what is a literature review different orientations to a literature review choosing a review topic and formulating a research question locating and organizing research

sources selecting analyzing and keeping notes of sources evaluating research articles structuring and organizing the literature review developing arguments and supporting claims synthesizing and interpreting the literature the writer voice and the writing process acknowledging sources citations quotations and plagiarism putting it all together

but also intensive use of endangered areas are seen as possible causes for extreme events it s challenging to predict extreme events so potential natural hazards can easily turn into natural disasters after their occurrence this applies in particular to highly exposed regions such as the alpine region this work deals with meteorological hydrological gravitational glacial and periglacial and other extreme events as well as relevant social aspects in the austrian alpine region
