this book deals with the theory and the applications of a new time domain termed natural time domain that has been forwarded by the authors almost a decade ago p a varotsos n v sarlis and e s skordas practica of athens academy 76 294 321 2001 physical review e 66 011902 2002 in particular it has been found that novel dynamical features hidden behind time series in complex systems can emerge upon analyzing them in this new time domain which conforms to the desire to reduce uncertainty and extract signal information as much as possible the analysis in natural time enables the study of the dynamical evolution of a complex system and identifies when the system enters a critical stage hence natural time plays a key role in predicting impending catastrophic events in general relevant examples of data analysis in this new time domain have been published during the last decade in a large variety of fields e g earth sciences biology and physics the book explains in detail a series of such examples including the identification of the sudden cardiac death risk in cardiology the recognition of electric signals that precede earthquakes the determination of the time of an impending major mainshock in seismology and the analysis of the avalanches of the penetration of magnetic flux into thin films of type ii superconductors in condensed matter physics in general this book is concerned with the time series analysis of signals emitted from complex systems by means of the new time domain and provides advanced students and research workers in diverse fields with a sound grounding in the fundamentals of current research work on detecting long range correlations in complex time series furthermore the modern techniques of statistical physics in time series analysis for example hurst analysis the detrended fluctuation analysis the wavelet transform etc are presented along with their advantages when natural time domain is employed

the demographics of empire is a collection of essays examining the multifaceted nature of the colonial science of demography in the last two centuries the contributing scholars of africa and the british and french empires focus on three questions how have historians demographers and other social scientists understood colonial populations what were the demographic realities of african societies and how did they affect colonial systems of power finally how did demographic theories developed in europe shape policies and administrative structures in the colonies the essays approach the subject as either broad analyses of major demographic questions in africa s history or focused case studies that demonstrate how particular historical circumstances in individual african societies contributed to differing levels of fertility mortality and migration together the contributors to the demographics of empire question demographic orthodoxy and in particular the assumption that african societies in the past exhibited a single demographic regime characterized by high fertility and high mortality

working against the stubbornly persistent image of dark satanic mills in many ways so characteristic of literary romanticism jon mee provides a fresh revisionary account of the industrial revolution as a story of unintended consequences in networks of improvement mee reads a wide range of texts economic medical and more conventionally literary with a focus on their circulation through networks and institutions mee shows how a project of enlightened liberal reform articulated in britain s emerging manufacturing towns led to unexpectedly coercive forms of machine productivity a pattern that might be seen repeating in the digital technologies of our own time instead of treating the industrial revolution as romanticism s other mee shows how writing practices and institutions emanating from these industrial towns developed a new kind of knowledge economy one where local literary and philosophical societies served as important transmission hubs for the circulation of knowledge

the grenfell tower tragedy was the worst residential fire in london since world war ii it killed seventy two people in the richest borough of one of the wealthiest countries in the world like other catastrophic events before it and since it has the power to bring about lasting change but will it the historical evidence is weighed against lessons being learned in a meaningful or enduring way in an attempt to understand why despite enormous efforts we persistently fail to learn from catastrophic events this book uses the details of the grenfell fire as a case study to consider why we don't learn and what it would take to enable real systemic change the book explores the myths the key challenges and the conditions that inhibit learning and it identifies opportunities to positively disrupt the status quo it offers an accessible model for systemic change not as a definitive solution but rather as a framework to evoke reflection enquiry and proper debate catastrophe and systemic change is a must read book for a wide range of readers including those interested in change management leadership policy making law housing construction and public safety

engines of mischief explores the day to day labor economic political and social climate at the dawn of the industrial revolution in manchester england between 1817 and 1818 using new economic theories of the time parliamentary commissions and news reports students will engage with crucial issues of the day debating factory conditions and child labor the role of the government in the economy taxation workers unions and the extension of political rights down the social hierarchy in the game by assuming the roles of historical actors from various classes of society students are faced with choices about how to live and prosper during this period of great technological economic and social transformation will the working class violently resist new technology in factories form unions or join radical political clubs to improve their working conditions and protect their rights how best will middle class entrepreneurs run their enterprises will they provide fair treatment to their workers or simply maximize their profit how will the aristocrats maintain their power in government and society will they support the middle or the working classes

this volume which collects together the work of several established scholars attempts to situate the apostle paul the pauline writings and the earliest christian gospels together in the context of early christianity it addresses the issue of how the christianity depicted in and represented by the individual gospels relates to the vision of christianity represented by paul and the pauline writings this raises such questions as to what extent did paul influence the canonical and non canonical gospels in what way are the gospels reactions to paul and his legacy a comparison of the gospels and paul on topics such as old testament law gentile mission christology and early church leadership structures represents a fruitful area of study while a number of volumes have appeared that attempt to assess the relationship between the historical jesus and the apostle paul relatively few studies on paul and the gospels have been published this volume excellently fills this gap in new testament studies and makes a valuable contribution to studies on christian origins pauline research and the gospels
