have you ever worried that you re doing a poor job of feeling poorly have you despaired that you re failing in your ailing have you felt you re missing out on tlc you re not alone it seems that most people these days just don t know how to make the most of being ill in a society where there is a pill to cure more or less everything this how to guide will teach readers about the subtle art of being an invalid it covers age old remedies for common maladies all but forgotten treatments and the vital preparations that should be made to make being bed ridden as comfortable and productive as possible from the team that created the uk booksellers association top 5 christmas book 101 uses of a dead kindle and amazon bestseller in rude health the art of being ill is at times practical at times hilarious but always an honest instruction manual for those who are truly terrible at being ill

original moving and drawing from a range of fields an essential exploration of what it means to be ill a serious illness often changes the way others see us few if any relationships remain the same the sick become more dependent on partners and family members while more distant contacts become strained the carers of the ill are also often isolated this book focuses on our sense of self when ill and how infirmity plays out in our relationships with others neil vickers and derek bolton offer an original perspective drawing on neuroscience psychology and psychoanalysis as well as memoirs of the ill or their carers to reveal how a sense of connectedness and group belonging can not only improve care but also make societies more resilient to illness this is an essential book on the experience of major illness

in incorporating social process into a model of the dynamics of mental disorders this text questions the individualistic model favoured in current psychiatric and psychoanalytic theory while the conventional psychiatric viewpoint seeks the causes of mental illness scheff views the symptoms of mental illness as the violation of residual rules social norms so taken for granted that they are not explicitly verbalized the sociological theory developed by scheff to account for such behaviour provides a framework for studies reported in subsequent chapters two key assumptions emerge first that most chronic mental illness is in part a social role and second that societal reaction may in part determine entry into that role throughout the sociological model of mental illness is compared and contrasted with more conventional medical and psychological models in an attempt to delineate significant problems for further analysis and research this third edition has been revised and expanded to encompass the controversy prompted by the first edition and also to re evaluate developments in the field new to this edition are discussions of the use of psychoactive drugs in the treatment of mental illness changing mental health laws new social science and psychiatric studies and the controversy surrounding the labelling theory of mental illness itself

a candid look at how people respond when someone close to them has an illness or disability and what can be done to avoid discomfort causing a rift in that relationship the book explores relationships between partners children and professionals and considers the different ways in which understanding can transform how people feel and react

this volume is a result of four days in july 2005 where historians health economists medical doctors and nurses anthropologists writers sociologists and many more travelled to oxford england for the fourth annual making sense of health illness and disease conference organised by inter disciplinary net

what is knowledge how hard is it for a person to have knowledge good knowledge bad knowledge confronts contemporary philosophical attempts to answer those classic questions by identifying and arguing against two fundamental epistemological presumptions can there be both better and worse knowledge of some fact can you improve your knowledge of a particular fact can there be especially bad knowledge of a specific fact epistemologists routinely answer these questions with a resounding no but stephen hetherington argues that those standard answers are mistaken the result is a theory of knowledge that is unique in conceiving of knowledge in a non absolutist way the theory offers new solutions to many traditional epistemological puzzles including various kinds of scepticism the gettier challenge and the problem of the criterion it also offers a fresh way of using g e moore s anti sceptical gambit along with reinterpretations of the epistemic roles of fallibility luck relevance and dogmatism and what can we know about knowledge the role of intuition in shaping epistemological thought about knowledge is critically examined anyone working on epistemology will enjoy this original and challenging work

market forces are driving a radical restructuring of health care delivery in the united states at the same time more and more people are living comparatively long lives with a variety of severe chronic health conditions many such people are concerned about the trend toward the creation of managed care systems because their need for frequent often complex medical services conflicts with managed care s desires to contain costs the fear is that people with serious chronic disorders will be excluded from or underserved by the integrated health care delivery networks now emerging responding to a request from the national institute of arthritis and musculoskeletal and skin diseases this book reflects the results of a workshop that focused on the following questions does the model of managed care or an integrated delivery system influence the types of interventions provided to patients with chronic conditions and the clinical and health status outcomes resulting from those interventions if so are these effects quantitatively and clinically significant as compared to the effects that other variables e g income education ethnicity have on patient outcomes if the type of health care delivery system appears to be related to patient care and outcomes can specific organizational financial or other variables be identified that account for the relationships if not what type of research should be pursued to provide the information needed about the relationship between types of health care systems and the processes and outcomes of care provided to people with serious chronic conditions

the new edition of the child as musician a handbook of musical development celebrates the richness and diversity of the many different ways in which children can engage in and interact with music it presents theory both cutting edge and classic in an accessible way for readers by surveying research concerned with the development and acquisition of musical skills the focus is on musical development from conception to late adolescences although the bulk of the coverage concentrates on the period when children are able to begin formal music instruction from around age 3 until the final year of formal schooling around age 18 there are many conceptions of how musical development might take place just as there are for other disciplines and areas of human potential consequently the publication highlights the diversity in current literature dealing with how we think about and conceptualise children s musical development each of the authors has searched for a better and more effective way to explain in their own words and according to their own perspective the remarkable ways in which children engage with music in the field of educational psychology there are a number of publications that survey the issues surrounding child and adolescent development some of the more innovative present research and theories and their educational implications in a style that stresses the fundamental interplay among the biological environmental social and cultural influences at each stage of a child s development until now no similar overview has existed for child and adolescent development in the field of music the child as musician addresses this imbalance and is essential for those in the fields of child development music education and music cognition
