each year thousands of communities across the united states celebrate their ethnic heritages values and identities through the medium of festivals drawing together elements of ethnic pride nostalgia religious values economic motives cultural memory and a spirit of celebration these festivals are performances that promote and preserve a community s unique identity and heritage while at the same time attempting to place the ethnic community within the larger american experience although these aims are pervasive across ethnic heritage celebrations two festivals that appear similar may nevertheless serve radically different social and political aims accordingly the dutch american identity examines five dutch american festivals three of which are among the oldest ethnic heritage festivals in the united states in order to determine what such festivals mean and do for the staging communities although dutch americans were historically among the first ethnic groups to stage ethnic heritage festivals designed to attract outside audiences and despite the fact that several dutch american festivals have met with sustained success little scholarship has focused on this ethnic group s festivals moreover studies that have considered festivals staged by communities of european descent have typically focused on a single festival the dutch american identity thus on the one hand seeks to call attention to the historical development and current sociocultural significance of dutch american heritage festivals on the other hand this study aims to elucidate the ties that bind the five communities that stage these festivals together rather than studying one festival in isolation from the others creatively combining several methodologies the dutch american identity describes and analyzes how the social political and ethical values of the five communities are expressed performed acted out represented costumed and displayed in their respective festivals rather than relying on

familiar even stereotypical notions of the midwest rural america conservative america etc that often appear in contemporary political discourse schoone jongen shows just how complex and contradictory these festivals are in the ways they represent each community at the same time by placing these festivals within the context of american history schoone jongen also demonstrates how and why each festival is a microcosm of particular cultural social and political developments in modern america the dutch american identity is an important book for sociology performance studies folklore immigration history anthropology and cultural history collections

on may 10 1776 the second continental congress sitting in philadelphia adopted a resolution which set in motion a round of constitution making in the colonies several of which soon declared themselves sovereign states and severed all remaining ties to the british crown in forming these written constitutions the delegates to the state conventions were forced to address the issue of church state relations each colony had unique and differing traditions of church state relations rooted in the colony s peoples their country of origin and religion this definitive volume comprising twenty one original essays by eminent historians and political scientists is a comprehensive state by state account of disestablishment in the original thirteen states as well as a look at similar events in the soon to be admitted states of vermont tennessee and kentucky also considered are disestablishment in ohio the first state admitted from the northwest territory louisiana and missouri the first states admitted from the louisiana purchase and florida wrestled from spain under u s pressure the volume makes a unique scholarly contribution by recounting in detail the process of disestablishment in each of the colonies as well as religion s constitutional and legal place in the new states of the federal republic

from its earliest days under english rule new york city had an unusually diverse ethnic makeup with substantial numbers of dutch english scottish irish french german and jewish immigrants as well as a large african american population joyce goodfriend paints a vivid portrait of this society exploring the meaning of ethnicity in early america and showing how colonial settlers of varying backgrounds worked out a basis for coexistence she argues that contrary to the prevalent notion of rapid anglicization ethnicity proved an enduring force in this small urban society well into the eighteenth century

in the lost soul of american protestantism d g hart examines the historical origins of the idea that faith must be socially useful in order to be valuable through specific episodes in presbyterian lutheran and reformed history hart presents a neglected form of protestantism confessionalism as an alternative to prevailing religious theory he explains that unlike evangelical and mainline protestants who emphasize faith's role in solving social and personal problems confessional protestants locate christianity's significance in the creeds ministry and rituals of the church although critics have accused confessionalism of encouraging social apathy hart deftly argues that this form of protestantism has much to contribute to current discussions on the role of religion in american public life since confessionalism refuses to confuse the well being of the nation with that of the church the history of confessional protestantism suggests that contrary to the legacy of revivalism faith may be most vital and influential when less directly relevant to everyday problems whether personal or social clear and engaging d g hart's groundbreaking study is essential reading for everyone exploring the intersection of religion and daily life

the subject of religious liberty in the nineteenth century has been defined by a liberal narrative that has prevailed since mill and macaulay to trevelyan and commager to name only a few philosophers and historians who wrote in english underlying this narrative is a noble dream liberty for every person guaranteed by democratic states that promote social progress though not interfering with those broadly defined areas of life including religion that are properly the preserve of free individuals at the end of the twentieth century however it becomes clear that religious liberty requires a more comprehensive subtle and complex definition than the liberal tradition affords one that confronts such questions as gender ethnicity and the distinction between individual and corporate liberty none of the authors in this volume finds the familiar liberal narrative an adequate interpretive context for understanding his particular subject some address the liberal tradition directly and propose modified versions others approach it implicitly all revise it and all revise in ways that echo across the chapters the topics covered are religious

winner of the 2017 hendricks award presented by the new netherland institute in 1678 seven french speaking protestant families established the village of new paltz in the hudson river valley of new york life on the edge of european settlement presented many challenges but a particular challenge for these ethnic walloon families originally from the southern spanish netherlands was that they lived in a dutch cultural region in an english colony in set in stone kenneth shefsiek explores how the founders and their descendants reacted to and perpetuated this multiethnic cultural environment for generations as the founding families controlled their town economically and politically they creatively and selectively blended the cultures available to them they allowed their walloon culture to slip away early in the village s history but they continued to combine dutch and english cultures for more than 150 years when they finally abandoned the last vestiges of dutch culture in the early nineteenth century they did so just as descendants of english colonists began to claim that the national commitment to liberty and freedom was grounded in the nation s english heritage not willing to be marginalized descendants of the new paltz walloons constructed an alternative national narrative placing their ancestors at the very center of the american story

in early modern times religious affiliation was often communicated through bodily practices despite various attempts at definition these practices remained extremely fluid and lent themselves to individual appropriation and to evasion of church and state control because bodily practices prompted much debate they serve as a useful starting point for examining denominational divisions allowing scholars to explore the actions of smaller and more radical divergent groups the focus on bodies and conflicts over bodily practices are the starting point for the contributors to this volume who depart from established national and denominational historiographies to probe the often ambiguous phenomena occurring at the interstices of confessional boundaries in this way the authors examine a variety of religious living conditions socio cultural groups and spiritual networks of early modern europe and the americas the cases gathered here skillfully demonstrate the diverse ways in which regional and local differences affected the interpretation of bodily signs this book will appeal to scholars and students of early modern europe and the americas as well as those interested in religious and gender history and the history of dissent

examines the interdenominational pursuits of the american presbyterian church from 1758 to 1801 in unity in christ and country american presbyterians in the revolutionary era 1758 1801 william harrison taylor investigates the american presbyterian church s pursuit of christian unity and demonstrates how through this effort the church helped to shape the issues that gripped the american imagination including evangelism the conflict with great britain slavery nationalism and sectionalism when the colonial presbyterian church reunited in 1758 a nearly twenty year schism was brought to an end to aid in reconciling the factions church leaders called for presbyterians to work more closely with other christian denominations their ultimate goal was to heal divisions not just within their own faith but also within colonial north america as a whole taylor contends that a self imposed interdenominational transformation began in the american presbyterian church upon its reunion in 1758 however this process was altered by the church s experience during the american revolution which resulted in goals of christian unity that had both spiritual and national objectives nonetheless by the end of the century even as the leaders in the presbyterian church strove for unity in christ and country fissures began to develop in the church that would one day divide it and further the sectional rift that would lead to the civil war taylor engages a variety of sources including the published and unpublished works of both the synods of new york and philadelphia and the general assembly of the presbyterian church in the united states as well as numerous published and unpublished presbyterian sermons lectures hymnals poetry and letters scholars of religious history particularly those interested in the reformed tradition and specifically presbyterianism should find unity in christ and country useful as a way to consider the importance of the theology s intellectual and pragmatic implications for members of the faith

the first major study since the 1930s of the relationship between american transcendentalism and

asian religions and the first comprehensive work to include post civil war transcendentalists like samuel johnson this book is encyclopedic in scope beginning with the inception of transcendentalist orientalism in europe versluis covers the entire history of american transcendentalism into the twentieth century and the profound influence of orientalism on the movement including its analogues and influences in world religious dialogue he examines what he calls positive orientalism which recognizes the value and perennial truths in asian religions and cultures not only in the writings of major figures like thoreau and emerson but also in contemporary popular magazines versluis s exploration of the impact of transcendentalism on the twentieth century study of comparative religions has ramifications for the study of religious history comparative religion literature politics history and art history

this thought provoking study examines an apparent paradox in the history of american protestant evangelical religion fervent believers who devoted themselves completely to the challenges of making a christian life who longed to know god s rapturous love all too often languished in despair feeling forsaken by god indeed some individuals became obsessed by guilt terror of damnation and the idea that they had committed an unpardonable sin ironically those most devoted to fostering the soul s maturation seemingly neglected the well being of the psyche drawing upon many sources including unpublished diaries spiritual narratives and case studies of patients treated in nineteenth century asylums julius rubin thoroughly explores religious melancholy as a distinctive stance toward life a grieving over the loss of god s love and an obsession and psycho pathology associated with the spiritual itinerary of conversion the varieties of this spiritual sickness include sinners who would fast unto death evangelical anorexia nervosa religious suicides and those obsessed with unpardonable sin from colonial puritans like michael wigglesworth to contemporary evangelicals like billy graham rubin shows that religious melancholy has shaped the experience of self and identity for those who sought rebirth as children of god religious melancholy and protestant experience in america offers a fresh and revealing look at a widely recognized phenomenon it will be of interest to scholars and students of religious studies american history psychology and sociology of religion

religious life in early america is often equated with the fire and brimstone puritanism best embodied by the theology of cotton mather yet by the nineteenth century american theology had

shifted dramatically away from the severe european traditions directly descended from the protestant reformation of which puritanism was in the united states the most influential in its place arose a singularly american set of beliefs in america s god mark noll has written a biography of this new american ethos in the 125 years preceding the outbreak of the civil war theology played an extraordinarily important role in american public and private life its evolution had a profound impact on america s self definition the changes taking place in american theology during this period were marked by heightened spiritual inwardness a new confidence in individual reason and an attentiveness to the economic and market realities of western life vividly set in the social and political events of the age america s god is replete with the figures who made up the early american intellectual landscape from theologians such as jonathan edwards nathaniel w taylor william ellery channing and charles hodge and religiously inspired writers such as harriet beecher stowe and catherine stowe to dominant political leaders of the day like washington jefferson and lincoln the contributions of these thinkers combined with the religious revival of the 1740s colonial warfare with france the consuming struggle for independence and the rise of evangelical protestantism to form a common intellectual coinage based on a rising republicanism and commonsense principles as this christian republicanism affirmed itself it imbued in dedicated christians a conviction that the bible supported their beliefs over those of all others tragically this sense of religious purpose set the stage for the civil war as the conviction of christians both north and south that god was on their side served to deepen a schism that would soon rend the young nation asunder mark noll has given us the definitive history of christian theology in america from the time of jonathan edwards to the presidency of abraham lincoln it is a story of a flexible and creative theological energy that over time forged a guiding national ideology the legacies of which remain with us to this day

how did the constitutional framers envision the role of religion in american public life did they think that the government had the right to advance or support religion and religious activities or did they believe that the two realms should remain forever separate throughout american history

scholars supreme court justices and members of the american public have debated these questions the debate continues to have significance in the present day especially in regard to public schools government aid to sectarian education and the use of public property for religious symbols in this book derek hamilton davis offers the first comprehensive examination of the role of religion in the proceedings theories ideas and goals of the continental congress those who argue that the united states was founded as a christian nation have made much of the religiosity of the founders particularly as it was manifested in the ritual invocations of a clearly christian god as well as in the adoption of practices such as government sanctioned days of fasting and thanksgiving prayers and preaching before legislative bodies and the appointments of chaplains to the army davis looks at the fifteen year experience of the continental congress 1774 1789 and arrives at a contrary conclusion namely that the revolutionaries did not seek to entrench religion in the federal state congress s religious activities he shows expressed a genuine but often unreflective popular piety indeed the whole point of the revolution was to distinguish society the people in its sovereign majesty from its government a religious people would jealously guard its own sovereignty and the sovereignty of god by preventing republican rulers from pretending to any authority over religion the idea that a modern nation could be premised on expressly theological foundations davis argues was utterly antithetical to the thinking of most revolutionaries

the eighteen essays collected in this book originate from a conference of the same title held at the wingspread conference center in october of 1993 leading scholars were invited to reflect on their specialties in american religious history in ways that summarized both where the field is and where it ought to move in the decades to come the essays are organized according to four general themes places and regions universal themes transformative events and marginal groups and ethnocultural outsiders they address a wide range of specific topics including puritanism protestantism and economic behavior gender and sexuality in american protestantism and the twentieth century de christianization of american public culture among the contributors are such distinguished scholars as david d hall donald g matthews allen c guelzo gordon s wood daniel walker howe robert wuthnow jon butler david a hollinger harry s stout and john higham taken together these essays reveal a rapidly expanding field of study that is breaking out of its traditional confines and spilling into all of american history the book takes the measure of the changes of the last quarter century and charts numerous challenges to future work

studies the development of religious congregations in lancaster pennsylvania from 1730 to 1820 focuses on german reformed lutherans moravians anglicans and presbyterians also examines how roman catholics jews and african americans were absorbed into this predominantly white protestant society provided by publisher

this collection explores different approaches to contextualizing and conceptualizing the history of pietism particularly pietistic groups who migrated from central europe to the british colonies

in north america during the long eighteenth century emerging in german speaking lands during the seventeenth century pietism was closely related to puritanism sharing similar evangelical and heterogeneous characteristics dissatisfied with the established lutheran and reformed churches pietists sought to revivify christianity through godly living biblical devotion millennialism and the establishment of new forms of religious association as pietism represents a diverse set of impulses rather than a centrally organized movement there were inevitably fundamental differences amongst pietist groups and these differences and conflicts were carried with those that emigrated to the new world the importance of pietism in shaping protestant society and culture in europe and north america has long been recognized but as a topic of scholarly inquiry it has until now received little interdisciplinary attention offering essays by leading scholars from a range of fields this volume provides an interdisciplinary overview of the subject beginning with discussions about the definition of pietism the collection next looks at the social political and cultural dimensions of pietism in german speaking europe this is then followed by a section investigating the attempts by german pietists to establish new religiously based communities in north america the collection concludes with discussions on new directions in pietist research together these essays help situate pietism in the broader atlantic context making an important contribution to understanding religious life in europe and colonial north america during the eighteenth century
