addresses this puzzle by investigating the contentious politics surrounding twenty u.s. military bases across korea and japan in particular she looks at municipalities hosting these bases and differing levels of community acceptance and resistance over time drawing on fieldwork interviews participant observation and protest event data from 2000-2015 kim shows that activists occasionally manage to join hands with the otherwise politically inactive local populations when they deliberately subordinate their radical movement goals to more immediate mundane demands that form the basis of everyday local grievances specifically the activists in base towns successfully build broad anti-base movements when they take advantage of quotidian disruption adopt culturally resonant movement frames and ally with local political elites these activist strategies however sometimes end up reinforcing the widely presumed inevitability of the american presence in examining activist actions strategies and dilemmas this book sheds

light on marginalized actors in domestic and international politics far removed from elite decision making processes that shape interstate base politics and yet living with their consequences who sometimes manage to complicate the operations of america s military behemoth

the book is the volume of prosperity in sui and tang dynasties among a series of books of chinese dynastic history the earliest known written records of the history of china date from as early as 1250 bc from the shang dynasty c 1600 1046 bc and the bamboo annals 296 bc describe a xia dynasty c 2070 1600 bc before the shang but no writing is known from the period the shang ruled in the yellow river valley which is commonly held to be the cradle of chinese civilization however neolithic civilizations originated at various cultural centers along both the yellow river and yangtze river these yellow river and yangtze civilizations arose millennia before the shang with thousands of years of continuous history china is one of the world s oldest civilizations and is regarded as one of the cradles of civilization the zhou dynasty 1046 256 bc supplanted the shang and introduced the concept of the mandate of heaven to justify their rule the central zhou government began to weaken due to external and internal pressures in the 8th century bc and the country eventually splintered into smaller states during the spring and autumn period these states became independent and warred with one another in the following warring states period much of traditional chinese culture literature and philosophy first developed during those troubled times in 221 bc qin shi huang conquered the various warring states and created for himself the title of huangdi or emperor of the qin marking the beginning of imperial china however the oppressive government fell soon after his death and was supplanted by the longer lived han dynasty 206 bc 220 ad successive dynasties developed bureaucratic systems that enabled the emperor to control vast territories directly in the 21 centuries from 206 bc until ad 1912 routine administrative tasks were handled by a special elite of scholar officials young men well versed in calligraphy history literature and philosophy were carefully selected through difficult government examinations china s last dynasty was the qing 1644 1912 which was replaced by the republic of china in 1912 and in the mainland by the people s republic of china in 1949 chinese history has alternated between periods of political unity and peace and periods of war and failed statehood the most recent being the chinese civil war 1927 1949 china was occasionally dominated by steppe peoples most of whom were eventually assimilated into the han chinese culture and population between eras of multiple kingdoms and warlordism chinese dynasties have ruled parts or all of china in some eras control stretched as far as xinjiang and tibet as at present traditional culture and influences from other parts of asia and the western world carried by waves of immigration cultural assimilation expansion and foreign contact form the basis of the modern culture of china
