the remarkable longhouses of borneo remain mysterious this book describes life within them and puts them in their historical and ethnographic context

six hundred years ago in what would become the northeastern united states and southeastern canada five iroquois tribes were locked in bitter warfare from the ashes of violence a great peacemaker was born young odion and his little sister tutelo live in fear that one day yellowtail village will be attacked when that day comes and odion and tutelo are marched away as slaves their only hope is that their parents will rescue them their mother war chief koracoo and their father deputy gonda think they are tracking an ordinary war party herding captive children to an enemy village koracoo and gonda do not know that odion and tutelo have fallen into the hands of a legendary evil gannajero the trader known as the crow she is a figure out of nightmare a witch who captures children for her own nefarious purposes no one can stand against her powers except perhaps the mysterious forest spirit whose tracks have crisscrossed their own throughout their journey odion and the other children

struggle to survive their brutal captivity they too have seen the forest spirit but like their parents they can t be sure if the spirit is a friend or is in league with gannajero in people of the longhouse new york times and usa today bestselling authors w michael gear and kathleen o neal gear continue the gripping saga of north america s forgotten past at the publisher s request this title is being sold without digital rights management software drm applied

richter examines a wide range of primary documents to survey the responses of the peoples of the iroquois league the mohawks oneidas onondagas cayugas senecas and tuscaroras to the challenges of the european colonialization of north america he demonstrates that by the early eighteenth century a series of creative adaptations in politics and diplomacy allowed the peoples of the longhouse to preserve their cultural autonomy in a land now dominated by foreign powers

the great law a living tradition among the conservative iroquois is sustained by celebrating the condolence ceremony when they mourn a dead chief and install his successor for life on good behavior this ritual act reaching back to the dawn of history maintains the league of the iroquois the legendary form of government that gave way over time to the iroquois confederacy fenton verifies historical accounts from his own long experience of iroquois society so that his political ethnography extends into the twentieth century as he considers in detail the relationship between customs and events his main argument is the remarkable continuity of iroquois political tradition in the face of military defeat depopulation territorial loss and acculturation to european technology this valuable book provides a succinct readable account of an oft neglected topic in the historiography of the american revolution the role of native americans in the revolution s outbreak progress and conclusion there has not been an all encompassing narrative of the native american experience during the american revolutionary war period until now native americans in the american revolution how the war divided devastated and transformed the early american indian world fills that gap in the literature provides full coverage of the revolution s effects on native americans and details how native americans were critical to the revolution s outbreak its progress and its conclusion the work covers the experiences of specific native american groups such as the abenaki cherokee chickasaw choctaw creek delaware iroquois seminole and shawnee peoples with information presented by chronological period and geographic area the first part of the book examines the effects of the imperial crisis of the 1760s and early 1770s on native peoples in the northern colonies southern colonies and ohio valley respectively the second section focuses on the effects of the revolutionary war itself on these three regions during the years of ongoing conflict and the final section concentrates on the postwar years

present day travelers visiting borneo to see the marvelous buildings pictured in books are liable to wonder if they somehow ended up in the wrong place much of the architecture of borneo and other areas of the humid tropics was never intended to last and built as it is of wood and other organic materials last it has not among borneo s spectacular indigenous buildings the longhouses mortuary monuments and other architectural forms of the interior are some of the most outstanding and much of the renewed interest in indigenous architecture has focused on the rapidly vanishing or now extinct traditional forms of a small number of surviving examples or recreations drawing on the author s extensive research and travel in borneo this impressive and original study offers a more comprehensive account of this architecture than any previous work organized into two sections the book first documents and explains traditional built forms in terms of tools and materials the environmental context village organization and social arrangements this section includes a full discussion of architecture designs and symbolism especially those dealing with life and death the author next look

gayanögwad s phyllis eileen wms bardeau deer clan english onöndowa ga seneca dictionary is a cultural and linguistic treasure trove eileen a fluent first language speaker and elder speaks and records the onöndowa ga language as she learned it from her grandmother several generations ago before the building of the kinzua dam in the 1960s this tragic treaty violation accelerated language loss by breaking up almost two century old communities at ohi yonö allegany territory residents lit people of the ohi yo of the onöndowa ga she devoted her life to the preservation of the onöndowa ga language phyllis created definitive seneca it s in the word as a permanent tool to study culture through language gayanögwad has taught the language in the community for the seneca nation and at the university level this publication should be in every library for students of the

onöndowa ga gawë nö language of the people of the great hills

the book tries to answer the questions who are the kelabits why are they called kelabits where do they live when did they come to live there what were their problems what made them what they are today what must they do inorder to advance forward

no detailed description available for swidden agriculture in indonesia

beginning in 1701 the iroquois at their nadir after twenty years of warring sought to rebuild the confederacy by design or circumstance they carried out sophisticated diplomatic relations with their indian and white neighbors gradually recouping much of their political military and economic power the iroquois helped shape the frontier influencing westward expansion the fur trade and colonial warfare

today kahnawÄ ke at the rapids is a community of approximately seventy two hundred mohawks located on the south shore of

the saint lawrence river near montreal one of the largest mohawk communities it is known in the modern era for its activism a traditionalist energetic impulse with a long history kahnawÄ ke examines the development of traditionalism and nationalism in this kanien kek³/₄ ka mohawk community from 1870 to 1940 the core of kahnawÄ ke s cultural and political revitalization involved efforts to revive and refashion the community s traditional political institutions reforge ties to and identification with the iroquois confederacy and reestablish the traditional longhouse within the community gerald f reid interprets these developments as the result of the community s efforts to deal with internal ecological economic and political pressures and the external pressures for assimilation particularly as they stemmed from canadian indian policy factionalism was a consequence of these pressures and an important ingredient in the development of traditionalist and nationalist responses within the community these responses within kahnawÄ ke also contributed to and were supported by similar processes of revitalization in other iroquois communities drawing on primary documents and numerous oral histories kahnawÄ ke provides a detailed ethnohistory of a major kanien kek³/₄ ka community at a turbulent and transformative time in its history and the history of the iroquois confederacy it not only makes an important contribution to the understanding of this vital but little studied community but also sheds new light on recent iroquois history and native political and cultural revitalization

this work is a fascinating history of precontact north america presenting the facts and engaging the reader by using alternative history what if key facts were different to help develop critical thinking skills the first title in abc clio s groundbreaking series turning points actual and alternate histories delves into the history of north america before european contact there is much

classroom literature on native americans after first contact there is little on the history before this work fills that gap detailing the thousands of years before europeans arrived climate changes major battles technology and settlement patterns all played a part in shaping the pre columbian history of north america this book takes eight key points in history presents the facts as they happened and examines what might have happened if there were different outcomes small changes can produce vastly different results this book shows how and engages students critical thinking skills while teaching them basic history

all over the world and throughout millennia states have attempted to subjugate control and dominate non state populations and to end their wars this book compares such processes of pacification leading to the end of tribal warfare in seven societies from all over the world between the 19th and 21st centuries it shows that pacification cannot be understood solely as a unilateral imposition of state control but needs to be approached as the result of specific interactions between state actors and non state local groups indigenous groups usually had options in deciding between accepting and resisting state control state actors often had to make concessions or form alliances with indigenous groups in order to pursue their goals incentives given to local groups sometimes played a more important role in ending warfare than repression in this way indigenous groups in interaction with state actors strongly shaped the character of the process of pacification this volume s comparison finds that pacification is more successful and more durable where state actors mainly focus on selective incentives for local groups to renounce warfare offer protection and only as a last resort use moderate repression combined with the quick establishment of effective institutions for peaceful conflict settlement for the foi people who live on the edge of the central highlands of papua new guinea the flow of pearl shells is the heart of their social life the pearl shell is the exchange item that mediates the creation of their most important sexual and social roles the heart of the pearl shell analyzes a number of myths of the foi people elegantly bringing together significant ethnographic materials in a way that has important implications for the development of social theory in anthropology and in melanesian studies scholars of semiotic symbolic anthropology and of comparative religion will also share the author s interest in the meaning and role of mythology in foi culture instead of relying on orthodox methods of freudian or structuralist interpretation james weiner assumes there is a dialectical relationship between the images of foi myth and the images of the foi s social world he demonstrates how each set of these images is dependent upon the other for its creation this innovative study locates foi social meaning in the re creation and attempted solution of the moral dilemmas that are crystallized in mythology and other poetic usages this title is part of uc press s voices revived program which commemorates university of california press s mission to seek out and cultivate the brightest minds and give them voice reach and impact drawing on a backlist dating to 1893 voices revived makes high quality peer reviewed scholarship accessible once again using print on demand technology this title was originally published in 1988

to the iroquois extending the rafters meant adding onto the longhouse both in the literal sense of making room for new families and in the figurative sense of adding adopted individuals or tribes to the league of five nations similarly this book extends iroquois studies the distinguished contributors represent such diverse areas of anthropology as ethnology ethnohistory and archaeology they address issues that cut across disciplinary lines making this book a significant state of the art survey the topics explored revolve around the influence contributions field work and teachings of anthropologist william n fenton a founder of the discipline of ethnohistory the essays run the gamut from prehistory to contemporary political issues from individuals to women and nations and from language to ritual

this book covers the relationship between societies and their culture in the context of traditional settlement in indonesia the focus of the study is on the search for meanings of local concepts this study reveals and analyzes the concepts concerning home and their sociocultural strategies for maintaining a sense of community and identity in this study identifying local concepts becomes the hallmark and the hub of analyses that explore verify and establish relations between ideas and phenomena based on these relations this study attempts to capture the reality of the local world that upholds and sustains the communities values norms and principles for what they may call a homeland the book is organized into two parts part i describes a cross regional habitation in indonesia while part ii presents four ethnic regions of indonesia sa dan toraja bali naga and minangkabau their unique traditions customs beliefs and attitudes serve to provide diversity in terms of their backgrounds and lifestyles though they share the challenge of sustaining their sense of home in the face of modernity as characterized by changes and developments toward a technologically industrialized society the central research questions are what is development in terms of culture and environmental sustainability how do these communities respond to modernity

inhabiting the rainforest of the southwest maracaibo basin split by the border between colombia and venezuela the barí have

survived centuries of incursions anthropologist roberto lizarralde began studying the barí in 1960 when he made the first modern peaceful contact with this previously unreceptive people he was joined by anthropologist stephen beckerman in 1970 the ecology of the barí showcases the findings of their singular long term study detailing the barí s relations with natural and social environments this work presents quantitative subsistence data unmatched elsewhere in anthropological publications the authors lengthy longitudinal fieldwork provided the rare opportunity to study a tribal people before during and after their aboriginal patterns of subsistence and reproduction were eroded by the modern world of particular interest is the book s exploration of partible paternity the widespread belief in lowland south america that a child can have more than one biological father the study illustrates its quantitative findings with an in depth biographical sketch of the remarkable life of an individual barí woman and a history of barí relations with outsiders as well as a description of the rainforest environment that has informed all aspects of barí history for the past five hundred years focusing on subsistence defense and reproduction the chapters beautifully capture the barí s traditional culture and the loss represented by its substantial transformation over the past half century

kayan religion is an ethnographic account of the rituals and beliefs of central borneo swidden agriculturists written at the request of the baluy kayan of sarawak to preserve their religion for future generations with its extensive agricultural rituals kayan religion is organized around the agricultural cycle both priests and shamans are present the latter limit themselves to curing rituals while priests manage the annual cycle life cycle rituals and familial rituals like other groups in southeast asia the

kayan have elaborate death rituals the traditional kayan religion adat dipuy was characterized by ritual head hunting animal omens and a multiplicity of taboos in the 1940s a prophet revealed a new religion adat bungan in central borneo with particular success in the baluy area in its initial stage adat bungan was a radical rejection of the old religion however in just a few years a kind of counter reformation occurred led by aristocrats and priests who reinstated most of the old rituals in a simplified and less onerous form

the midwinter ceremonial the longest and most complex of the rituals of the longhouse religion is examined here in three parts following a short cultural history of the iroquois and a description of the present geographical location of the various longhouses and tribes elisabeth tooker discusses the principles of iroquois ritualism the second part of the book is devoted to detailed accounts of the midwinter ceremonial as it is performed today at six iroquois longhouses the third part presents the historical perspective of the ceremony through excerpts from writings of roman catholic and protestant missionaries captives travelers local residents and anthropologists

the building of the kinzua dam abrogated one of the oldest indian treaty with the united states the 1794 pickering treaty the dam flooded 10 000 acres of seneca land and damaged the way of life of the senecas and their elders the stories of their loss are distressing the senecas survived this traumatic event but not without significant cultural change and loss this is the story of the dislocated seneca elders of the allegany territory

more than 7000 years ago groups of early farmers the linearbandkeramik or lbk spread over vast areas of europe their cultural characteristics comprised common choices and styles of execution with a central meaning and functionality attached to doing things a certain way over an enormous geographical area however recent evidence suggests that the reality was much more varied and diverse the central question of this book is the extent to which notions of uniformity and diversity have caused a wider shift in archaeological perspective using the lbk case study as a starting point the volume brings together contributions by international specialists tackling the notion of cultural diversity and its explanatory power in archaeological analysis more generally through discussions of the domestic architecture stone tool inventory pottery traditions landscape use and burial traditions of the lbk this book provides a crucial reappraisal of the culture s potential for adaptability and change papers in the second part of the volume are devoted to archaeological case studies from around the globe in which the tension between diversity and uniformity has also proved controversial including the near eastern halaf culture the north american mississippian the pacific expansion of the lapita culture and the european bell beaker phenomenon all provide exciting theoretical and methodological contributions on how the appreciation of cultural diversity as a whole can be moved forward these papers expose diversity and uniformity as cultural strategies and as such provide essential reading for scholars in archaeology and anthropology and for anyone interested in the interplay between material culture and human social change

the peoples of southeast asia today offers an anthropological treatment of the ethnography and ethnology of southeast asia covering both the mainland and the insular regions based on the proposition that southeast asia is a true culture area the

book offers background information on geography languages prehistory and history with a particular emphasis on the role of colonialism and the development of ethnic pluralism it then turns to classic anthropological topics of interest including modes of adaptation ways of life and religion all illustrated with relevant current case studies students will find well supported discussions of subjects ranging from the development of agriculture and language dispersals to fantasy and reality in hunter gatherer studies to disputed interpretations of thai buddhism and javanese islam to ongoing government efforts to manage religion create proper citizens resettle and assimilate indigenous populations end shifting cultivation and promote modernization
