for the first time in the history of our planet more than half the population 3 3 billion people is now living in cities city

historical readings of memorials both well known and obscure two distinct strands of scholarship are thus brought together the study of the everyday and memory studies from the introduction of modern memorials in the wake of the french revolution through the recent destruction of confederate monuments memorials have oscillated between the everyday and the not everyday in fact memorials have been implicated in the very structure of these categories the everyday life of memorials explores how memorials end up where they are grow invisible fight with traffic get moved are assembled into memorial zones and are drawn anew into commemorations and political maelstroms that their original sponsors never could have imagined finally exploring how people behave at memorials and what memorials ask of people reveals just how strange the commemorative infrastructure of modernity is
