the personality of a general is indispensable Napoleon once said he is the head he is the all of an army in *Masters of the Battlefield* Paul K Davis offers vivid portraits of fifteen legendary military leaders whose brilliance on and off the battlefield embody this maxim hailing from the earliest days of Greek warfare to France at the turn of the nineteenth century these men stand out for their tactical abilities generals who made a difference in combat grasping the way an enemy would think or move and reacting not just to ensure victory but do so in the face of superior forces among the leaders discussed in this encompassing work of military history are Alexander the Great Hannibal Scipio Africanus Belisarius Chinggis Khan Oda Nobunaga the Duke of Wellington and Napoleon Bonaparte Davis briefly explores the biography of each commander considering how his upbringing early experiences and social and cultural background might have translated into his leadership abilities relying on vast research Davis describes the nature of armies and warfare of the time from the phalanx battle of ancient Greece to the artillery heavy Swedish army under Gustavus Adolphus he also examines the course of the wars in which each general fought as a background to the particular battles that best illustrate their abilities and discusses each battle in detail aided extensively by detailed battlefield maps Davis concludes each section with an analysis of the tactical skills and principles at which each general excelled in analyzing these remarkable leaders Davis offers a picture of warfare throughout history and shows this

history to be directed and oftentimes wholly decided by the abilities of a single man masters of the battlefield tells the stories of men who defined eras reshaped nations and who through the introduction of new weapons and tactics revolutionized the nature of warfare

in an effort to make sense of war beyond the battlefield in studying the wars that were captured under the rubric of the war on terror this special issue book seeks to explore the complex spatial relationships between war and the spaces that one is not used to thinking of as the battlefield it focuses on the conflicts that still animate the spaces and places where violence has been launched and that the war has not left untouched in focusing on war beyond the battlefield it is not that the battlefield as the place where war is waged has gone in smoke or has borne out of importance it is rather the case that the battlefield has been displaced redesigned reshaped and rethought through new spatializing practices of warfare these new spaces of war new in the sense that they are not traditionally thought of as spaces where war takes place or is brought to are television screens cellular phones and bandwidth george w bush s ranch in crawford texas videogames popular culture sites news media blogs and so on these spaces of war beyond the battlefield are crucial to understanding what goes on the battlefield in iraq afghanistan or in other fronts of the war on terror such as the homeland to understand how terror has globally been waged beyond the battlefield this book was originally published as a special issue of geopolitics

ever since the custer massacres on june 25 1876 the question has been asked what happened what really happened at the battle of the little bighorn we know some of the answers because half of george armstrong custer s seventh cavalry the men with major marcus reno and captain frederick benteen survived the fight but what of the half that did not the troopers civilians scouts and journalist who were with custer now because a grass fire in august 1983 cleared the terrain of brush and grass and made possible thorough archaeological examinations of the battlefield in 1984 and 1985 we have many answers to important questions on the basis of the archaeological evidence presented in this book we know more about what kinds of weapons were used against the cavalry we know exactly where many of the men fought how they died and what happened to their bodies at the time of or after death we know how the troopers were deployed what kind of clothing they wore what kind of equipment they had how they fought through the techniques of historical archaeology and forensic anthropology the remains and grave of one of custer s scouts mitch boyer have been identified and through geomorphology and the process of elimination we know with almost 100 percent certainty where the twenty eight missing men who supposedly were buried en masse in deep ravine will be found

in the summer of 1864 the american civil war had been dragging on for over three years with no end in sight things had not gone well for the union and the public blamed the president for the stalemate against the confederacy and for the appalling numbers of killed and wounded lincoln was thoroughly convinced that without a favorable change in the trajectory of the war he would have no chance of winning a second term against former union general george b mcclellan whom he had previously dismissed as commander of the army of the potomac this vivid engrossing account of a critical year in american history examines the events of 1864 when the course of american history might have taken a radically different direction it s no exaggeration to say that if mcclellan had won the election everything would have been different mcclellan and the democrats planned to end the war immediately grant the south its independence and let the confederacy keep its slaves what were the crucial factors that in the end swung public sentiment in favor of lincoln johnson focuses on the battlefield campaigns of generals ulysses s grant and william tecumseh sherman while grant was waging a war of attrition with superior manpower against the quick and elusive rebel forces under general robert e lee

sherman was fighting a protracted battle in georgia against confederate general joseph e johnston but then the president of the confederacy jefferson davis made a tactical error that would change the whole course of the war this lively narrative full of intriguing historical facts brings to life an important series of episodes in our nation s history history and civil war buffs will not want to put down this real life page turner

the battle of the crater is known as one of the civil war s bloodiest struggles a union loss with combined casualties of 5 000 many of whom were members of the united states colored troops usct under union brigadier general edward ferrero the battle was a violent clash of forces as confederate soldiers fought for the first time against african american soldiers after the union lost the battle these black soldiers were captured and subject both to extensive abuse and the threat of being returned to slavery in the south yet despite their heroism and sacrifice these men are often overlooked in public memory of the war in remembering the battle of the crater war is murder kevin m levin addresses the shared recollection of a battle that epitomizes the way americans have chosen to remember or in many cases forget the presence of the usct the volume analyzes how the racial component of the war s history was portrayed at various points during the 140 years following its conclusion illuminating the social changes and challenges experienced by the nation as a whole remembering the battle of the crater gives the members of the usct a newfound voice in history

includes 39 maps and plans the campaign and battle of chickamauga aug sep 1863 is an excellent vehicle for a staff ride because of the size of the

forces involved and the difficulty of the terrain encountered it represents an opportunity to raise many challenging teaching points relevant to today's officer second the nation has wisely preserved most of the primary battle area in the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park and has marked most unit positions for detailed study by visitors these markers are linked by an extensive trail network that permits access to all significant areas of the field thus the park is an excellent physical laboratory for the study of conflict at the tactical and human level the staff ride handbook for the battle of Chickamauga 18-20 Sep 1863 provides a systematic approach to the analysis of this great Civil War battle part i describes the organization of the federal and confederate armies detailing their weapons tactics and logistical engineer communications and medical support in part ii the Chickamauga campaign is discussed placing the battle in historical perspective and illustrating how the battle fits into the overall context of the Chickamauga campaign part iii furnishes a suggested route to follow in order to get a firsthand concrete view of how the battle developed by following this route various phases of the battle can be discussed and significant points made concerning the evolving battle also in part iii are various vignettes by participants in the battle that describe the fight and offer insights into the emotional disposition of the combatants part iv furnishes current information on the Chickamauga site sources of assistance and logistical data for conducting a staff ride in addition appendixes give order of battle information for the two armies meteorological data and a list of medal of honor recipients in the battle a bibliography is also provided

illustrated with 9 figures and 11 maps of the campaign and engagements at Perryville the battle of Perryville symbolized the high water mark of the confederacy in the western theater of operations in Aug 1862 General Braxton Bragg and Major General MG Edmund Kirby Smith led separate armies into Kentucky to wrest the state from the Union and install a confederate governor they initially met success and captured the state capital simultaneously shifting the war in the west from northern Mississippi and Alabama to Kentucky in response the North raised additional forces to protect Cincinnati and Louisville while MG Don Carlos Buell halted his offensive against Chattanooga and marched his army of the Ohio back to Kentucky on 8 Oct 1862 Buell's army clashed with Bragg's at Perryville the Confederates achieved a tactical success in a hard fought engagement that generated more than 7,000 casualties of the regiments engaged 10 suffered losses between 40 and 60 percent however outnumbered by three to one Bragg's army could not sustain its victory and withdrew within days of the battle all of the invading southern forces retired from the state Kentucky

remained firmly in the union and secure from confederate invasion for the war's duration despite its importance to the course of the war in the west. Perryville does not benefit from the high visibility accorded the better known civil war sites such as Manassas, Gettysburg, Antietam, and Chickamauga. Although more than 70,000 union and confederate soldiers deployed in and around Perryville, understanding of the battle and its significance to the overall course of the war remains poor for staff ride purposes. This unfamiliarity can be a benefit; it forces the participants to study and think about the situation facing their civil war counterparts without the preconceived notions that surround the more popular sites.

The Battle of the Little Bighorn was the decisive engagement of the Great Sioux War of 1876-1877. In its second edition, this biographical dictionary of all known participants, the 7th Cavalry, civilians, and Indians, provides a brief description of the battle as well as information on the various tribes, their customs, and methods of fighting. Seven appendices cover the units, soldiers, uniforms, and equipment of the cavalry, controversial listings of scouts, and the number of Indians in the encampments. The location of camps on the way to the Big Horn and more updated biographies are provided for many European soldiers, along with an additional 5,060 names of Indians who were or could have been in the battle.

Following this historic battle, the United States Colored Troops (USCT) had proven their valor and taken their rightful place among heroes in America's history. In the predawn darkness of September 29, 1864, black union soldiers attacked a heavily fortified position on the outskirts of the confederate capital of Richmond. In a few hours of desperate fighting, these African American soldiers struck a blow against Robert E. Lee's vaunted Army of Northern Virginia and proved to detractors that they could fight for freedom and citizenship for themselves and their enslaved brethren. For fourteen of the black soldiers who stormed New Market Heights that day, their bravery would be awarded with the nation's highest honor, the Congressional Medal of Honor. With vivid firsthand accounts and meticulous tactical detail, James S. Price brings the Battle of New Market Heights into brilliant focus with maps by master cartographer Steven Stanley.

The second of two Battleground Europe titles covering this highly significant battle of spring 1918, the German offensive in Flanders in April 1918 came close to catastrophe for the British armies but ultimately ended in strategic defeat for the Kaiser's men. Following close on the heels of the devastating Operation Michael attack in March, which had been aimed against the British front on the Somme and Arras, this offensive operation, Georgette, was aimed at strangling the vital railways and roads that supplied the British at



ypres and threatening the vital logistics links with the channel ports having assembled an overwhelming numerical advantage the germans attacked in thick fog on 9 april 1918 by days end the germans had succeeded in gaining a crossing of the river lys and were well on their way to the railway junctions at hazebrouck next day they extended the attacked front northwards and advanced to the very gates of ypres forcing a british retirement from the bloodily won advances during the third battle of ypres messines ridge captured so spectacularly by the british in june 1917 was soon in german hands and fighting inched towards mont kemmel which dominated the ypres front once this fell the way was open for the capture of the main supply roads into ypres to find sufficient reserves to counter the german attack the british took the heart breaking decision to abandon the ground won so dearly in the passchendaele offensive in the summer and autumn of 1917 gradually fresher british and french reserves arrived and held their ground with disappointing results mounting casualties and a diminishing return for their efforts the germans paused to regroup late in the month they unleashed a rapid unstoppable attack that captured kemmel from the french forces that had been rushed north to reinforce the threatened line and which had been holding the summit one of the finest military feats of the great war behind the scenes however the germans were already calling off a continuation of the offensive and so by a seeming miracle the bastion that was ypres remained in british hands what the british call the battle of the lys 1918 is a fascinating yet curiously neglected period of military history chris baker examines this major battle from the strategic down to the platoon level highlighting the key events characters and acts of enormous bravery on both sides both in historical narrative and in a series of tours of the area this volume concentrates on the northern half of the battlefield nearly all of the actions described in this volume took place in belgium

the battle of carthage missouri was the first full scale land battle of the civil war governor claiborne jackson s rebel missouri state guard made its way toward southwest missouri near where confederate volunteers collected in arkansas while colonel franz sigel s union force occupied springfield with orders to intercept and block the rebels from reaching the confederates the two armies collided near carthage on july 5 1861 the battle lasted for ten hours spread over several miles and included six separate engagements

before the union army withdrew under the cover of darkness the new york times called it the first serious conflict between the united states troops and the rebels this book describes the events leading up to the battle the battle itself and the aftermath

a comprehensive guide to the battle for the ukraine from the soviet perspective during the winter of 1943 1944 this volume is an unexpurgated translation of the originally classified soviet general staff study no 14

this study investigates whether the infantry doctrine used by the union and confederate armies in the battle of chickamauga followed published doctrine and determines what effect infantry doctrine had on the battle beginning with a review of each side s formal doctrine the study divides the battle into sixty eight engagements and focuses on organization formations used terrain use of skirmishers engagement distances use of breastworks and engagement results to determine the doctrine used and its impact on the battle the armies organizations and formations indicate that each used a different doctrinal source union forces appeared to use brigadier general silas casey s manual while the confederates used lieutenant general william hardee s and lieutenant general winfield scott s manuals casey s doctrine gave the union army greater potential flexibility within their brigade division and corps formations but the cost of that potential was less combat power in the line of battle and vulnerability on the flanks engagement analysis indicates that both sides deviated from tactics by fighting prone during heavy firefights union breastworks in this battle were almost invulnerable the final conclusion is that while initial engagement distances were largely determined by terrain minimum ranges seemed to be influenced by the increased lethal range of the rifled musket
