you re just a freak you re just a stupid freak freaks don t speak freaks shouldn t speak don t talk out of your head or theswirly clouds will eat you because sometimes clouds have teeth jason s best friend sunshine has vanished if only jason could push through all the voices in his head he d know what happened he d tell everyone he d find her but then people don t always listen to kids like jason a funny and compelling thriller about a boy on the edge of mainstream society

a noir classic about the era of the sideshow when freaks were the star attraction respected and revered by other carnival members their stories are frankly and tenderly told by an author who lived and worked as a carny

from the monster of ravenna to the elephant man myra hindley and ted bundy the visualisation of real human monsters has always played a part in how society sees itself but what is the function of a monster why do we need to embody and represent what is monstrous this book investigates the appearance of the human monster in western culture both historically and in our contemporary society it argues that images of real rather than fictional human monsters help us both to identify and to interrogate what constitutes normality we construct what is acceptable in humanity by depicting what is not quite acceptable by exploring theories and examples of abnormality freakishness madness otherness and identification alexa wright demonstrates how monstrosity and the

monster are social and cultural constructs however it soon becomes clear that the social function of the monster however altered a form it takes remains constant it is societal self defence allowing us to keep perceived monstrosity at a distance through engaging with the work of michel foucault julia kristeva and canguilhem to name but a few wright scrutinises and critiques the history of a mode of thinking she reassesses and explodes conventional concepts of identity obscuring the boundaries between what is normal and what is not

in recent years the body has become one of the most popular areas of study in the arts social sciences and humanities transgressive bodies offers an examination of a variety of non normative bodies and how they are represented in film media and popular culture examining the non normative body in a cultural studies context this book reconsiders the concept of the transgressive body establishing its status as a culturally mutable term arguing that popular cultural representations create the transgressive or freak body and then proceed to either contain its threat or exploit it through studies of extreme bodybuilding obesity disability and transsexed bodies it examines the implications of such transgressive bodies for gender politics and sexuality transgressive bodies engages with contemporary cultural debates always relating these to concrete studies of media and cultural representations this book will therefore appeal to scholars across a range of disciplines including media and film studies cultural studies gender studies sociology sports studies and cultural theory

this book explores the video game metal gear solid v s exploration of trauma and posttraumatic stress disorder ptsd through a careful analysis of its thematic elements and characters it also considers the game s complex take on post 9 11 history metal gear solid v consists of two interrelated titles ground zeroes and the phantom pain ground zeroes is examined as a post 9 11 narrative exploring america s use of Guantanamo Bay and the extraordinary rendition program as tools in the war on terror the phantom pain is examined as a work exploring post 9 11 in trauma especially in returning soldiers the characters appearing in both games are given substantial consideration and analysis as embodiments of different forms of ptsd and trauma this book appeals especially to those interested in video game study to those who are enthusiasts of video games and those interested in post 9 11 narratives

if you re up 16 000 at the casino and missing dinner with the woman you love how do you find the strength to drive away if you give up your career and your beautiful wife and find yourself drinking vodka and fixing cars for a living is that necessarily a step down in hush hush steven barthelme gives us a simultaneously twisted heartbreaking and hilarious account of learning to quit when you re ahead the collection which includes the pushcart prize winning clare exposes the surprising dignity in lying on your belly in the pouring rain in ringing your ex girlfriend s doorbell at 4 a m in sleeping with your dead wife s best friend co author with his brother frederick of the brilliant and devastating casino memoir double down reflections on gambling and loss steven barthelme seems to cast an eye at his own history and the characters he s known these are men and women who are down but

stirring not quite out an unmissable arresting book from one of the most seminal short story writers of the last twenty years

from 1840 until 1940 freak shows by the hundreds crisscrossed the united states from the smallest towns to the largest cities exhibiting their casts of dwarfs giants siamese twins bearded ladies savages snake charmers fire eaters and other oddities by today s standards such displays would be considered cruel and exploitative the pornography of disability yet for one hundred years the freak show was widely accepted as one of america s most popular forms of entertainment robert bogdan s fascinating social history brings to life the world of the freak show and explores the culture that nurtured and later abandoned it in uncovering this neglected chapter of show business he describes in detail the flimflam artistry behind the shows the promoters and the audiences and the gradual evolution of public opinion from awe to embarrassment freaks were not born bogdan reveals they were manufactured by the amusement world usually with the active participation of the freaks themselves many of the human curiosities found fame and fortune becoming the celebrities of their time until the ascent of professional medicine transformed them from marvels into pathological specimans

texting olivia is a funny fast paced modern take on the epistolary novel using phone texts and calls instead of letters as the main form of communication fay is a paralegal in her forties with thwarted career ambitions which she blames on her mother indeed she has done almost everything opposite to her own upbringing in raising olivia but fay s assumptions about what it means to be a good mother and also a good daughter are put to the test when she and her husband take a madcap trip from new jersey to san francisco to help olivia move out of her dorm

a groundbreaking anthology that probes the disposition towards the visually different giants midgets tribal non westerners the very fat the very thin hermaphrodites conjoined twins the disabled the very hirsute in american history all have shared the platform equally as freaks human oddities their only commonality their assigned role of anomalous other to the gathered throngs for the price of a ticket freak shows offered spectators an icon of bodily otherness whose difference from them secured their own membership in a common american identity by comparison ordinary tractable normal rosemarie thomson s groundbreaking anthology probes america s disposition toward the visually different the book s essays fall into four main categories historical explorations of american freak shows in the era of p t barnum the articulation of the freak in literary and textual discourses contemporary relocations of freak shows and theoretical analyses of freak culture essays address such diverse topics as american colonialism and public presentations of natives laughing gas demonstrations in the 1840 s shirley temple and tom thumb todd browning s landmark movie freaks bodybuilders as postmodern freaks freaks in star trek michael jackson s identification with the elephant man and the modern talk show as a reconfiguration of the freak show in her introduction thomson traces the freak show from antiquity to the modern period and explores the constitutive political and textual

properties of such exhibits freakery is a fresh insightful exploration of a heretofore neglected aspect of american mass culture

we know all kinds of monsters vampires who suck human blood werewolves who harass tourists in london or paris zombies who long to feast on our brains or godzilla who is famous in and outside of japan for destroying whole cities at once regardless of their monstrosity all of these creatures are figments of the human mind and as real as they may seem monsters are and always have been constructed by human beings in other words

they are imagined how they are imagined however depends on many different aspects and changes throughout history the present volume provides an insight into the construction of monstrosity in different kinds of media including literature film and tv series it will show how and by whom monsters are really created how time changes the perception of monsters and what characterizes specific monstrosities in their specific historical contexts the book will provide valuable insights for scholars in different fields whose interest focuses on either media studies or history

in 1881 the chicago city code read any person who is diseased maimed mutilated or in any way deformed shall not expose himself to public view these ugly laws began in san francisco in 1867 then spread through the u s and abroad many in the u s weren t repealed until the 1970s english professor schweik a gulf so deeply cut american women poets and the second world war co director of uc berkley s disabilities studies program explores the emergence of these laws and their tragic consequences for thousands motivated largely by the desire to reduce beggar populations and to expand the role of charitable organizations in practical terms the ugly laws meant harsh policing antibegging systematized suspicion and structural and institutional repulsion of disabled people schweik discusses the nineteenth century conditions that created a demand for these laws but notes how the resulting practices have carried through to the present schweik draws on a deep index of resources from legal proceedings to out of print books to tell the story of individuals long lost to history her detailed analysis will be of primary interest to those involved with the history of social justice in the u s and the passage of the americans with disabilities act 18  
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argues against name calling and labelling people by providing examples of biblical characters who could have been called such names as jocks dorks slackers airheads and wimps but whom god used to fulfill his plans nonetheless

looming onto the television landscape in 2011 american horror story gave viewers a weekly dose of psychological unease and gruesome violence embracing the familiar horror conventions of spooky settings unnerving manifestations and terrifying monsters series co creators ryan murphy and brad falchuk combine shocking visual effects with an engaging anthology format to provide a modern take on the horror genre this collection of new essays examines the series contribution to television horror focusing on how the show speaks to social concerns its use of classic horror tropes and its reinvention of the tale of terror for the 21st century

there is growing recognition and understanding of music s fundamentally spatial natures with significances of space found both in the immediacy of musical practices and in connection to broader identities and ideas around music whereas previous publications have looked at connections between music and space through singular lenses such as how they are linked to ethnic identities or how musical images of a city are constructed this book sets out to explore intersections between multiple scales and kinds of musical spaces it complements the investigation of broader power structures and place based identities by a detailed focus on the moments of music making and musical environments revealing the mutual shaping of these levels the book overcomes a eurocentric focus on a typically narrow range of musics especially european and north american classical and popular forms with case studies on a diverse set of genres and global contexts inspiring a range of ethnographic text based historical and practice based approaches

this book sheds light on how the public engage with make sense of and discursively evaluate news media constructions of people from asylum seeking backgrounds as a case study the author discusses her recent research combining critical discourse analysis with a cultural studies audience reception framework to examine the perspectives of 24 western australians who took part in semi structured interviews during their interviews participants were asked open ended questions about their general views on people seeking asylum including australia s policy responses their media engagement habits and preferences and their views concerning how the australian media represents people seeking asylum the author compares and contrasts this research with broader interdisciplinary discussion and the book will therefore appeal to students and scholars of migration political communication sociology audience reception critical media studies and sociolinguistics

this is a collection of essays that analyze the presence of ableism in superhero narratives from television shows films and comics contributors use critical disability studies media

studies cultural studies and other interdisciplinary fields to unveil the misinformation stigma and exclusion caused by ableist representations of disability or disability related experiences ableism is unmasked in media franchises such as dc comics marvel sesame street and more these essays go beyond what is currently available in critical disability superhero studies and explore both the well known and lesser known characters including iron man daredevil dr strange thor nick fury jessica jones war machine wonder woman dr poison the joker bucky barnes punisher rocket and groot luke cage captain america and sesame street s super grover they also offer insightful intersectional analyses of entire series films and shows such as arrowverse and the ables

what is freak kitchen and where do they come from anyone hearing the band s trademark eclectic heavy metal is bound to ask the same questions the lyrics do not even remotely resemble anything you ever heard before satire humor and attitude blend together in something quite out of the ordinary let s put it this way how many other major rock acts have you heard discussing topics such as infidelity organ transplant trading anal bleaching and neo nazism among soccer mums to some of the grooviest metal anthems ever heard the music is straightforward to the ear yet infinitely intricate to the mind borrowing influences from all over the world in a way we haven t heard since the late frank zappa roamed the earth mattias ia eklund is certainly a driving force the guitarman and singer who gave a whole new meaning to the expression go your own way but nothing happens without the entire trinity of björn christer and mattias on the wagon and in this massively well researched biography by seasoned metal journalist Åsa anastasia jonsÃ n you get to follow the freak in detail from day one youtube com watch v 5fzid9e2eoq

a wide ranging collection of essays on millennial american culture that marshals a vast pop vocabulary with easy wit the new york times book review from the far left to the far right on talk radio and the op ed page more and more americans believe that the social fabric is unraveling celebrity worship and media frenzy suicidal cultists and heavily armed secessionists modern life seems to have become a pyrotechnic insanitarium mark dery says borrowing a turn of the century name for coney island dery elucidates the meaning to our madness deconstructing american culture from mainstream forces like disney and nike to fringe phenomena like the unabomber and alien invaders our millennial angst he argues is a product of a pervasive cultural anxiety a combination of the social and economic upheaval wrought by global capitalism and the paranoia fanned by media sensationalism the pyrotechnic insanitarium is a theme park ride through the extremes of american culture of which the atlantic has written mark dery confirms once again what writers and thinkers as disparate as nathanael west fyodor dostoyevsky sigmund freud and oliver sacks have already shown us the best place to explore the human condition is at its outer margins its pathological extremes dery is the kind of critic who just might give conspiracy theory a good name wired

what if you were god of a universe and didn t even know it bucky butler is a young author who discovers a universe that is the home of every character that he had ever created

from his books these characters call him god in the lost worlds of buckstevenson now bucky must save every single world in his universe in a matter of days he ll have the help of not only his good characters but also the help of his friends and family from the real world read how bucky has to stop the evil characters he created from taking over the lost worlds of buckstevenson if he fails to stop them the universe will turn into nothing but darkness in this series of adventures bucky realizes that he must become the hero he always wanted to be

freaks in late modernist american culture explores the emergence of what nancy bombaci terms late modernist freakish aesthetics a creative fusion of high and low themes and forms in relation to distorted bodies literary and cinematic texts about freaks by nathanael west djuna barnes tod browning and carson mccullers subvert and reinvent modern progress narratives in order to challenge high modernist literary and social ideologies these works are marked by an acceptance of the disteleology anarchy and degeneration that racist discourses of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries associated with racial and ethnic outsiders particularly jews in a period of american culture beset with increasing pressures for social and political conformity and with the threat of fascism from europe these late modernist narratives about freaks defy oppressive norms and values as they search for an anarchic and transformational creativity

this collection of 19 new essays by 21 authors from the united states the uk canada australia and india focuses on contemporary film and television 1989 to the present from those countries as well as from china korea thailand and france the essays are divided into two parts the first includes critical readings of narrative film and television the second includes contributions on documentaries biopics and autobiographically informed films the book as a whole is designed to be accessible to readers new to disability studies while also contributing significantly to the field an introduction gives background on disability studies and appendices provide a filmography and a list of suggested reading

the central character's struggle in coming to terms with an issue and growing in response to their difficulties annotated bibliographies of other works both fiction and nonfiction explore these same issues give readers insight into helping teenagers with similar problems and provide the tools with which to get teenagers reading and addressing these problems

this book is exactly what it says a book of last resort but if you're an artist toiling without traction it may be time for something different fifteen years in the making the book of last resort is jon reed's hand crafted love letter to all the artists who aren't where they want to be creatively or financially the goal turning hard truths about the digital economy into a methodology that artists can use is free content a potent marketing tactic or a trap how do you effectively build an online audience as exclusionary algorithms cater to deep pockets or push vacantly viral memes until you unravel your creative identity success is a trap but your true creative power is found in your scars and imperfections that you might try to mask over open up read on and channel these bittersweet insights into the creative expression that will change the terms of your existence and yes this book does address the impact of ai on your creative pursuits ai is an unfolding part of this story that will pose additional obstacles to creators both in terms of finding audiences and monetization ai will also impact the jobs outlook as well however ai may end up increasing your audience's craving for the brave uniquely human aspect of creation jon advocates for in the book of last resort

telling an american horror story collects essays from new and established critics looking at the many ways the horror anthology series intersects with and comments on contemporary american social political and popular culture divided into three sections the chapters apply a cultural criticism framework to examine how the first eight seasons of ahs engage with american history our contemporary ideologies and social policies part i explores the historical context and the uniquely american folklore that ahs evokes from the southern gothic themes of coven to connections between apocalypse and anxieties of

modern american youth part ii contains interpretations of place and setting that mark the various seasons of the anthology finally part iii examines how the series confronts notions of individual and social identity like the portrayals of destructive leadership in cult and lesbian representation in asylum and hotel

the first critical study of personal narrative by women with disabilities unruly bodies examines how contemporary writers use life writing to challenge cultural stereotypes about disability gender embodiment and identity combining the analyses of disability and feminist theories susannah mintz discusses the work of eight american autobiographers nancy mairs lucy grealy georgina kleege connie panzarino eli clare anne finger denise sherer jacobson and may sarton mintz shows that by refusing inspirational rhetoric or triumph over adversity narrative patterns these authors insist on their disabilities as a core but not diminishing aspect of identity they offer candid portrayals of shame and painful medical procedures struggles for the right to work or to parent the inventive joys of disabled sex the support and the hostility of family and the losses and rewards of aging mintz demonstrates how these unconventional stories challenge feminist idealizations of independence and self control and expand the parameters of what counts as a life worthy of both narration and political activism unruly bodies also suggests that atypical life stories can redefine the relation between embodiment and identity generally

they ll chase you they ll rip you open they ll feed on you the enemy book 1 when the sickness came every parent police officer politician every adult fell ill the lucky ones died the others are crazed confused and hungry only children under fourteen remain and they re fighting to survive a gang of children begin their quest across london where all through the city down alleyways in deserted houses underground the grown ups lie in wait the dead book 2 jack and ed are best friends but their battle to stay alive tests their friendship to the limit as they go on the run with a mismatched group of other kids and one adult greg a butcher who claims he s immune to the disease as a fresh disaster threatens to overwhelm london they realize they won t all survive the fear book 3 dognut and the rest of his crew want to find their lost friends and set off on a deadly mission from the tower of london to buckingham palace and beyond as the sickos lie in wait but who are their friends and who is the enemy in this changed world
