includes a full introduction to one of the most influential movements in 20th century philosophy this is a comprehensive anthology of classic writings from phenomenology s major seminal thinkers

this is an accessible concise introduction to phenomenological research in education and social sciences mark vagle outlines the key principles for conducting this research from leading contemporary practitioners such as van manen giorgi and dahlberg he builds on their work by introducing his post intentional phenomenology which incorporates elements of post structural thinking into traditional methods vagle provides readers with methodological tools to build their own phenomenological study addressing such issues as data gathering validity and writing replete with exercises for students case studies resources for further research and examples of completed phenomenological studies this brief book affords the instructor an easy entrée into introducing phenomenology into courses on qualitative research social theory or educational research

unsurpassed as a text for upper division and beginning graduate students raman selden's classic text is the liveliest most readable and most reliable guide to contemporary literary theory includes applications of theory cross referenced to selden's companion volume practicing theory and reading literature

although wolfgang izer is one of the most influential literary theorists of the twentieth century there is no authoritative study about his oeuvre the present work remedies that problem by analysing izer's german and english writings in detail apart from being the first comprehensive account of his work this study also modifies the established view of izer's theory in contrast to the idea that his only contribution to literary studies is the reception theory of the 1970s this account demonstrates the importance of izer's work on history and anthropology from the 1950s and 1990s instead of exclusively focusing on familiar terms such as indeterminacy this analysis also discusses izer's view of modernity fiction and culture as this discussion shows his writings develop a consistent theory of the novel and the way in which it allows its readers to articulate new views of reality to situate this theory izer's institutional and intellectual background is described as well paying special attention to the poetik und hermeneutik circle and thinkers like blumenberg and kermode the continued relevance of his theory is demonstrated via comparisons with recent research on the novel and memory as well as examples from contemporary novelists like juli zeh and hilary mantel

understanding phenomenology provides a guide to one of the most important schools of thought in modern philosophy the book traces phenomenology's historical development beginning with its founder edmund husserl and his pure or transcendental phenomenology and continuing with the later existential phenomenology of martin heidegger jean paul sartre and maurice merleau ponty the book also assesses later critical responses to phenomenology from derrida to dennett as well as the continued significance of phenomenology for philosophy today written for anyone coming to phenomenology for the first time the book guides the reader through the often bewildering array of technical concepts and jargon associated with phenomenology and provides clear explanations and helpful examples to encourage and enhance engagement with the primary texts

lacan critiqued imaginary intuition for confusing direct perception with unconscious pre conceptions about people and the world the emphasis on description goes hand in hand with a rejection of theory and the science of the unconscious and a belief in the naive self transparency of the world at the same time knowing in and of the real requires a place beyond thinking multi valued forms of logic mathematical equations and different conceptions of causality acausality and chance this book explores some of the mathematical problems raised by lacan s use of numbers and the interconnection between mathematics and psychoanalytic ideas within any system mathematical or otherwise there are holes or acausal cores and remainders of indecidability it is this senseless point of non knowledge that makes change and the emergence of the new possible within a system this book differentiates between two types of void and aligns them with the lacanian concepts of a true and a false hole and the psychoanalytic theory of primary repression

this book is an ideal resource on the subject of systems practice for busy managers whose time is scarce it provides a rapid introduction to straightforward yet powerful ideas that enable users to address real world problems systems theory and practice is predominantly a framework for thinking about the world in which holistic views are maintained in this respect it contrasts with some familiar techniques of management science in which problem situations are broken down into their constituent parts with resultant loss of coherence

this volume explores the relationship between thucydides and ancient greek historiography sociology and culture drawing on modern anthropological enquiries on kinship and the sociology of ethnicity and emotions it argues that inter communal kinship has a far more pervasive importance in thucydides than has so far been acknowledged

Our world can be a bewildering place the sense of awe and wonder at the states of affairs in which we find ourselves immersed give rise to philosophical questions philosophical reflection is a critical attempt to come to grips with our place in the world and the various problems we encounter in respect to the complexities encountered in everyday life in the most basic terms phenomenology is the study of the structures and relations of phenomena phenomenology begins from a descriptive analysis of our experiences of the world it grants precedent to the first person perspective how phenomena appear to consciousness there are any number of problems related to the

plenitude of kinds of experiences which confront us through the course of our lives in addition to the structure of consciousness itself this volume presents a variety of views on a number of the phenomena of our everyday lives offering positions on such things from the nature of consciousness to the structures of religious or political experiences its appeal however should not be limited to philosophers alone given that all persons can relate to the subject matter of the essays for instance one author asks what is friendship the present work may also be understood as a gesture toward bridging the division between the valuable insights of continental and analytic philosophical traditions the authors include a combination of established academics such as jeffrey wattles the best selling author of the golden rule and young scholars from varied philosophical backgrounds this collection is divided into four sections i foundational elements of experience ii the experiencing subject what is it to be a subject iii amongst others the social world and iv social objects and institutions each section represents a level of experience from the most basic structures of experience to the subject's experience of the world and objects in it to experiences and interactions with others ending at the results of the codifications of certain social practices and beliefs the sections treat their respective topics principally even if they share material with other essays our experiences of the life world the world of human praxis contain a multiplicity of elements the divisions of this work are meant to demarcate various types of phenomena not to offer any definitive thesis regarding a hierarchy or structure of relations

the present anthology seeks to give an overview of the different approaches to establish a relation between phenomenology and psychoanalysis primarily from the viewpoint of current phenomenological research already during the lifetimes of the two disciplines founders edmund husserl 1859 1938 and sigmund freud 1856 1939 phenomenological and phenomenologically inspired authors were advancing psychoanalytic theses for both traditions the second world war presented a painful and devastating disruption of their development and mutual exchange during the postwar period phenomenologists especially in france revisited psychoanalytic topics thus in the so called second generation of phenomenology there developed an intensive reception of the psychoanalytic tradition one that finds its expression even today in current hermeneutic postmodern and poststructuralist conceptions but also in more recent phenomenological research we find projects concentrated systematically on psychoanalysis and its theses in this context the status of psychoanalysis as a science of human experience is discussed anew now approached on the first person basis of a phenomenological understanding of subjective experience in such approaches phenomena like incorporation phantasy emotion and the unconscious are discussed afresh these topics important



for modern phenomenology as well as for psychoanalysis are examined in the context of the constitution of the human person as well as of our intersubjective world the analyses are also interdisciplinary making use of connections with modern medicine psychiatry and psychotherapy the systematic investigations are enriched by historical analysis and research in the internal development of the disciplines involved the volume presents recent work of internationally recognized researchers phenomenologically oriented philosophers psychoanalysts and psychotherapists who work in the common field of the two disciplines the editors hope that this selection will encourage further systematic collaboration between phenomenology and psychoanalysis

walter pater best known as the author of *The Renaissance* 1873 and as oscar wilde's tutor and friend was a leading figure in european aestheticism and british fin de siècle culture despite this he has received only limited critical attention and has tended to be read conservatively drawing on pater's unpublished manuscripts giles whiteley challenges this view of pater as a closeted don who spent the remainder of his life regretting the excesses of his renaissance focusing on pater's reading of the german idealist philosopher g w f hegel whiteley argues that pater's response to both the philosophical and the ideological legacies of idealism was significantly more advanced than has been hitherto thought presenting a persuasive new reading of the genre of the imaginary portrait pater's most elusive form of writing the book paints a picture of walter pater as a truly revolutionary thinker pater like nietzsche during the same period breaks with the dialectic as a method anticipating the radical critiques of ideology of post hegelians such as derrida and deleuze pater becomes a radical and transgressive thinker in his own right

this book offers a philosophical inquiry into the idea of curriculum as confession and considers how it can help us answer questions of justice selfhood and truth it connects the field of curriculum studies and continental philosophy in order to arrive at new ways of thinking through the concept and act of confession utilising a phenomenological and deconstructive approach to thinking about curriculum the author draws upon scholars including william pinar jacques derrida madeleine grumet and michel foucault to act as interlocutors for a rethinking of pinar's statement that we need educational confession the chapters argue that confession communicates the interplay between thinking translation and transformation showing how confession can be conceived of as educative in both instrumental and existential ways an innovative study that explores confession in both religious and secular senses and conceptualises curriculum as a theological and phenomenological text it uniquely explores what confession can reveal

how we tell the truth without violating the other and how one does justice to the world they experience it will appeal to scholarly audiences with interests in curriculum studies teacher education philosophy of education religious studies religious education and theology

an innovative ambitious tradition crossing study drawing on the work of husserl heidegger horkheimer adorno and habermas to propose a new and transformative concept of truth the idea of truth is a guiding theme for german continental philosophers from husserl through habermas in this book lambert Zuidervaat examines debates surrounding the idea of truth in twentieth century german continental philosophy he argues that the heideggerian and critical theory traditions have much in common despite the miscommunication opposition and even outright hostility that have prevailed between them including significant roots in the phenomenology of edmund husserl Zuidervaat sees the tensions between heideggerian thought and critical theory as potentially generative sources for a new approach to the idea of truth he argues further that the critical retrieval of insights from german continental philosophy can shed light on current debates in analytic truth theory Zuidervaat structures his account around three issues the distinction between propositional truth and truth that is more than propositional which he calls existential truth the relationship between propositional truth and the discursive justification of propositional truth claims framed in analytic philosophy by debates between epistemic and nonepistemic conceptions of truth and the relationship between propositional truth and the objectivity of knowledge often presented in analytic philosophy as a conflict between realists and antirealists over the relation between truth bearers and truth makers in an innovative and ambitious argument drawing on the work of husserl heidegger horkheimer adorno and habermas Zuidervaat proposes a new and transformative conception of truth

this oxford handbook celebrates the work of trailblazing women in the history of modern philosophy through thirty one original chapters it engages with the work of women philosophers spanning the long nineteenth century in the german tradition and covers women s contribution to major philosophical movements including romanticism and

idealism socialism and marxism nietzscheanism feminism phenomenology and neo kantianism it opens with a section on figures offering essays focused on fifteen thinkers in this tradition before moving on to sections of essays on movement and topics across the volume s chapters essays examine women s contributions to key philosophical areas such as epistemology and metaphysics aesthetics ethics social and political philosophy ecology education and the philosophy of nature

there is considerable and growing interest in professionals learning across their working lives the growth in this interest is likely premised upon the increasing percentage of those who are being employed under the designation as professi als or para professional workers in advanced industrial economies part of being designated in this way is a requirement to be able to work autonomously and in a relatively self regulated manner of course many other kinds of employment also demand such behaviours however there is particular attention being given to the ongoing development of workers who are seen to make crucial decisions and take actions about health legal and nancial matters part of this attention derives from expectations within the community that those who are granted relative autonomy and are often paid handsomely should be current and informed in their decisi making then like all other workers professionals are required to maintain their competence in the face of changing requirements for work consequently a volume that seeks to inform how best this ongoing learning can be understood supported and assisted is most timely and welcomed this volume seeks to elaborate professional learning through a consideration of the concept of authentic professional learning what is proposed here is that in contrast to programmatic approaches towards professional development the process of continuing professional learning is a personal complex and diverse process that does not lend itself to easy prescription or the realisation of others intents

the german philosopher immanuel kant famously defined anthropology as the study of what it means to be a human being following in his footsteps anthropology and the human subject provides a critical comprehensive and wide ranging investigation of conceptions of the human subject within the western intellectual tradition focusing specifically on the secular trends of the twentieth century encyclopaedic in scope lucidly and engagingly written the book covers the man and varied currents of thought within this tradition each chapter deals with a specific intellectual paradigm ranging from marx s historical materialism and darwin s evolutionary naturalism and their various off shoots through to those currents of though that were prominent in the late twentieth century such as for example existentialism hermeneutics phenomenology and
