this book analyzes the ways collective memories of the us mexico war have shaped mexican
americans civil rights struggles over several generations as the first latinx people incorporated
into the nation mexican americans were offered us citizenship by the treaty of guadalupe
hidalgo which ended the war because the 1790 naturalization act declared whites solely

eligible for citizenship the treaty pronounced mexican americans to be legally white while their incorporation as citizens appeared as progress towards racial justice and the electorate's diversification their second class citizenship demonstrated a retrenchment in racial progress over several generations civil rights activists summoned conquest memories to link mexican americans poverty electoral disenfranchisement low educational attainment and health disparities to structural and institutional inequalities resulting from racial retrenchments activists also recalled the treaty's citizenship guarantees to push for property rights protection from vigilante attacks and educational reform omar valerio jimenez addresses the politics of memory by exploring how succeeding generations reinforced or modified earlier memories of conquest according to their contemporary social and political contexts the book also examines collective memories in the us and mexico to illustrate transnational influences on mexican americans and to demonstrate how community and national memories can be used strategically to advance political agendas

through a compelling story about the conflict over a notorious mexican period land grant in northern new mexico david correia examines how law and property are constituted through violence and social struggle spain and mexico populated what is today new mexico through large common property land grants to shepherders and agriculturalists after the u s mexican war the area saw rampant land speculation and dubious property adjudication nearly all of the huge land grants scattered throughout new mexico were rejected by u s courts or acquired by land speculators of all the land grant conflicts in new mexico's history the struggle for the tierra amarilla land grant the focus of correia's story is one of the most sensational with numerous nineteenth century speculators ranking among the state's political and economic elite and a remarkable pattern of resistance to land loss by heirs in the twentieth century correia narrates a long and largely unknown history of property conflict in tierra amarilla characterized by nearly constant violence night riding and fence cutting pitched gun battles and tanks rumbling along the rutted dirt roads of northern new mexico the legal geography he constructs is one that includes a surprising and remarkable cast of characters millionaire sheep barons spanish anarchists hooded klansmen puerto rican terrorists and undercover fbi agents by placing property and law at the center of his study properties of violence provocatively suggests that violence is not the opposite of property but rather is essential to its operation

in the chicano generation veteran chicano civil rights scholar mario t garcía provides a rare look inside the struggles of the 1960s and 1970s as they unfolded in los angeles based on in depth interviews conducted with three key activists this book illuminates the lives of raul ruiz gloria arellanes and rosario muñoz their family histories and widely divergent backgrounds the events surrounding their growing consciousness as chicanos the sexism encountered by arellanes and the aftermath of their political histories in his substantial introduction garcía situates the chicano movement in los angeles and contextualizes activism within the largest civil rights and empowerment struggle by mexican americans in us history a struggle that featured césar chávez and the farm workers the student movement highlighted by the 1968 la school blowouts the chicano antiwar movement the organization of la raza unida party the chicana feminist movement the organizing of undocumented workers and the chicano renaissance weaving this revolution against a backdrop of historic mexican american activism from the 1930s to the 1960s and the contemporary black power and black civil rights movements garcía gives readers the best representations of the chicano generation in los angeles

this title takes a calendrical approach to illuminating the history of latinos and life in the united states and adds more value than a simple this day in history through primary source excerpts and resources for further research latino a history has been relatively slow in gaining recognition despite the population s rich and varied history engaging and informative latino history day by day a reference guide to events will help address that oversight much more than just a this day in history list the guide describes important events in latino a history augmenting many entries with a brief excerpt from a primary document all entries include two annotated books and websites as key resources for follow up the day to day reference is organized by the 365 days of the year with each day drawing from events that span several hundred years of latino a history from mexican americans to puerto ricans to cuban americans with this guide in hand teachers will be able to more easily incorporate latino a history into their classes students will find the book an easy to use guide to the latino a past and an ideal starting place for research

a century ago william carlos williams s in the american grain profiled anglo french and spanish conquistadors tyrants preachers and thought leaders who first shaped american culture since then waves of resistance and disruptive innovation have flooded into the rest of america from the arid southwestern margins of the us mexico borderlands now in against the american grain gary paul nabhan cultural ecologist environmental historian and lyric poet of the american southwest illuminates the outlines of a history too long in the shadows whether indigenous latinx priests nuns quakers or cross cultural chameleons it is the resisters performers grassroots organizers nomads and spiritual leaders from the desert margins who are constantly reshaping america they have against all odds recolored and recovered the future of north america through outrageous acts of resistance after reading the stories of estevanico el moro maria de Ágreda teresita de cábora coyote iguana woody guthrie tim x hernandez cesar chavez dolores huerta reyes lopez tijerana arturo sandoval lalo guererro john fife danny and luis valdez john steinbeck and ed ricketts and many more we can never think about america the same way again in nabhan s magisterial radical recounting cross cultural collaborations have changed the grain of american life to one that is many colored once again flourishing with fragrance faith and fecund ideas

even as a teenager joseph albert calamia understood the need to live by the rule of law in high school a class bullys continual harassment of a skinny hispanic kid led joseph to confront him but he wisely did so with the coachs permission challenging the boy to a boxing match the tormentor went down quickly and calamia settled the score under the jurisdiction of the high school coach calamia began his career as a criminal defense attorney in el paso texas in 1949 he was a crusader for justice considered by many to be akin to don quixote tilting at windmills but he disagreed the big difference is that my demons were real his demons were the institutionalized practices that favored expediency over the rights of individuals he spent his lifetime fighting to ensure peoples rights were not trampled by law makers and enforcers a world war ii veteran calamia grew up in el pasos segundo barrio a few blocks from the rio grande river that separated mexico from the united states he grew up in a world that expected those of mexican descent to maintain their inferior status but he couldnt stand by and let injustice occur without a fight over the course of his long career calamia successfully challenged a host of attacks against civil liberties including police undercover tactics and the constitutionality of searches and seizures in drug immigration and other cases published as part of hispanic civil rights series this enlightening book documents the efforts of one man who

devoted his life to protecting the constitution and the bill of rights
