this book examines some of the oldest preserved texts on dreams such as artemidorus oneirocritica sigmund freud s favourite ancient dream theorist and dream books by aristotle the grandfather of modern dream theory

challenging the longstanding interpretation of the early english public sphere as polite inclusive and egalitarian this book re interprets key texts by representative male authors from the period addison steele shaftesbury and richardson as reactionary responses to the widely consumed and surprisingly subversive work of women writers such as mary astell delarivier manley and eliza haywood whose political and journalistic texts have up until now received little scholarly consideration by analyzing a wide range of materials produced between the 1690s to the 1750s pollock exposes a literary marketplace characterized less by cool rational discourse and genial consensus than by vehement contestation and struggles for cultural authority particularly in debates concerning the proper extent of women s participation in english public life utilizing innovative methods of research and analysis the book reveals that even at its moment of inception there was an immanent critique of the early liberal public sphere being articulated by women writers who were keenly aware of the hierarchies and techniques of exclusion that contradicted their culture s oft repeated appeals to the principles of equality and universality

fictions of fact and value looks at logical positivism s major influence on the development of postwar american fiction charting a literary and philosophical genealogy that has been absent from criticism on the american novel since 1945

desire and domestic fiction argues that far from being removed from historical events novels by writers from richardson to woolf were themselves agents of the rise of the middle class drawing on texts that range from 18th century female conduct books and contract theory to modern psychoanalytic case histories and theories of reading armstrong shows that the emergence of a particular form of female subjectivity capable of reigning over the household paved the way for the establishment of institutions which today are accepted centers of political power neither passive subjects nor embattled rebels the middle class women who were authors and subjects of the major tradition of british fiction were among the forgers of a new form of power that worked in and through their writing to replace prevailing notions of identity with a gender determined subjectivity she also examines the works of such novelists as richardson jane austen and the bront s to reveal the ways in which these authors rewrite the domestic practices and sexual relations of the past to create the historical context through which modern institutional power would seem not only natural but also humane and therefore to be desired

the impact of malaria on humankind has been profound focusing on depictions of this iconic disease of empire in nineteenth century and postcolonial fiction jessica howell shows that authors such as charles dickens henry james h rider haggard olive schreiner and rudyard kipling did not simply adopt the discourses of malarial containment and cure offered by colonial medicine instead these authors adapted and rewrote some common associations with malarial images such as swamps ruins mosquitoes blood and fever they also made use of the unique potential of fiction by incorporating chronic cyclical illness bodily transformation and adaptation within the very structures of their novels howell s study also examines the postcolonial literature of amitav ghosh and derek walcott arguing that these authors use the multivalent and subversive potential of malaria in order to rewrite the legacies of colonial medicine

howard phillips lovecraft was an american writer of weird fiction and horror fiction born in providence rhode island he spent most of his life there and his fiction was primarily set against a new england backdrop lovecraft was virtually unknown during his lifetime and published only in pulp magazines before he died in poverty but is now regarded as one of the most significant 20th century authors of weird and horror fiction
