at stake in this book is a struggle with language in a time when our old faith in the redeeming of the word and the word's power to redeem has almost been destroyed drawing on benjamin's political theology his interpretation of the german baroque mourning play and adorno's critical aesthetic theory but also on the thought of poets and many other philosophers especially hegel's phenomenology of spirit nietzsche's analysis of nihilism and derrida's writings on language kleinberg levin shows how because of its communicative and revelatory powers language bears the utopian promise of happiness the idea of a secular redemption of humanity at the very heart of which must be the achievement of universal justice in an original reading of beckett's plays novels and short stories kleinberg levin shows how despite inheriting a language damaged corrupted and commodified beckett redeems dead or dying words and wrests from this language new possibilities for the expression of meaning without denying beckett's nihilism his picture of a radically disenchanted world kleinberg levin calls attention to moments when his words suddenly ignite and break free of their despair and pain taking shape in the beauty of an austere yet joyous lyricism suggesting that after all meaning is still possible

electrifying when first delivered in 1973 legendary in the years since dieter henrich's lectures on german idealism were the first contact a major german philosopher had made with an american audience since the onset of world war ii they remain one of the most eloquent explanations and interpretations of classical german philosophy and of the way it relates to the concerns of contemporary philosophy thanks to the editorial work of david pacini the lectures appear here with annotations linking them to editions of the masterworks of german philosophy as they are now available henrich describes the movement that led from kant to hegel beginning with an interpretation of the structure and tensions of kant's system he locates the kantian movement and revival of spinoza as sketched by f h jacobi in the intellectual conditions of the time and in the philosophical motivations of modern thought providing extensive analysis of the various versions of fichte's science of knowledge henrich brings into view a constellation of problems that illuminate the accomplishments of the founders of romanticism novalis and friedrich schlegel and of the poet hölderlin's original philosophy he concludes with an interpretation of the basic design of hegel's system

we all seek salvation claims blanco because we all become prisoners of negativity humanity wants to be saved we want to overcome the negativity that so often enslaves us but where is the saviour to be found and where is the source of salvation in philosophy and salvation blanco argues that salvation may only come from the infinite springs of the word the word saves us the word of science the word manifested in art the word of a society which promises something for itself humanity understands itself through language human beings use words in order to know each other and to cooperate in the edification of something that may transcend them the word invites us and in fact leads us to transcendence this is salvation to inaugurate a new world in which the former negativity may be overcome blanco looks back over the history of philosophical and theological thought to bring his argument to life for all seeking salvation today

i had been asked to do a bible study when i began my first church out of seminary i agreed so long as i could do it my way in the fourth year of my work at hilltop christian church in mantua ohio i chose to do the song of solomon known in many circles as the song of songs i was guided in the development in part by the then recent anchor bible commentary by marvin pope the study influenced me greatly in the next decade or so i indulged a variety of works on the song of songs largely but not exclusively in the christian mystical tradition in 1997 i found a way to work on a devotional development from the song of songs resulting in a work i found satisfying from those two major efforts a few minor ones arose i have collected here the ways in which the song of songs has woven into my work as a pastor

in 1714 the 29 year old johann sebastian bach was promoted to the position of concertmaster at the ducal court of weimar this post required him for the first time in his already established career to produce a regular stream of church cantatas one cantata every four weeks among the most significant works of this period is ich hatte viel bekümmernis in meinem herzen

cantata 21 generally known in english as i had much affliction cantata 21 draws from several psalms and the book of revelations and offers a depiction of the spiritual ascent of the soul from intense tribulation to joy and exaltation although widely performed and loved by musicians cantata 21 has endured much criticism from scholars and critics who claim that the piece lacks organizational clarity and stylistic coherence in tears into wine renowned bach scholar eric chafe challenges the scholarly consensus arguing that cantata 21 is an exceptionally carefully designed work and that it displays a convergence of musical structure and theological purpose that is paradigmatic of bach's sacred work as a whole drawing on a wide range of lutheran theological writing chafe shows that cantata 21 reaches beyond the scope of the individual liturgical occasion to voice a breadth of meaning that encompasses much of the core of lutheran thought chafe artfully demonstrates that instead of simply presenting a musical depiction of the soul's journey from sorrow to bliss cantata 21 expresses the various stages of god's revelation and their impact on the believing soul as a result chafe reveals that cantata 21 has a formal design that mirrors lutheran belief in unfolding revelation with the final movement representing the work's crown the goal toward which all of the earlier movements are directed complete with full text translations of the cantata and the liturgical readings that would have accompanied it at the first performance tears into wine is a monumental book that is ideally suited for bach scholars and students as well as those generally interested in the relationship between theology and music

and in romanian culture is rich tradition mr sorin cerin is part of it doing a remarkable work of all quotes focuses his reflections of life and cultural experience and its overflow the shares of others all those who will open this book of teaching like any good book it will reward them by participation in wisdom good thought of reading them

this book is written for those who haven t yet discovered the brilliance humor humility and awe filled writings of c s lewis maybe one who has read the lion the witch and the wardrobe but no other narnia books or half of mere christianity and got side tracked or has heard their pastor quote lewis time and again and wonders why or thought what is the big deal about c s lewis the author highlights the eight or ten most meaningful lewis ideas that have transformed his life ideas such as what real joy is and the presence of god in everyday occurrences and the secret to recovery of child like wonder and the startling relevance of lewis to today and how believing in christ makes the most sense i enjoyed reading this wondrous book about c s lewis it is twice wondrous because it is a pleasure not only to read rich latta s insights into c s lewis s books but to enjoy the feeling that comes when a writer opens his heart so warmly as rich has done i decided i want what rich latta has uncovered in the second half of his life the enjoyment of a new start in seeing and feeling the wonder of god this enjoyment is god himself more of god rich writes it is also a heartfelt awakening to all that is wondrous in the world that god made thank you rich you have given the reader a gift of awakened wonder theirs and yours bob blincoe phd president emeritus frontiers

a new edition of the bestselling classic published with a special introduction to mark its 10th anniversary this pioneering account sets out to understand the structure of the human brain the

place where mind meets matter until recently the left hemisphere of our brain has been seen as the rational side the superior partner to the right but is this distinction true drawing on a vast body of experimental research iain mcgilchrist argues while our left brain makes for a wonderful servant it is a very poor master as he shows it is the right side which is the more reliable and insightful without it our world would be mechanistic stripped of depth colour and value

this book presents the creative arts based and educative thinking resulting from a 21 day autoethnography challenge set of self guided prompts arising from the large scale collaborative creative and global project to explore massive and microscopic sensemaking during covid 19 times it employs a guiding methodological framework of critical autoethnography narrating the macro and micro experiences of covid 19 from a first person and critically culturally informed perspective the book features chapters creatively responding to the 21 day pandemic experiment through digital autoethnographic artworks writings and collaborations it allowed authors to build embodied sensibilities practice autoethnographic forms of writing and making and transform personal experiences through the covid 19 moment into critical understanding of scale sense making and the relationality of humans nonhumans and the planet

looking at the globalization urban regeneration arts events and cultural spectacles this book considers a city not until now included in the global city debate divided into five parts each preceded by an editorial introduction this book is an interdisciplinary study of an iconic city a city facing conflicting social political and cultural pressures in its search for a place in europe and on the world stage in the twenty first century

thomas mann is among the greatest of german prose writers and was the first german novelist to reach a wide english speaking readership since goethe novels such as buddenbrooks the magic mountain and doktor faustus attest to his mastery of subtle distanced irony while novellas such as death in venice reveal him at the height of his mastery of language in addition to fresh insights about these best known works of mann this volume treats less often discussed works such as joseph and his brothers lotte in weimar and felix krull as well as his political writings and essays mann himself was a paradox his role as family father was both refuge and façade his love of germany was matched by his contempt for its having embraced hitler while in exile during the nazi period he functioned as the prime representative of the good germany in the fight against fascism and he has often been remembered this way in english speaking lands but a new view of mann is emerging half a century after his death a view of him as one of the great writers of a modernity understood as extending into our 21st century this volume provides sixteen essays by american and european specialists they demonstrate the relevance of his writings for our time making particular use of the biographical material that is now available contributors ehrhard bahr manfred dierks werner frizen clayton koelb helmut koopmann wolfgang lederer hannelore mundt peter pütz jens rieckmann hans joachim sandberg egon schwarz and hans vaget herbert lehnert is research professor and eva wessell is lecturer in humanities both at the university of california irvine

in recounting the rich narratives of key biblical figures from adam and eve to noah cain abraham moses job and jesus in the whirlwind paints a surprising picture of the ambivalent mutually dependent relationship between god and his peoples taking the hebrew and christian bibles as a unified whole but traces god's relationship with humanity as it evolves from complete harmony at the outset to continual struggle in almost every case god insists on unconditional obedience while humanity withholds submission and holds god accountable for his promises
