narrative inquiry is based on the proposition that experience is the stories lived and told by individuals as they are embedded within cultural social institutional familial political and linguistic narratives it represents the phenomenon of experience but also constitutes a methodology for its study at the heart of this methodology is relational ethics however until now the functioning of this key relationship in practice has remained largely undefined in this book the authors take on the essential task of developing a conceptual framework for the application of relational ethics to narrative inquiry building on a corpus of more generalized research this book is grounded in a multi year study with indigenous youth and families the authors describe their experiences of narrative inquiry highlighting how relational ethics informed their negotiation of these research relationships they also engage in a conversation with the work of philosophers who have guided their narrative inquiry to offer a more thorough understanding of relational ethics through this and contributions from five further studies on a diverse range of subjects a number of key points for successful relational ethics are isolated and expounded upon this book is an invaluable tool for researchers and postgraduates engaged in qualitative research providing clear and practical guidance on ethical concerns it also extends the work of the authors two previous titles engaging in narrative inquiry and engaging in narrative inquiries with children and youth

this book places the philosophy of simone weil into conversation with contemporary environmental concerns in the anthropocene the book offers a systematic interpretation of simone weil making her ethical philosophy more accessible to non weil scholars weil s work has been influential in many fields including politically and theologically based critiques of social inequalities and suffering but rarely linked to ecology kathryn lawson argues that weil s work can be understood as offering a coherent approach with potentially widespread appeal applicable to our ethical relations to much more than just other human beings she suggests that the process of decreation in weil is an expansion of the self which might also come to include the surrounding earth and a vast assemblage of others this allows readers to consider what it means to be human in this time and place and to contemplate our ethical responsibilities both to other humans and also to the more than human world ultimately the book uses weil s thought to decanter the human being by cultivating human actions towards an ecological ethics this book will be useful for simone weil scholars and academics as well as students and researchers interested in environmental ethics in departments of comparative literature theory

and criticism philosophy and environmental studies

what does it mean for ethics to say as wittgenstein did that philosophy leaves everything as it is though clearly absorbed with ethical questions throughout his life and work wittgenstein s remarks about the subject do not easily lend themselves to summation or theorizing although many moral philosophers cite the influence or inspiration of wittgenstein there is little agreement about precisely what it means to do ethics in the light of wittgenstein ethics after wittgenstein brings together an international cohort of leading scholars in the field to address this problem the chapters advance a conception of philosophical ethics characterized by an attention to detail meaning and importance which itself makes ethical demands on its practitioners working in conversation with literature and film engaging deeply with anthropology and critical theory and addressing contemporary problems from racialized sexual violence against women to the islamic state these contributors reclaim wittgenstein s legacy as an indispensable resource for contemporary ethics

the outstanding features of this book are that it directly confronts the challenge posed by g e m anscombe in modern moral philosophy of how moral philosophy can be done it makes a significant contribution to the debate on virtue theory and anti theory in ethics and it shows the relevance of such theoretical discussion by grounding it in and applying it to contemporary moral issues such as abortion suicide and the moral status of animals no other book currently available covers this ground the book is aimed primarily at upper level undergraduates graduate students and faculty in philosophy but it should be accessible to anyone with an interest in practical ethics or the philosophy of wittgenstein

1 historical introduction introduction this chapter is mainly about the history of medicine and its ethics as usually c ceived history is retrograde it is what happened yesterday and much as we may try it is what happened yesterday seen with a set of today s eyes trying to understand yesterday s culture may help us put on a pair of corrective glasses but it fails in tirely correcting our vision contemporary cultural anthropology may likewise help us understand the way today s events and cultural habits shape what we call history tomorrow past events and the kaleidoscopic pattern of today s cultures may help guide us into a future that in at least some respects is ours to forge learning about ethics yesterday and thinking about ethics as it expresses itself in various cultures today can help us shape the ethics of tomorrow this is true whether we are speaking of that part of social ethics called medical or of any other part of social ethics the social aspects of medical practice how the institution called medicine fits into and works within the greater society called culture shape the way its ethics ultimately must play itself out

albert schweitzer s leading philosophical idea was reverence for life good consists in maintaining and perfecting life evil in destroying and obstructing life for schweitzer all life is sacred and ethics deals with human attitudes and behavior toward all living beings unlike most other moral philosophers schweitzer argues that knowledge of human nature does not lead to any unique moral theory for that reason he bases his ethics on much broader foundations articulated in his philosophy of civilization and philosophy of religion his central idea is that the material element of our civilization has become far more important than its spiritual

counterpart even organized religion has put itself in the service of politics and economics thereby losing its vitality and moral authority schweitzer s ethics of reverence for life argues predrag cicovacki offers a viable alternative at a time when traditional ethical theories are found inadequate collecting fifteen of schweitzer s most effective essays this volume serves as a compelling introduction to this remarkable thinker

there isn t one conversation about animal ethics instead there are several important ones that are scattered across many disciplines this volume both surveys the field of animal ethics and draws professional philosophers graduate students and undergraduates more deeply into the discussions that are happening outside of philosophy departments to that end the volume contains more nonphilosophers than philosophers explicitly inviting scholars from other fields such as animal science ecology economics psychology law environmental science and applied biology among others to bring their own disciplinary resources to bear on matters that affect animals the routledge handbook of animal ethics is composed of 44 chapters all appearing in print here for the first time and organized into the following six sections i thinking about animals ii animal agriculture and hunting iii animal research and genetic engineering iv companion animals v wild animals conservation management and ethics vi animal activism the chapters are brief and they have been written in a way that is accessible to serious undergraduate students
