sir gawain and the green knight is a great poem that gives some powerful twists to traditional materials the story combines two ancient elements beheading and seduction in a fresh and remarkable way it takes familiar medieval themes the feast the seasons the arming of the warrior the hunt and gives them a new glamor the intertextuality of this brilliant poem can be most clearly seen through elisabeth brewer s modern english versions of other related medieval writings her book is a delightful and unusual small anthology of medieval literature but its greatest success lies in providing a context for a fuller understanding of sir gawain through its presentation of extracts and poems including translations from celtic and french originals illustrating the tradition in which the gawain poet wrote underscoring his own great achievement from publisher s description

sir gawain and the green knight is a masterpiece of medieval english literature and one of the finest arthurian tales in any language though its ingenious plotting and verbal artistry continue to dazzle readers it is written in a challenging regional dialect and uses many words that were already archaic when the poem was written in the late fourteenth century this edition is designed to make the poem in its original middle english accessible to students and general readers following standards adopted for editing other middle english poets the edition lightly normalizes spellings to make words more recognizable for a modern audience extensive marginal

glossing of difficult words thorough on page explanatory notes and a comprehensive glossary offer further support for readers the historical appendices include other examples of medieval romance from france and britain

this book examines key points of j r r tolkien s life and writing career in relation to his views on humanism and feminism particularly his sympathy for and toleration of those who are different deemed unimportant or marginalized namely the other jane chance argues such empathy derived from a variety of causes ranging from the loss of his parents during his early life to a consciousness of the injustice and violence in both world wars as a result of his obligation to research and publish in his field and propelled by his sense of abjection and diminution of self tolkien concealed aspects of the personal in relatively consistent ways in his medieval adaptations lectures essays and translations many only recently published these scholarly writings blend with and relate to his fictional writings in various ways depending on the moment at which he began teaching translating or editing a specific medieval work and simultaneously composing a specific poem fantasy or fairy story what tolkien read and studied from the time before and during his college days at exeter and continued researching until he died opens a door into understanding how he uniquely interpreted and repurposed the medieval in constructing fantasy

the different cultures from which the middle ages drew its inspiration are represented cu cuchulainn from the celtic world apollonius of tyre from greek romance attila the hun and theodoric the ostrogoth from the struggle of the roman empire against the barbarians each entry gives an outline of the story how it spread through europe its modern retelling and appearances in art and a selective bibliography jacket

this teaching anthology collects texts from the vast archive of medieval arthurian literature it includes selections from mainstream canonical authors such as geoffrey of monmouth and malory and more peripheral works such as the melech artus a 12th century hebrew text and the dutch morien featuring a black knight characters and authors showcase the diversity of race religion gender and gender orientation of the arthurian tradition the anthology and its accompanying website offer a variety of genres ranging from visual art to historical chronicles and from romance to drama arthurian works while concentrated in england france and

wales are found across medieval europe and thus this anthology includes texts from iceland to greece the broadview anthology of medieval arthurian literature is ideally suited to teaching it includes full texts such as chrétien de troyes knight of the cart chaucer s wife of bath s tale and the anonymous sir gawain and the green knight for classes that wish to study a whole work in depth it also includes shorter excerpts of parallel incidents such as the uthur and igraine story so that students can compare a story s treatment by different authors marginal glosses assist students with the middle english texts while introductory notes and explanatory footnotes give students necessary background information

this book argues that the traditional relationship between the act of confessing and the act of remembering is manifested through the widespread juxtaposition of confession and memory in middle english literary texts and furthermore that this concept permeates other manifestations of memory as written by authors in a variety of genres this study through the framework of confession identifies moments of recollection within the texts of four major middle english authors langland chaucer gower and the gawain poet and demonstrates that these authors deliberately employed the devices of recollection and forgetfulness in order to indicate changes or the lack thereof both in conduct and in mindset in their narrative subjects memory and confession in middle english literature explores memory s connection to confession along with the recurring textual awareness of confession s ability to transform the soul demonstrating that memory and recollection is used in medieval literature to emphasize emotional and behavioral change

this volume is an attempt to discuss the ways in which themes of authority and gender can be traced in the writing of chronicles and chronicle like writings from the early middle ages to the renaissance with major contributions by fourteen authors each of them specialists in the field this study spans full across the compass of medieval and early modern europe from england and scandinavia to byzantium and the crusader kingdoms embraces a variety of media and methods and touches evidence from diverse branches of learning such as language and literature history and art to name just a few this is an important collection which will be of the highest utility for students and scholars of language literature and history for many years to come

this is a comprehensive guide to a literary period characterized by great variety and imagination and vividly alert to the social transformations overtaking society spanning almost two centuries it introduces the reader to a diverse range of authors writing for a fast developing readership of both men and women each chapter focuses on a group of genres primarily associated with a particular social class from the drama and saints lives accessible to the illiterate to the sophisticated romances of love savoured by the aristocracy and the court lively

historical narratives place each group of texts in their social political and cultural contexts significant or typical texts are given more detailed analysis that includes critical issues and questions to guide the reader's own approach and each section is supported by a detailed bibliography of further reading

eleanor johnson corrects some commonly held mis assumptions concerning what the average medieval english person might've thought about what we now call the natural environment or the ecosystem reading both well studied fourteenth and fifteenth century works sir gawain and the green knight pearl and the canterbury tales and lesser known ones winner and waster and mum and the sothsegger as well as legal and municipal documents sermons moral and penitential tracts practical and medical guides plague narratives and historical chronicles from the period johnson describes how poets used the resources of poetic language meter rhyme alliteration metaphor simile personification characterization plot dramatic staging repetition and other literary devices to think and feel their way into the problems of ecological peril even though they lacked the science and scientific vocabulary we have today johnson explores how these writers combined multiple discourses from their particular if narrow vantage point to comment on ecological disasters inventing their own ecosystemic language and commentary as johnson reminds us the english middle ages had their share of environmental problems air pollution soil depletion deforestation little ice ages famines and plagues similar to the ones we face in the twenty first century focusing on the word waste in its original usage across various texts ranging from the literary to the legal from the theological to the psychological johnson puts twenty first century concerned citizens in touch with kindred spirits in medieval england fully aware of and interested in how human mis behavior might be connected to the natural world how resource allocation use and pollution by one person might affect another how environmental damage was linked to urbanization and how one person's choices might affect the next generation the book will be read primarily by those interested in medieval english literature medieval historians and literary scholars working in later periods but johnson also invites conversation with anyone working more broadly in the environmental humanities today

this distinctive comparison of islamic and christian mysticism focuses on the mystic journey in the two faith traditions the journey which every believer must make and which leads to the divine the author clears away misconceptions and highlights similarities and differences in the thought and lives of six key mystics al

kalabadhi al daylami al qushayri julian of norwich thomas a kempis and teresa of avila he considers the ways of perfection on the mystic path and asks in what ways these authors have embarked on the mystic journey he looks at the themes they have in common as well as their differences and asks how they envisage the concept of union with the deity readers will gain a broad understanding of the interdisciplinary and intertextual nature of the subject as well its the diverse intellectual and historical contexts

ecopoetics and the global landscape critical essays surveys ecopoetry from a global perspective across different historical epochs its comparative approach foregrounds the importance of ecopoetics within the context of distinct national literatures and cultures to reveal the ubiquitous intersection of poetry with ecocriticism the collection analyzes environmental problems resulting from the legacies of colonialism and focuses on issues of environmental justice and indigenous issues as well as on the intersection of genocide studies and environmentalism it also examines ecologically informed modes of relating to the world in particular it engages with interactions between the human and nonhuman as well as mind and matter finally it broadens the scope of place to include both the absent land of exiled peoples and the urban built environment

did king arthur really exist the oldest manuscripts refer to him as a lord of battle who emerged soon after the roman empire crumbled but what would be the origin of all these stories that turned a war leader into a king an emperor a legend even a god what if arthur was really a deity similar to zeus and odin with his roots in the rich celtic mythology of the british isles a study of arthurian myths reveals britain s most legendary king as an ancient sun god known by many different names in the myths of wales and ireland even his knights of the round table and his sister morgan le fay can all be identified as ancient gods and goddesses of earth sea and sky their survival in arthurian legend stands as a shining testament of a story far more ancient but by no means lost to us

richard newhauser examines here aspects of the moral tradition of medieval thought specifically the construction of the seven deadly sins their offspring and related schematizations of immorality in the latin west the emphasis in these studies is on the malleability of moral categories their relationship to changes in medieval culture and the creativity and sensitivity of the thinkers who made use of the concepts of sinfulness in

the middle ages the first section examines the contexts in which the seven deadly sins or nine accessory sins are found in medieval latin english and german texts and in particular the genre of the treatise on vices and virtues as the major vehicle in which concepts of immorality were examined and presented to a variety of audiences for meditative or pastoral purposes the second section deals with one of the more interesting of the seven deadly sins avarice in its penitential literary apocalyptic and institutional contexts as its definition changed slowly with developing commercial experiences in medieval europe in the last section the breadth of the concept of a sinful curiosity is examined and its historical development is delineated in the thought of augustine of hippo and the early cistercians

the 23rd volume of arthurian literature continues the tradition of the journal combining critical studies with editions of primary arthurian texts

first published in 1998 this valuable reference work offers concise expert answers to questions on all aspects of life and culture in medieval england including art architecture law literature kings women music commerce technology warfare and religion this wide ranging text encompasses english social cultural and political life from the anglo saxon invasions in the fifth century to the turn of the sixteenth century as well as its ties to the celtic world of wales scotland and ireland the french and anglo norman world of the continent and the viking and scandinavian world of the north sea a range of topics are discussed from sedulius to skelton from wulfstan
