this volume assembles a range of writers from diverse backgrounds and geographies to examine five broadly defined areas in elementary education foundational issues social and sexual development curriculum the family and gay lesbian educators and their allies

queering elementary education is not about teaching kids to be gay lesbian bisexual or straight itos not part of a sinister stratagem in the ogay agenda o instead these provocative and thoughtful essays advocate the creation of classrooms that challenge categorical thinking promote interpersonal intelligence and foster critical consciousness queer elementary classrooms are those where parents and educators care enough about their children to trust the human capacity for understanding and their educative abilities to foster insight into the human condition those who teach queerly refuse to participate in the great sexual sorting machine called schooling where diminutive gi joes and barbies become star quarterbacks and prom queens while the linuses and tinkly winkies become wallflowers or human doormats queeering education means bracketing our simplest classroom activities in which we routinely equate sexual identities with sexual acts privilege the heterosexual condition and presume sexual destinies queer teachers are those who develop curriculum and pedagogy that afford every child dignity rooted in self worth and esteem for others in short queering education happens when we look at schooling upside down and view childhood from the inside out this groundbreaking volume demands we explore taken for granted assumptions about diversity identities childhood and prejudice

this book blends multiple research studies historical and current events reflective teaching examples and guidance for lgbtq inclusion and queer pedagogy in elementary

schools it is divided into three sections to guide the readers from a broad understanding of the histories of lgbtq discriminations rights and some communities resistance to lgbtq children teachers and curriculum to a focused invitation into the author s own reflections teaching and discussions with children about lgbtq literature and topics the volume provides histories theoretical and methodological inquiry resources and encouragement for teacher researchers ready to engage lgbtq inclusion and queer literacy pedagogy in their classrooms schools and communities

rethinking sexual identity in education responds to the wide spread abuse of lesbian gay bisexual transgender and questioning persons lgbtqs in diverse educational environments by utilizing published narratives of lgbtqs educational experiences conceptualizing a praxis for lgbtq allies to use in teaching and learning about sexual identity in ways that can transform educational practices and policies this work bridges gaps between theory and practice liberal and postmodern thought invention and intervention visit our website for sample chapters

queer inclusion in teacher education explores the challenges and promises of building queer inclusive pedagogy and curriculum into teacher education weaving together theory research findings and practical how to strategies and materials it fills an important gap by offering a clear roadmap and resources for influencing the knowledge beliefs and actions of faculty working with pre service teachers while the book has implications for policy change most immediately readers will feel empowered with ideas for faculty development they can implement in their own teacher education programs looking at both the politics and practices of teacher education and the ways in which queer issues manifest in schools it is hopeful in suggesting that if teachers and pre service teachers can critically reflect on homophobia and heteronormativity they can begin to think about and relate to queer youth in a different more positive and inclusive way a companion website [queerinclude.com](http://queerinclude.com) with additional activities and materials for teacher educators and faculty development and a practical guide enhances the usefulness of the book

written for entry level survey courses in queer or lgbtq studies for students from all majors this engaging text covers a wide range of topics early chapters consider the meaning of queer and examine identities such as trans bi and intersex intersections between sexuality gender expression and other identities such as race ethnicity and class are also examined the book then reviews life experiences such as families friendship religion and spirituality health and politics through the lens of queerness queer studies beyond binaries engages undergraduates with a narrative that applies key ideas to their own lives and experiences questions various binaries either or pairings to help students examine their own sexual identity and gender expression reviews foundational concepts from queer theory and queer history to create a deeper

understanding of the concepts emphasizes an intersectionality approach that demonstrates how one's identity is the product of multiple characteristics such as sexuality gender race class and disability uses a multidisciplinary approach drawing from the social and natural sciences humanities and arts to provide a broad overview of perspectives details an individual or an event in spotlight on sections to highlight the experiences of queer people provides questions for class discussion or field activities in issues for investigation sections that apply the ideas covered in the chapter allows instructors to shape the class with different foci using the stand alone chapters in part iii features an instructor's resource manual available to adopters with 20 powerpoint slides for each chapter sample syllabi for a variety of courses teaching tips for using the spotlight on and issues for investigation sections and the suggested readings a test bank with objective and essay questions and student aids such as keywords chapter outlines and summaries and learning objectives designed for undergraduate courses in queer or lgbt studies requiring no prerequisites queer studies beyond binaries also serves as an excellent supplement in courses on queer theory or history or on sexuality gender and women's studies

queer studies and education an international reader explores how the category queer as a critical stance or set of perspectives contributes to opportunities individually and collectively for advancing queer social justice within the context and concerns of schooling and education the collection takes up this general goal by presenting a cross section of international perspectives on queer studies in education collectively the chapters critically engage with heteronormativity and normativity more generally as a political spectrum over a broad range of formal and informal sites of education and against a backdrop of critiques of liberalism and neoliberalism as the frameworks through which achievable social change and belonging are fostered particularly within educational settings

based on a qualitative research study of gay and lesbian teachers unmasking identities explores how gay and lesbian teachers bring together their identities in a climate where the two have historically been pitted against each other janna marie jackson demonstrates that participants made direct and indirect connections between their experiences related to being gay or lesbian and their classroom practices of promoting social justice and building on students understandings this process of integrating their sexual identities with their roles as teachers was facilitated and inhibited by several factors including the community atmosphere school culture and family status this unique book explores what happens when identities are oppressed and suppressed and the consequences when they finally break free unmasking identities provides theoretical understandings and practical advice for teachers administrators and policy makers who are concerned about gay and lesbian issues this engaging text will appeal to those interested in gender studies and issues in education

this volume explores education in the deep south with a focus on lgbtq students and educators and on queer theoretical perspectives in education the topics in this volume include teaching lgbtq issues and queer studies in the deep south educational policy and practice in the deep south as related to queer issues and efforts to introduce queer literature to libraries and queer collections to archives authors in this volume examine what realities exist in education in the u s south currently and what possibilities might be imagined in the future

lgbtq voices in education changing the culture of schooling addresses the ways in which teachers can meet the needs of lgbtq students and improve the culture surrounding gender sexuality and identity issues in formal learning environments written by experts from a variety of backgrounds including educational foundations leadership cultural studies literacy criminology theology media assessment and more these chapters are designed to help educators find the inspiration and support they need to become allies and advocates of queer students whose safety well being and academic performance are regularly and often systemically threatened emphasizing socially just curricula supportive school climates and transformative educational practices this innovative book is applicable to k 12 college level and graduate settings and beyond

this book explores the narratives and experiences of lgbtq and gender non conforming students around the world much previous research has focused on homophobic transphobic bullying and the negative consequences of expressing non heterosexual and non gender conforming identities in school environments to date less attention has been paid to what may help lgbtq students to experience school more positively and relatively little has been done to compare research across the global contexts this book addresses these research gaps by bringing together ongoing research from countries including brazil china south africa the uk and many more each chapter examines results of empirical research into school experiences of lgbtq students and the experiences and perspectives of teachers and parents all contributions are theoretically

informed by aspects of queer theory and or critical feminist theory with additional insights from psychological sociological and linguistic perspectives contributing chapters consider how educational workers may question socially sanctioned concepts of normality in relation to gender and sexuality in ways that benefit all students and how they can queer schools to make them less oppressive in terms of gender and sexuality expertly written and researched this book is an invaluable resource for researchers policymakers and students in the fields of education sociology gender studies and anyone with an interest in gender and sexuality studies

written by teachers and teacher educators this book presents practice focused ideas and provocative questions to help teachers plan for inclusive curriculum and assessment within key learning areas in school education providing content on specific disciplines including geography history mathematics science english and the arts this book supports teachers with hands on examples for creating inclusive assessment practices in schools there are additional sections on interdisciplinary perspectives delivering practical strategies for assessing students who use english as an additional language being inclusive in relation to gender and sexual diversity using a variety of technologies to promote inclusivity and applying inclusive assessment in rural regional and remote contexts each chapter is designed around problems encountered by teachers practical responses and recommendations for practice the authors address australian indigenous perspectives gender and diversity rural and remote school systems and translanguaging for multicultural contexts engaging and easy to read this book is essential reading for pre and in service teachers seeking to make an impactful contribution to inclusive education in their classrooms

argues that significant barriers to family making exist for lesbian mothers of color in the united states one might be tempted in the afterglow of obergefell v hodge to believe that the battle has been won that gays and lesbians fought a tough fight and finally achieved equality in the united states through access to legal marriage but that narrative tells only one version of a very complex story about family and citizenship queering family trees explores the lived experience of queer mothers in the united states drawing on over one hundred interviews with african american latina native american white and asian american lesbian mothers living in a range of socioeconomic circumstances to show how they have navigated family making while the legalization of same sex marriage and adoption in 2015 has provided avenues toward equality for some couples structural and economic barriers have meant that others especially queer women of color who often have fewer financial resources have not been able to access seemingly available choices such as second parent adoptions powers of attorney and wills sandra patton imani here argues that the virtual exclusion of lesbians of color from public narratives about lgbtq families is crucial to maintaining the narrative that legal marriage for same sex couples provides access to full equality as citizens through the lens of reproductive justice patton imani argues that the federal legalization of same sex marriage reinforces existing structures of inequality grounded in race gender sexuality and class queering family trees explores the lives of a critically erased segment of the queer population demonstrating that the seemingly color blind solutions offered by marriage equality do not rectify such inequalities

this book engages with the concept queer battle fatigue which is the everyday exhaustion that lgbtqia people and communities often experience from anti queer norms and values contributors express how this concept is often experienced across spaces and places from schools to communities queer battle fatigue is one way to express the everyday exhaustion that lgbtqia people and communities often feel that is a result sociopolitical and cultural anti queer norms and values in this volume contributors think about how queer battle fatigue hits bodies and their multiple ways of being knowing and doing chapters describe how such violence flows from early childhood experiences to universities and across community spaces contributors also describe how people and communities resist and refuse anti queer norms and values carving out pathways to live love and have joy despite everyday oppressions from calling on black queer ancestors to using stem education as a safe space to artistic representations of identities the chapters in queer battle fatigue ask readers to consider how to disrupt and deconstruct anti queer norms while also engaging in the many beautiful forms of queer joy as an act of resistance queer battle fatigue will be a key resource for academics researchers and advanced students of education qualitative research queer theory and gender studies educational research and curriculum studies the chapters included in this book were originally published as a special issue of international journal of qualitative studies in education

this handbook explores the discourse within the field of educational leadership and management it provides a clear analysis of the current field as well as older foundational ideas and newer concepts which are beginning to permeate the discussion the field of educational leadership and management has long acknowledged that educational contexts include a variety of leaders beyond school principals and other school officials such as informal and middle level leaders by looking at the knowledge dynamic rather than a static knowledge base this handbook allows research to be presented in its multidimensional evolving reality
