the late russian discoveries between asia and america have for some time engaged the attention of the curious more especially since dr robertson s admirable history of america has been in the hands of the public in that valuable performance the elegant and ingenious author has communicated to the world with an accuracy and judgement which so eminently distinguish all his writings the most exact information at that time to be obtained concerning those important discoveries during my stay at petersburg my inquiries were particularly directed to this interesting subject in order to learn if any new light had been thrown on an article of knowledge of such consequence to the history of mankind for this purpose i endeavoured to collect the respective journals of the several voyages subsequent to the expedition of beering and tschirikoff in 1741 with which the celebrated muller concludes his account of the first russian navigations during the course of my researches i was informed that a treatise in the german language published at hamburg and leipsic in 1776 contained a full and exact narrative of the russian voyages from 1745 to 1770

in the wake of the ussr s collapse more than 25 million russians found themselves living outside russian territory their status ambiguous this volume prepared under the sponsorship of the kennan institute offers a comprehensive and amply documented examination of the issue

at its height the russian empire covered eleven time zones and stretched from scandinavia to the pacific ocean arguing against the traditional historical view that russia surrounded and threatened by enemies was always on the defensive john p ledonne contends that russia developed a long term strategy not in response to immediate threats but in line with its own expansionist urges to control the eurasian heartland ledonne narrates how the government from moscow and petersburg expanded the empire by deploying its army as well as by extending its patronage to frontier societies in return for their serving the interests of the empire he considers three theaters on which the russians expanded the western baltic germany poland the southern ottoman and persian empires and

the eastern china siberia central asia in his analysis of military power he weighs the role of geography and locale as well as economic issues in the evolution of a larger imperial strategy rather than viewing russia as peripheral to european great power politics ledonne makes a powerful case for russia as an expansionist militaristic and authoritarian regime that challenged the great states and empires of its time

this paper contains three case studies about winter warfare drawn from twentieth century experience it provides several valuable perspectives about this well known but sometimes little understood subject our attention is directed to the distinctive aspects of warfare in subarctic climes the characteristics of this harsh environment and the climatic impact upon a broad range of military operations these case studies also provide examples of how several armies adapted or failed to adapt to the demands of winter warfare finally they demonstrate that even military forces indigenous to subarctic regions with experienced soldiers can have difficulty in conducting winter operations

presenting original research from a number of well known international specialists this book is a detailed investigation of the development of mass media in russia since the end of communism and the collapse of the soviet union

since the nineteenth century ethnic koreans have represented a small yet significant portion of the population of the russian far east but until now the phenomenon has been largely understudied based on extensive historical and ethnographic research this is the first book in english to chart the contemporary social life of koreans in the complex borderland region dispelling the commonly held notion that koreans were completely removed from the region during the country s attempt to cleanse its borders in 1937 hyun gwi park reveals timely new insights into the historical and current experiences of koreans living along the eurasian frontier

the central motif of this unique historical memoir is the life of the authors family in dairen now dalian during the japanese occupation then the soviet occupation and finally under the chinese communist government ms erohina gave the background of the historical events which affected the lives of the russians the chinese and the japanese during the second world war and the postwar years she explains why the russians lived in china and how they not only preserved their culture and language but contributed greatly to the fields of science music and literature some lived there at the turn of the 20th century as businessmen and many came to manchuria now northeast of the peoples republic of china during the railway construction which was a branch of the trans siberian railroad the majority however came as refugees fleeing from the bolsheviks during the civil war that immediately followed the bolshevik revolution of 1917 the civil war split the people into the reds or the bolsheviks and the whites who opposed them the authors grandparents were among the refugees ms erohina described her familys move to shanghai in 1954 as a transit point for the departure from china and gave a detailed account of its early and postwar years and its impact on the lives of russian migrants then followed the familys journey as refugees by sea from china via hong kong and many ports from singapore to south africa and then to brazil she touched upon their life in sao paulo brazil in 1950s and then their trip to the united states in 1958 where the family finally settled author tatiana erohina is a retired college language instructor she was born and raised in ne china lived in brazil and came to this country in 1958 she has an m a in literature from ohio state university when she retired she wrote her unique historical memoir growing up russian in china she lives in southern california
