in the american south a history fourth edition william j cooper jr and thomas e terrill demonstrate their belief that it is impossible to divorce the history of the south from the history of the united states the authors analysis underscores the complex interaction between the south as a distinct region and the south as an inescapable part of america cooper and terrill show how the resulting tension has often propelled section and nation toward collision in supporting their thesis the authors draw on the tremendous amount of profoundly new scholarship in southern history each volume includes a substantial biographical essay completely updated for this edition which provides the reader with a guide to literature on the history of the south coverage now includes the devastation of hurricane katrina in 2005 up to date analysis of the persistent racial divisions in the region and the south s unanticipated role in the 2008 presidential primaries

in the south today the sight of a latina in a nascar t shirt behind the register at an asian grocery would hardly draw a second glance that scenario and our likely reaction to it surely signals something important but what here some of the region s most respected and readable observers look across the past century to help us take stock of where the south is now and where it may be headed reflecting the writers deep interests in southern history politics literature religion and other matters the essays engage in new ways some timeless concerns about the region how has the south changed or not changed has the south as a distinct region disappeared or has it absorbed the many forces of change and still retained its cultural and social distinctiveness although the essays touch on an engaging diversity of topics including the usda's crop spraying policies tom wolfe's novel a man in full and collegiate women's soccer they ultimately cluster around a common set of themes these include race segregation and the fall of jim crow gender cultural distinctiveness and identity modernization education and urbanization mindful of the south's reputation for insularity the essays also gauge the impact of federal assistance relocated industries immigration and other outside influences as one contributor writes and as all would acknowledge those who undertake a project like this should bear in mind that they are tracking a target moving constantly but often erratically the rewards of pondering a place as elusive complex and contradictory as the american south are on full display here

this new edition of southern writers assumes its distinguished predecessor s place as the essential reference on literary artists of the american south broadly expanded and thoroughly revised it boasts 604 entries nearly double the earlier edition s written by 264 scholars for every figure major and minor from the venerable and canonical to the fresh and innovative a biographical sketch and chronological list of published works provide comprehensive concise up to date information here in one convenient source are the south s novelists and short story writers poets and dramatists memoirists and essayists journalists scholars and

biographers from the colonial period to the twenty first century what constitutes a southern writer is always a matter for debate editors joseph m flora and amber vogel have used a generous definition that turns on having a significant connection to the region in either a personal or literary sense new to this volume are younger writers who have emerged in the quarter century since the dictionary s original publication as well as older talents previously unknown or unacknowledged for almost every writer found in the previous edition a new biography has been commissioned drawn from the very best minds on southern literature and covering the full spectrum of its practitioners southern writers is an indispensable reference book for anyone intrigued by the subject

traveling south is the first major study of how narratives of travel through the antebellum south helped construct an american national identity during the years between the revolutionary war and the civil war john cox makes his case on the basis of a broad range of texts that includes slave narratives domestic literature and soldiers diaries as well as more traditional forms of travel writing in the process he extends the boundaries of travel literature both as a genre and as a subject of academic study the writers of these intranational accounts struggled with the significance of travel through a region that was both america and other in writings by i hector st john de crèvecoeur and william bartram for example the narrators create personal identities and express their americanness through travel that cox argues becomes a defining aspect of the young nation in the narratives of frederick douglass and solomon northup the complex relationship between travel and slavery highlights contemporary debates over the meaning of space and movement both fanny kemble and harriet jacobs explore the intimate linkings of women s travel and the construction of an ideal domestic space whereas frederick law olmsted seeks through his travel writing to reform the southern economy and expand a new england yeoman ideology throughout the nation the civil war diaries of union soldiers written during the years that witnessed the largest movement of travelers through the south echo earlier themes while concluding that the south should not be transformed in order to become sufficiently american rather it was and should remain a part of the american nation regardless of perceived differences

written in a clear accessible and lively style souvenirs of the old south will be the foundational work for subsequent scholars and readers interested in tourism in the new south w fitzhugh brundage author of the southern past a clash of race and memory this study of southern images offers readers a glimpse of how history culture race and class came together in the tourist imagination if the south emerged from the civil war a distinctive place rebecca mcintyre would remind us that s because distinctiveness sells richard starnes author of creating the land of the sky tourism and society in western north carolina less than a decade after the conclusion of the civil war northern promoters began pushing images of a mythic south to boost tourism by creating a hierarchical relationship based on region and race in which northerners were always superior promoters saw tourist dollars begin flowing southward but this cultural construction was damaging to southerners particularly african americans rebecca mcintyre focuses on the years between 1870 and 1920 a period framed by the war and the growth of automobile tourism these years were critical in the creation of the south s modern identity and she reveals that tourism images created by northerners for northerners had

as much effect on making the south southern as did the most ardent proponents of the lost cause she also demonstrates how northern tourism contributed to the worsening of race relations in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries

southern slaveholders proudly pronounced themselves orthodox christians who accepted responsibility for the welfare of the people who worked for them they proclaimed that their slaves enjoyed a better and more secure life than any laboring class in the world now did it not follow that the lives of laborers of all races across the world would be immeasurably improved by their enslavement in the old south but in no other slave society a doctrine emerged among leading clergymen politicians and intellectuals slavery in the abstract which declared enslavement the best possible condition for all labor regardless of race they joined the socialists whom they studied in believing that the free labor system wracked by worsening class warfare was collapsing a vital question to what extent did the people of the several social classes of the south accept so extreme a doctrine that question lies at the heart of this book

concentrates on diehard rebel soldiers faith in confederate invincibility and reveals the history of southern culture as a continuum rather than a succession of old south confederacy new south

much of what is known today of georgia history was preserved through the diligent efforts of a single family from wormsloe their ancestral plantation near savannah the de rennes built an extraordinary collection of books and manuscripts on the history of the state and the confederacy much of which is now housed at the university of georgia and the museum of the confederacy this book focuses on their efforts in the years 1827 through 1970 conveying the passion and purpose with which they pursued their avocation william harris bragg has mined a vast array of archival sources to present this engaging narrative of the de renne family he tells how wealthy bibliophile and philanthropist g w j de renne and his wife mary set the

precedent for the family s accumulation of historic material how their son established the wymberley jones de renne georgia library that bears his name and how his children in turn expanded upon that tradition the de rennes also printed limited editions of primary historical materials beginning with the series known as the wormsloe quartos bragg s account of three generations of the de renne family vividly records their achievements as it reconstructs their life at wormsloe and follows them in their travels around the world it provides glimpses into the dynamics and behavior of one of georgia s oldest and most prominent families and the evolution of the southern aristocracy the book draws on newly available material to expand significantly on ellis merton coulter s 1955 work wormsloe and provides the most complete account to date of the de rennes beyond the story of the de renne family bragg also reveals much about the history of collecting and of the antiquarian book trade as well as of the evolution of georgia historical documentation appendix material includes genealogical tables and lists of collections and publications making de renne three generations of a georgia family an invaluable source for all scholars and aficionados of southern history

in some places the ku klux klan kkk was a social fraternity whose members enjoyed sophomoric hijinks and homemade liquor in other areas the kkk was a paramilitary group intent on keeping former slaves away from white women and republicans away from ballot boxes south carolina saw the worst klan violence and in 1871 president grant sent federal troops under the command of major lewis merrill to restore law and order merrill did not eradicate the klan but they arguably did more than any other person or entity to expose the identity of the invisible empire as a group of hooded brutish homegrown terrorists in compiling evidence to prosecute the leading klansmen and by restoring at least a semblance of order to south carolina merrill and his men demonstrated that the portrayal of the kkk as a chivalric organization was at best a myth and at worst a lie this is the story of the rise and fall of the reconstruction era klan focusing especially on major merrill and the seventh cavalry s efforts to expose the secrets of the ku klux klan to the light of day

spirits of just men tells the story of moonshine in 1930s america as seen through the remarkable location of franklin county virginia a place that many still refer to as the moonshine capital of the world charles d thompson jr chronicles the great moonshine conspiracy trial of 1935 which made national news and exposed the far reaching and pervasive tendrils of appalachia s local moonshine economy thompson whose ancestors were involved in the area s moonshine trade and trial as well as local law enforcement uses the event as a stepping off point to explore blue ridge mountain culture economy and political engagement in the 1930s drawing from extensive oral histories and local archival material he illustrates how the moonshine trade was a rational and savvy choice for struggling farmers and community members during the great depression local characters come alive through this richly colorful narrative including the stories of miss ora harrison a key witness for the defense and an episcopalian missionary to the region and elder goode hash an itinerant primitive baptist preacher and juror in a related murder trial considering the complex interactions of religion economics local history appalachian culture and immigration thompson s sensitive analysis examines the people and processes involved in turning a basic agricultural commodity into such a sought

after and essentially american spirit

placing class rather than race or gender at the center of this comparative study of north and south kilbride exposes the close connections that united privileged southerners and philadelphians in the years leading to the civil war he finds that the bonds between these similarly educated and socialized groups to be so durable that they resisted sectional warfare kilbride notes that southern planters were drawn particularly to philadelphia because of its proximity to the south and perception of the city as being untainted by northern radicalism in addition philadelphia possessed well regarded schools prestigious intellectual societies historical landmarks and fashionable shopping districts in the city s parlors ballrooms and classrooms privileged northerners and southerners forged a republican aristocracy that ignored the mason dixon line

selected as an outstanding academic title by choice selected as an outstanding reference source by the reference and user services association of the american library association there are many anthologies of southern literature but this is the first companion neither a survey of masterpieces nor a biographical sourcebook the companion to southern literature treats every conceivable topic found in southern writing from the pre columbian era to the present referencing specific works of all periods and genres top scholars in their fields offer original definitions and examples of the concepts they know best identifying the themes burning issues historical personalities beloved icons and common or uncommon stereotypes that have shaped the most significant regional literature in memory read the copious offerings straight through in alphabetical order ancestor worship blue collar literature caves or skip randomly at whim guilt the grotesque william jefferson clinton whatever approach you take the companion s authority scope and variety in tone and interpretation will prove a boon and a delight explored here are literary embodiments of the old south new south solid south savage south lazy south and sahara of the bozart as up to date as grit lit k mart fiction and postmodernism and as old fashioned as puritanism mules and the tall tale these five hundred entries span a reach from lady to lesbian literature the volume includes an overview of every southern state s belletristic heritage while making it clear that the southern mind extends beyond geographical boundaries to form an essential component of the american psyche the south's lavishly rich literature provides the best means of understanding the region s deepest nature and the companion to southern literature will be an invaluable tool for those who take on that exciting challenge description of contents 500 lively succinct articles on topics ranging from abolition to yoknapatawpha 250 contributors including scholars writers and poets 2 tables of contents alphabetical and subject and a complete index a separate bibliography for most entries

as a city of the upper south intimately connected to the northeastern cities the southern slave trade and the virginia countryside richmond embodied many of the contradictions of mid nineteenth century america gregg d kimball expands the usual scope of urban studies by depicting the richmond community as a series of dynamic overlapping networks to show how various groups of richmonders understood themselves and their society drawing on a wealth of archival material and private letters kimball elicits new perspectives regarding people s sense of identity kimball first situates the city and its residents within the larger american

culture and virginia countryside especially noting the influence of plantation society and culture on richmond s upper classes kimball then explores four significant groups of richmonders merchant families the city s largest black church congregation ironworkers and militia volunteers he describes the cultural world in which each group moved and shows how their perceptions were shaped by connections to and travels within larger economic cultural and ethnic spheres ironically the merchant class s firsthand knowledge of the north confirmed and intensified their southernness while the experience of urban african americans and workers promoted a more expansive sense of community this insightful work ultimately reveals how richmonders self perceptions influenced the decisions they made during the sectional crisis the civil war and reconstruction showing that people made rational choices about their allegiances based on established beliefs american city southern place is an important work of social history that sheds new light on cultural identity and opens a new window on nineteenth century richmond

the new south replete with shopping malls hub airports educated african americans and immigrants from vietnam cambodia and haiti is still haunted by the gothic ghosts of its past does the collision between past and present account for the continued preeminence of southern writers in america's literary culture bobbie ann mason ernest gaines rita mae brown robert olen butler cormac mccarthy dorothy allison and allan gurganus are just a few of the writers who draw on a new kind of southern background while reaching out to a broad american readership yet many of these writers have been accused of catering to the stereotypes they think a national audience requires it would seem that questions of southern identity continue to be bound up with rage against attacks on southern culture jefferson humphries and john lowe have assembled a remarkable team of scholars and writers to examine aspects of the contemporary literature of the south from pulitzer prize winning writer fred hobson to esteemed scholar james olney to poets kate daniels and brenda marie osbey the contributors try to define southern culture today and ask who will be writing southern literature tomorrow addressing topics such as humor the past black autobiography ethnicity and female oral traditions the essays form a volume that is of interest to readers of southern literature and history creative writers and scholars and students of southern culture
