this study in johannine ecclesiology reconstructs the history of one christian community in the first century a community whose life from its inception to its last hour is reflected in the gospel and epistles of john it was a community that

struggled with the world with the jews and with other christians eventually the struggle spread even to its own ranks it was in short a community not unlike the church of today this book offers a different view of the traditional johannine eagle in the gospel the eagle soars above the earth but with talons bared for the fray in the epistles we discover the eaglets tearing at each other for possession of the nest back cover

how do historical and literary details contribute to a coherent theological witness to jesus in the gospel of john a leading british evangelical new testament scholar answers that question with studies on themes from messianism to monotheism symbolic actions from foot washing to fish catching literary contexts from qumran to the hellenistic historians and figures from nicodemus to the beloved disciple to papias originally published in various journals and collections these essays are now available for the first time in one affordable volume with a substantial new introduction that ties them all together a must have for serious students of the fourth gospel

the gospel of john refers five times to the disciple whom jesus loved from the second through the present century scholars have sought to identify this disciple traditionally concluding that he is the author of the gospel and is indeed none other than john the son of zebedee in recent phases of research however the identification of the beloved disciple with john the son of zebedee has been exposed as weak and unpersuasive yet according to james charlesworth even this new research is problematic in that it tends to ascribe priority in discerning the meaning of the gospel of john to documents other than the gospel itself moreover this research tends to impute historical accuracy to documents that were not primarily intended to present histories based on extensive research then professor charlesworth has concluded that the primary texts in the gospel of john and the reflections of modern scholars indicate that any identification of the beloved disciple whether with one of the disciples specified in the gospel with one who is anonymous in this gospel or with some symbolic theme must provide credible answers to eight questions book jacket title summary field provided by blackwell north america inc all rights reserved

one of the most important sources of information about the development of

johannine legends as well as one of the most successful efforts to overcome barriers that have traditionally separated new testament exegesis from the study of church history

james h charlesworth begins from a burgeoning point of scholarly consensus more and more scholars are coming to recognize that the fourth gospel is more historically complex than previously thought charlesworth outlines two historical

horizons within john on the one hand there is the jewish background to the text complete with the evangelist s knowledge of palestinian geography and jewish customs which charlesworth perceives as offering a window into pre 70 palestinian judaism on the other hand the gospel also reflects a post 70 world in which non believing jews with more unity begin to part definitely with those who identified jesus as the messiah split into four sections this volume first examines the origins of the fourth gospel its evolution in several editions and its setting in judea and galilee charlesworth then looks specifically at the figure of jesus and issues of history he proceeds to consider this gospel alongside earlier and contemporaneous jewish literature most notably the dead sea scrolls finally the volume engages with john s symbolism and language looking closely at key aspects in which john differs from the synoptic gospels and raising such provocative questions as whether or not it is possible that jesus married mary magdalene from one of the new testament s most noted scholars this book allows deeper understanding of the ways in which the gospel of john is a vital resource for understanding both the origin of christianity and jesus position in history

this study examines love in john s gospel it attempts to answer the question in what way love in the johannine gospel receives its narratively imaginative stature john s gospel develops a love story which is different from any other narrative much attention is given to the cultural contextualisation as well as to the narrative and imaginative textualisations of the various love relationships in this jesus relationship with his beloved disciple plays a central role the study concludes that all other love relationships the relationship of jesus with his father mother brothers and sisters with john the baptist with peter and the other disciples with particular women and men derive their colour and content from this specific relationship

this book argues that the gospels are in an important sense occasions for offense the jesus of the gospels is a scandal skandalon in the original greek and he is never more scandalous than when he is speaking in parables interpreters of the gospels over the centuries have consistently labored to domesticate the offense or to eliminate it entirely david mccracken focusing on parables matthew s narrative contexts and the gospel of john seeks to recover the gospels sense of jesus as skandalon to this end he enlists the help of kierkegaard the philosopher of offense and to a lesser extent that of bakhtin both of whom prove to be surprisingly apt conversation partners for the evangelists

kim reads the gospel of john from a postcolonial feminist perspective as a patriarchal nationalist discourse the author examines effects of colonialism in twentieth century korean cultural experience as seen in social memory pervasive emotional nonlinear experience of the collective or oral traditions to develop an intercontextual lens through which she examines the role of the johannine female

characters in supporting Jesus's role as a national hero and in functioning as continuers of the nation in her unique handling of the Gospel of John the author describes how John's resistance to Roman imperial power defines and shapes the boundaries of his Jewish nationalism in relation to the symbolic meanings attached to the female characters' sexuality and gender roles

were the resurrection appearances real physical events or nothing more than grief-induced hallucinations? What does it mean to say Jesus rose from the dead? Dissatisfied with what he regarded as evasive answers given by theologians and scholars about the nature of the resurrection of Jesus, Gerd Lüdemann here subjects the New Testament traditions to a thorough investigation. In particular, Lüdemann is concerned with the story of the empty tomb and the subsequent appearance stories first related by Peter. Lüdemann's startling and somewhat radical conclusions have created a stir in Europe. This book, written for nonspecialists, presents Lüdemann's provocative conclusions. Readers will find a positive, albeit a revolutionary, new way of viewing the resurrection.

The hypothesis that the Fourth Gospel is a theological response to the Gospel of Thomas is a recent development in the study of the New Testament and early Christianity. Assuming an early date for the Gospel of Thomas, the proponents of this hypothesis argue that the supposed polemical presentation of Thomas in the Fourth Gospel is evidence of a conflict between the early communities associated respectively with John and Thomas. However, a detailed narrative study reveals that the Fourth Gospel portrays a host of characters, disciples and non-disciples, in an equally unflattering light where an understanding of Jesus's origins, message and mission are concerned. The present study attempts to demonstrate that the Fourth Gospel's presentation of Thomas is part and parcel of its treatment of uncomprehending characters. If this thesis is correct, it poses a significant challenge to the assumption that the Fourth Gospel contains a polemic against Thomas or that it was written in response to the Gospel of Thomas or the community associated with Thomas.

The contribution of the Johannine literature to the development of Christian theology and particularly to Christology is uncontested, although careful distinction between the implications of its language, especially that of sonship, in a first-century Jewish context and in the subsequent theological controversies of the early church has been particularly important, if not always easily sustained. Recent study has shaken off the weight of subsequent Christian appropriation of Johannine language which has sometimes made readers immune to the ambiguities and challenging tensions in its thought. The Oxford Handbook of Johannine Studies begins with chapters concentrating on discussions of the background and context of the Johannine literature, leading to the different ways of reading the text and thence to the primary theological themes within them.

before concluding with some discussion of the reception of the johannine literature in the early church inevitably given their different genres and levels of complexity some chapters pay most if not all attention to the gospel whereas others are more able to give a more substantial place to the letters all the contributors have themselves made significant contributions to their topic they have sought to give a balanced introduction to the relevant scholarship and debate but they have also been able to present the issues from their own perspective the handbook will help those less familiar with the johannine literature to get a sense of the major areas of debate and why the field continues to be one of vibrant and exciting study and that those who are already part of the conversation will find new insights to enliven their own on going engagement with these writings

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english summary why does the church have four different written gospels although according to paul there was only one orally proclaimed gospel from the very beginning martin hengel attempts to answer this question by showing how the collection of the four gospels developed in the 2nd century and by tracing their origins the reading of these four gospels in addition to the texts of the old testament during the church service played a decisive role in the collection and the affirmation of these gospels as part of the church canon the author also deals with the authors of the gospels and the time in which they were written he bases his study on the fact that mark was the first to write a gospel it is very probable that matthew who wrote the later gospel was familiar with the earlier gospel

the author of a much loved two volume matthew commentary 1990 that he greatly revised and expanded fourteen years later frederick dale bruner now offers the gospel of john a commentary more rich fruit of his lifetime of study and teaching rather than relying primarily on recent scholarship bruner honors and draws from the church s major john commentators throughout history including augustine chrysostom aquinas luther calvin bultmann barrett and many more alongside this historical interpretation is bruner s own contemporary interpretation which incorporates a lucid translation of the text references to recent scholarship and his pastoral application of the gospel to present day experience like bruner s other work this commentary is rich in biblical insights broadly historical and deeply theological here is what eugene peterson said about bruner s earlier work on matthew this is the kind of commentary i most want a theological wrestling with scripture frederick dale bruner grapples with the text not only as a technical exegete although he does that very well but as a church theologian caring

passionately about what these words tell us about god and ourselves his matthew commentary is in the grand traditions of augustine calvin and luther expansive and leisurely loving the text the people in it and the christians who read it the same could well be said about the present john commentary which promises to be another invaluable resource for pastors teachers and laypeople alike

peter matthew thomas john who were these men and what was their relationship to jesus tom bissell gives us rich and deeply informed answers to those ancient questions written with warmth humour and a rare acumen apostle is a brilliant and exhaustive synthesis of travel writing centuries of biblical history and a deep lifelong relationship with christianity bissell explores not just who these renowned and pious men were and weren't but how their identities have taken shape over two millennia bissell in his search for this elusive set of truths has traveled the world visiting holy sites from rome and jerusalem to turkey india and kyrgyzstan and he captures vividly the rich diversity of christianity's global reach apostle is an unusual erudite and hilarious book an intoxicating combination of religious intellectual and personal adventure

religious truth has always been in dispute but there are certain times and places in which the debate has been more intense one such period was the first century ce when the rapid spread of christianity with its claims about jesus produced considerable ferment the gospel of john written late in that century presents that dispute with greater clarity than any other document of the time john presents a jesus who claims not only to tell the truth but also to be the truth and yet as the roman magistrate asks jesus in john's gospel what is truth two millennia later in the western world pluralism and postmodernism radically challenge traditional notions of truth is there any truth beyond the formal logic of merely analytical propositions and if there is do humans have any way of knowing it many who have a postmodern perspective deny that either rationality or imagination can give us access to the truth instead they adopt a throughgoing incredulity toward metanarratives truth is again on trial

in the adaptable jesus of the fourth gospel jason s sturdevant argues that the gospel of john portrays jesus as an adaptable teacher who accommodates to different people in various ways to a singular end to bring each to faith in the same way the logos accommodates to humanity via the incarnation adaptability serves as both an interpersonal and universal category early christian interpretations of john especially that of john chrysostom describe the jesus of john by echoing characterizations of the ideal greco roman pedagogue adapting to his diverse students by looking to such interpretations as well as illumination from the milieu of the fourth evangelist jason s sturdevant provides a new lens through which to understand the characterization of the johannine jesus
