cultural memory and the construction of identity brings together scholars of folklore literature history and communication to explore the dynamics of cultural memory in a variety of contexts memory is a powerful tool that can transform a piece of earth into a homeland and common objects into symbols the authors of this volume show how memory is shaped and how it operates in uniting society and creating images that attain the value of truth even if they deviate from fact

prompted by the overt omission of muncie's black community from the famous community study by robert's lynd and helen merrell lynd middletown a study in

modern american culture the authors initiated this project to reveal the unrecorded historical and contemporary life of middletown a well known pseudonym for the midwestern city of muncie indiana as a collaboration of community and campus this book recounts the early efforts of hurley goodall to develop a community history and archive that told the story of the african american community and rectify the representation of small town america as exclusively white the authors designed and implemented a collaborative ethnographic field project that involved intensive interviews research and writing between community organizations local experts ethnographers and teams of college students this book is a unique model for collaborative research easily accessible to students it will be a valuable resource for instructors in anthropology creative writing sociology community research and african american studies

winner of the 2019 chicago folklore prize in 2011 the midwest suffered devastating floods due to the flooding the us army corps of engineers activated the birds point new madrid floodway one of the flood prevention mechanisms of the mississippi rivers and tributaries project this levee breach was intended to divert water in order to save the town of cairo illinois but in the process it completely destroyed the small african american town of pinhook missouri in when they blew the levee race politics and community in pinhook missouri authors david todd lawrence and elaine j lawless examine two conflicting narratives about the flood one promoted by the corps of engineers that boasts the success of the levee breach and the flood diversion and the other gleaned from displaced pinhook residents who in oral narratives tell a different story of neglect and indifference on the part of government officials receiving inadequate warning and no evacuation assistance during the breach residents lost everything still after more than six years displaced pinhook residents have yet to receive restitution and funding for relocation and reconstruction of their town the authors research traces a long history of discrimination and neglect of the rights of the pinhook community beginning with their migration from the deep south to southeast

missouri through purchasing and farming the land and up to the birds point levee breach nearly eighty years later the residents stories relate what it has been like to be dispersed in other small towns living with relatives and friends while trying to negotiate the bureaucracy surrounding federal emergency management agency and state emergency management agency assistance programs ultimately the stories of displaced citizens of pinhook reveal a strong african american community whose bonds were developed over time and through shared traditions a community persisting despite extremely difficult circumstances

preaching says professor and author o wesley allen jr should be considered as a form of conversation the church after all is a community of conversation that exists in part to interpret god s purposes for the world and to participate in those purposes the idea of the sermon as a conversation then is not simply a style or form of preaching but an integral expression of the nature and purpose of the church

nestled in the foothills of the great smoky mountains lived an american family the david and lizzie miller family this book is a story about the millers and the seven african american communities in cocke county tennessee its a book about a community of people oft en invisible or overlooked in historical accounts however this family and these seven communities were vibrantly visible the story and a collection of photos document an everyday american experience and the values that fueled a people these values oft en not attributed to them give meaning to a collective vision of america and a way of life that embraced nurture of family love of god education of children the building of community and a dedication to earning a living through hard work and entrepreneurial endeavors

during the summer of 1963 civil rights movements were taking place all over the south in northeastern north carolina the struggle for freedom focused on the small town of williamston where a legacy of voting rights advocacy and a history of violence caught

the attention of martin luther king jr and his southern christian leadership conference sclc the massachusetts chapter of the sclc sent fifteen white ministers to williamston in november in an attempt to increase media coverage just as the movement was gaining traction john f kennedy was assassinated and the nation lost interest in williamston so far the williamston freedom movement has remained little known though its impact was significant locally this book details the events and those who participated and includes 19 interviews with members of both the black and white community by studying local movements historians can better understand how ordinary people contributed to the civil rights movement

when clans collide the germination of adams family tree through surname life experience and dna tells the story of author wayne rudolph davidsons surname and its ancestral connection to individuals and events that have shaped the world in which we live when davidson set out to discover the ancestral history of his surname he had no idea what he would encounter on his journey he discovered that people with the surname of davidson have contributed to government and politics business and economics social sciences religion education science and technology music and entertainment sports and recreation and military history the research included here illustrates events ranging from the evolution of the english crown and the building of north america to the american revolution and the american civil war he also discovered quite a few events linked to african american history including the period of reconstruction buffalo soldiers and the great plains and the great migration davidsons have also contributed to the popularity of sports and entertainment the growth of the office of the president of the united states both world wars and the sacrifice of heroes interesting and informative when clans collide explores the history of one surname and provides a foundation and plan for making the connection to your own ancestral heritage through your surname

this is the final volume of nine in a series on gay and lesbian studies originally

published in 1993 lesbian sources is a cross referenced bibliography of articles written by and or about lesbians and published in nationally or internationally distributed periodicals between 1970 and 1990

a fascinating study of one of the georgia s most important black families retraces the steps of a former slave who became an extremely wealthy man within the four decades of being freed from bondage

the long and storied career of vernon e jordan jr one of the nations finest speakers has carried him from work on the civil rights front lines in the south to the national urban league to positions of influence at the highest level of business and politics a friend and confidant to presidents vernon jordan has never forgotten the men and women from wiley branton to martin luther king from fannie lou hamer to whitney young to primus king whose oratorical skill in service to social justice deeply influenced him their examples and voices mixed with vernons own make this book both a history and an embodiment of black speech at its finest full of emotion controlled force righteous indignation love of country and awe in front of the challenges ahead

most of richard dorson s thirty years as folklorist have been spent collecting tales and legends in the remote backcountry far from the centers of population for this book he extended his search for folk traditions to one of the most heavily industrialized sections of the united states can folklore be found he wondered in the calumet region of northwest indiana does it exist among the steelworkers ethnic groups and blacks in gary whiting east chicago and hammond in his usual entertaining style dorson shows that a rich and varied folklore exists in the region although it differs from that of rural people it is equally vital much of this urban lore finds expression in conversational anecdotes and stories that deal with pressing issues the flight from the inner city crime in the streets working conditions in the steel mills the maintenance of ethnic identity the place of blacks in a predominantly white society the folklore reveals strongly held

attitudes such as the loathing of industrial work resistance to assimilation and black adoption of middle class white values miliworkers and mill executives housewives ethnic performers storekeepers and preachers tell their stories about the region the concerns that occupy them affect city dwellers throughout the united states land of the millrats though it depicts a special place speaks for much of america

a brand new history of newton county with information never before printed as well as selected familiar information the birth of newton county is placed in perspective by relating its birth to significant national and state events happening in the same time period the book deals with neosho seneca and granby contributions made by its black citizens important businesses and industries camp crowder and the impact of wars on newton county citizens law enforcement hospitals and doctors and caves and springs of the county interviews archive research and personal letters provide fresh insights with never before published information combining new information with unique insights into familiar historical information this book is a valuable addition to the historical sources dealing with newton county

this woman s work presents a social history and critical biography based on the life of award winning writer bebe moore campbell 1950 2006 it offers the personal story of a popular novelist journalist and mental health advocate this book examines campbell s life and activism in two periods first as a student at the university of pittsburgh during the 1960s black student movement and second as a mental health advocate near the end of her life in 2006 it describes campbell s activism within the black action society from 1967 to 1971 and her negotiation of the black nationalist ideologies espoused during the 1960s the book also explores campbell s later involvement in the national

alliance on mental illness nami her role as a national spokesperson and the local activism that sparked the birth of the nami urban los angeles chapter which served black and latino communities 1999 2006 adjacent to her activist work campbell s first novel your blues ain t like mine connects to her emerging political consciousness related to race and gender and the concern for racial violence during the us black liberation period from 1950 to 1970 similarly campbell s final novel 72 hour hold is examined closely for its connection to her activism as well as the sociopolitical commentary emphasis on mental health disparities coping with mental illness and advocacy in black communities as a writer and activist campbell immersed her readers in immediately relevant historical and sociopolitical matters this woman s work is the first full length biography of bebe moore campbell and details the seamless marriage of her fiction writing and community activism

theologian and jazz pianist william edgar places jazz within the context of the african american experience and explores the work of musicians like miles davis and ella fitzgerald arguing that jazz which moves from deep lament to inextinguishable joy deeply resonates with the hope that is ultimately found in the good news of jesus christ

sustaining identity recapturing heritage examines the complex web of public history race cultural identity and tourism in luray virginia a rural southern town the texts associated with this town s public history tourist brochures promotional narratives historic homes memorials and monuments are devoted to the founding eighteenth century families and confederate soldiers in luray s past but they also marginalize the history and heritage of african americans and american indians and nearly obliterate the history of women in this region thus the public history does not reflect the actual history of this town a close look at one town helps to debunk the ideas and ideologies of the existence of a monolithic south since the term could mean mississippi north carolina or somewhere in between luray and the shenandoah valley with their distinctive geographical economical architectural and cultural history can boast of its

own discrete southern identity the book reveals how african american texts and history reveal contributions to the town of luray and the shenandoah valley region the book studies the ol slave auction block a controversial public history site that subverts the white hegemonic heritage of the town sustaining identity recapturing heritage is groundbreaking in its study of african american tourism

ethics the first volume of mcclendon's systematic theology explored the shape of life in the christian community doctrine the second volume investigated the teaching necessary to sustain that life witness the third and final volume of the work considers the wider context in which that life takes place it asserts that the church's identity is established not only by how it lives and what it teaches but also by how it enters into conversation and connects with systems of thought and social structures outside itself mcclendon continues here his exploration of the baptist vision a tradition of the church sunderstanding of itself its relation to scripture and its place in the larger society which flows from the radical reformation of the 16th century he employs that vision to engage in conversation with three principal partners other theologies current philosophy and culture including science and letters the fine and performing arts and politics in short what scripture calls the world

this volume assesses contemporary church responses to multicultural diversity and resisted categories of social difference with a central focus on whether or how racial ethnic religious sexual and gender differences are validated by churches and especially black churches torn between competing inclusive and exclusive tendencies

essays on the famed activist and preacher among the first to call for relocation reconciliation and redistribution in a post civil rights america

flashes of a southern spirit explores meanings of the spirit in the american south including religious ecstasy and celebrations of regional character and distinctiveness charles reagan wilson sees ideas of the spirit as central to understanding southern identity the south nurtured a patriotic spirit expressed in the high emotions of confederates going off to war but the region also was the setting for a spiritual outpouring of prayer and song during the civil rights movement arguing for a spiritual grounding to southern identity wilson shows how identifications of the spirit are crucial to understanding what makes southerners invest so much meaning in their regional identity from the late nineteenth century invention of southern tradition to early twenty first century folk artistic creativity wilson examines a wide range of cultural expression including music literature folk art media representations and religious imagery he finds new meanings in the works of such creative giants as william faulkner richard wright and elvis presley while at the same time closely examining little studied figures such as the artist revivalist mckendree long wilson proposes that southern spirituality is a neglected category of analysis in the recent flourishing of interdisciplinary studies on the south one that opens up the cultural interaction of blacks and whites in the region

no longer bound is about the intersection of reading comprehension and interpretation that leads to the development of a powerful and transformative sermon reading facilitates the interpretive process which is the essence of any sermon the sermon is an interpretation of an interpretation and as such presents itself as a new gospel message the ability to write and preach a sermon is an exercise in freedom the book is grounded in a narrative theological form that begins with the author s experience and filters that experience through the lens of hermeneutic philosophy and theology reading and preaching constitute the thread that runs throughout the book the book suggests that the sermon is the philosophic theology of black practical religion inasmuch as the black church is central to religion and culture this is a fresh and new understanding of homiletics philosophical theology and interpretation theory

saints in exile studies from an insider s perspective the worship practices and social ethics of the african american family of holiness pentecostal and apostolic churches known collectively as the sanctified church cheryl sanders identifies the theme of exile

both as an idea and an experience as the key to understanding the dialectical nature of african american religious and intellectual life that w e b du bois called double conscious sanders s saints in exile are a people who see themselves as in the world but not of it their marginalized status is both self imposed and involuntary a consequence of racism sexism and other forms of elitism when joined with the biblical tropes of homecoming and reconciliation the concept of exile serves as a vital vantage point from which to identify critique and remedy the continued alienation of blacks women and the poor in the united states sanders s interpretive approach clarifies many paradoxical features of black existence especially the peculiar interplay of the sacred and the secular in african american song speech and dance she particularly scrutinizes gospel music a product of the sanctified worship tradition that has had a significant influence on popular culture saints in exile goes further than any previous study in illuminating the african american experience it will be welcomed by scholars and students of american religion african american studies and american history

harriet tubman s name is known world wide and her exploits as a self liberated underground railroad heroine are celebrated in children s literature film and history books yet no major biography of tubman has appeared since 1943 jean m humez s

comprehensive harriet tubman is both an important biographical overview based on extensive new research and a complete collection of the stories tubman told about her life a virtual autobiography culled by humez from rare early publications and manuscript sources this book will become a landmark resource for scholars historians and general readers interested in slavery the underground railroad the civil war and african american women born in slavery in maryland in or around 1820 tubman drew upon deep spiritual resources and covert antislavery networks when she escaped to the north in 1849 vowing to liberate her entire family she made repeated trips south during the 1850s and successfully guided dozens of fugitives to freedom during the civil war she was recruited to act as spy and scout with the union army after the war she settled in auburn new york where she worked to support an extended family and in her later years founded a home for the indigent aged celebrated by her primarily white antislavery associates in a variety of private and public documents from the 1850s through the 1870s she was rediscovered as a race heroine by woman suffragists and the african american women's club movement in the early twentieth century her story was used as a key symbolic resource in education institutional fundraising and debates about the meaning of race throughout the twentieth century humez includes an extended discussion of tubman s work as a public performer of her own life history during the nearly sixty years she lived in the north drawing upon historiographical and literary discussion of the complex hybrid authorship of slave narrative literature humez analyzes the interactive dynamic between tubman and her interviewers humez illustrates how tubman though unable to write made major unrecognized contributions to the shaping of her own heroic myth by early biographers like sarah bradford selections of key documents illustrate how tubman appeared to her contemporaries and a comprehensive list of primary sources represents an important resource for scholars
