a middle aged accountant presides passionately over a fantasy baseball league in a flagrantly funny novel from the award winning author of huck out west the new york times j henry waugh is not particularly happy in his job but after the workday he can go home to the ballgame with each toss of the dice the balls and strikes hits and runs are decided and the tabletop players and the individual personalities he perceives in them seem more real and immerse him more deeply but when a promising rookie pitcher pitches a perfect game filling henry with pride and excitement and soon afterward is killed by a beanball an extraordinary occurrence according to the probability chart henry is shattered and his life is affected in unimaginable ways in this blackly comic and philosophical novel that veers wildly between fantasy and reality and delves into the notions of chance and power a baseball novel which isn't really altogether about baseball funny surprises sad moments and catchy ideas kirkus reviews starred review one of the most original and exciting writers around every new book from him is great news mcsweeney's not to read it because you don't like baseball is like not reading balzac because you don't like boardinghouses the new york times book review

design and debris discusses the relationship between order and disorder in the works of John Hawkes, Harry Mathews, John Barth, Gilbert Sorrentino, Robert Coover, Thomas Pynchon, Kathy Acker, and Don DeLillo in analyzing their work. Joseph Conte brings to bear a unique approach adapted from scientific thought: chaos theory. His chief concern is illuminating those works whose narrative structures locate order hidden in disorder, whose authors Conte terms proceduralists, and those whose structures reflect the opposite: disorder emerging from states of order, whose authors Conte calls disruptors. Documenting the paradigm shift from modernism in which artists attempted to impose order on a disordered world to postmodernism in which the artist portrays the process of orderly disorder, Conte shows how the shift has led to postmodern artists' embrace of science in their treatment of complex ideas, detailing how chaos theory interpenetrates disciplines as varied as economics, politics, biology, and cognitive science. He suggests a second paradigm shift from modernist specialization to postmodern pluralism. In such a pluralistic world, the novel is freed from the purely literary.

this challenging new book looks at the current reinvention of american studies a reinvention that among other things has put the whole issue of just what is american and what is american studies into contention the collection focuses in particular on american mythology the editors themselves have written essays that examine the connections between mythologies of the united states and those of either classical european or native american traditions william blazek considers louise erdrich s love medicine novels as chronicles combining ojibwa mythology and contemporary u s culture in ways that reinvest a sense of mythic identity within a multicultural postmodern america michael k glenday s analysis of jayne anne phillips work and explores in it the contexts where myth and dream interact with each other betty louise bell is one of four essayists in this collection who focus their criticism on authors of native american heritage in the first part of indians with voices bell carefully argues that roy harvey pearce s seminal native american studies text savagism and civilization fails to acknowledge its white elitist assumptions about what constitutes the american mind and views native americans along a primitive savage binary that helped to create a twentieth century national mythos of innocence and destiny other essays include christopher brookeman s study of the impact of muhammad ali on norman mailer s non fiction writing about heavyweight boxing

with two essays devoted to wordsworth the fate of translation reframes the discussion of hesperian aesthetics initiated in robert eisenhower s mythic paradigms suggesting how the question of translation poses itself at the crossing of textual high and low roads on the one hand in the critical and scholarly debate concerning the relevance of goethe s der wandrer in the english version by william taylor to the primal primary scene of autobiography and on the other in the reprojection of supernatural agency numen in the context of the literature of power confrontational deixis and a hermeneutic counterturn energize wordsworth s self assertive resensing of antiquity and modernity via satire pastoral and the sonnet the third essay ranging from pindarizing texts by cowley goethe and hölderlin to the films of matthew barney shifts the focus to mimetic enthusiasms among translators and replicators of the full fan experience john barth s intriguing analogy between metafiction and fractal geometry serves as the catalyst for a reading of texts by thomas browne and friedrich schlegel a major painting by philipp otto runge and the arabian nights as malignly received by poe the arabesque and grotesque are seen as engaged in a problematics of passion at the utopian end of art a consensualist paradigm akin to

the dionysian liberation of the subject player fan in baseball one whose field of implication includes nietzsche and contemporary novelists eisenhower reads padgett powell's edisto as a declamatory mini epic divergent in its mythos from the tradition of the american hieroglyphic edisto's fictive reinvention of the south suggests a revisiting of the literature of power as privileged emancipative counterfactuality of other truth congruent with the fictive worlds of cable faulkner and günter grass

robert coover and the generosity of the page is an unconventional study of robert coover's work from his early masterpiece the origin of the brunists 1966 to the recent noir 2010 written in the second person it offers a self reflexive investigation into the ways in which coover's stories often challenge the reader to resist the conventions of sense making and even literary criticism by portraying characters lost in surroundings they often fail to grasp coover's work playfully enacts a melo drama of cognition that mirrors the reader's own desire to interpret and make sense of texts in unequivocal ways this tendency in coover's writing is indicative of a larger refusal of the ready made of the once and for all or the authoritative celebrating instead in its generosity the widening of possibilities thus inevitably forcing the reader critic to acknowledge the arbitrariness and artificiality of her responses

modern fandom is rubbish and calcaterra explains why but in so doing also shows us the way out of our desensitized corporate laundry hugging ways keith law the athletic sports fandom isn't what it used to be owners and executives increasingly count on the blind loyalty of their fans and too often act against the team's best interest sports fans are left deliberating not only mismanagement but also political health and ethical issues in rethinking fandom sportswriter and lifelong sports fan craig calcaterra outlines endemic problems with what he calls the sports industrial complex such as intentionally tanking a season to get a high draft pick scamming local governments to build cushy new stadiums actively subverting the players bad stadium deals racism concussions and more but he doesn't give up on professional sports in the second half of the book he proposes strategies to reclaim joy in fandom rooting for players instead of teams being a fair weather fan becoming an activist and other clever solutions with his characteristic wit and piercing commentary calcaterra argues that fans have more power than they realize to change how their teams behave if you're like me and love sports but have become increasingly dismayed by the sports industrial complex calcaterra's book will prove a balm that allows you to hold onto that fandom without turning a blind eye to the myriad problems and sources of

exploitation on the field john warner the chicago tribune rather than simply criticizing calcaterra provides positive solutions to help us form a healthier and more thoughtful relationship with the sports we love a vital book for any sports fan in the 21st century mike duncan new york times bestselling author

mccaffery interprets the works of three major writers of radically experimental fiction robert coover donald barthelme and willam h gass the term metafiction here refers to a strain in american writing where the self conscious approach to the art of fiction making is a commentary on the nature of meaning itself

drawing on novels by nabokov wright powers delillo didion and others no accident comrade examines the shaping influence of the cold war s obsession with chance on post world war ii fictional form

critics who hold that postmodernist art is essentially adversarial and apolitical have ignored the historical context of the postmodern focus on the problems of language paul maltby examines a major current of postmodernist fiction that can be read as a dissident response to developments of late capitalism that have transformed the field of language and communication

a collection of essays that focuses on teaching sport related classes in the humanities and social sciences it is designed to aid university faculty in proposing or revising courses and features sample syllabi assignment instructions and examinations in the appendix to each essay

science fiction is a literary genre based on scientific speculation works of science fiction use the ideas and the vocabulary of all sciences to create valid narratives that explore the future effects of science on events and human beings science fact and science fiction examines in one volume how science has propelled science fiction and to a lesser extent how science fiction has influenced the sciences although coverage will discuss the science behind the fiction from the classical age to the present focus is naturally on the 19th century to the present when the industrial revolution and spectacular progress in science and technology triggered an influx of science fiction works speculating on the future as scientific developments alter expectations for the future the literature absorbs uses and adapts such contextual visions the goal of the encyclopedia is not to present a catalog of sciences and their application in literary fiction but rather to study the ongoing flow and counterflow of influences including how fictional
