a new biography of the intellectual father of southern secession the man who set the scene for the civil war and whose political legacy

still shapes america today john c calhoun is among the most notorious and enigmatic figures in american political history first elected to congress in 1810 calhoun went on to serve as secretary of war and vice president but he is perhaps most known for arguing in favor of slavery as a positive good and for his famous doctrine of state interposition which laid the groundwork for the south to secede from the union and arguably set the nation on course for civil war calhoun has catapulted back into the public eye in recent years as some observers connected the strain of radical politics he developed to the tactics and extremism of the modern far right and as protests over racial injustice have focused on his legacy in this revelatory biographical study historian robert elder shows that calhoun is even more broadly significant than these events suggest and that his story is crucial for understanding the political climate in which we find ourselves today by excising calhoun from the mainstream of american history he argues we have been left with a distorted understanding of our past and no way to explain our present

bestselling author and radio host michael medved recounts some of the most significant events in america s rise to prosperity and power from the writing of the constitution to the civil war he reveals a record of improbabilities and amazements that demonstrate what the founders always believed that events unfolded according to a master plan with destiny playing an unmistakable role in lifting the nation to greatness among the stirring illogical episodes described here a band of desperate religious refugees find themselves blown hopelessly off course only to be deposited at the one spot on a wild continent best suited for their survival george washington s beaten army surrounded by a ruthless foe and on the verge of annihilation manages an impossible escape due to a freakish change in the weather a famous conqueror known for seizing territory frustrated by a slave rebellion and a frozen harbor impulsively hands thomas jefferson a tract of land that doubles the size of the united states a weary soldier picks up three cigars left behind in an open field and notices the stogies have been wrapped in a handwritten description of the enemy s secret battle plans a revelation that gives lincoln the supernatural sign he s awaited in order to free the slaves when millions worry over the nation losing its way medved s sweeping narrative bursting with dramatic events and lively portraits of unforgettable occasionally little known characters affirms america as fortune s favorite shaped by a distinctive destiny from our beginnings to the present day

winner clotilde p garcia tejano book prize the opening campaign of the us mexican war transformed the map of each nation and shaped the course of conflict armed with a broad range of mexican military documents and previously unknown us sources douglas murphy provides the first balanced view of early battles such as palo alto and resaca de la palma he reassesses previously covered territory and also poses new questions why did mexico establish its defenses south of the rio grande while claiming territory north of the river what was mexico s strategy in the campaign against the united states what factors most affected mexico s defeat in confronting these questions murphy shows that the campaign was a complex chess match with undercurrents of political intrigue economic motivations and personal animosities as much as military action two armies on the rio grande will transform our understanding of the us mexican war

marsh of san pedro estuary and showing how the story of the port is the story of modern globalized america itself by the mid nineteenth century americans had identified the west coast as the republic s destiny a gateway to the riches of the pacific in a narrative spanning decades and stretching to washington dc the pacific northwest civil war richmond southwest deserts and even overseas to europe hawaii and asia tejani demonstrates how san pedro came to be seen as all important to the nation s future it was not virgin land but dominated by powerful mexican estates that would not be dislodged easily yet american scientists including the great surveyor george davidson imperialist politicians such as jefferson davis and william gwin and hopeful land speculators among them the future union army general edward ord would wrest control of the estuary and set the scene for the violence inequality and engineering marvels to come san pedro was no place for a harbor tejani reveals the port was carved in defiance of nature using new engineering techniques and massive mechanical dredgers business titans such as collis huntington and edward h harriman brought their money and corporate influence to the task but they were outmatched by government reformers laying the foundations for the port for the modern city of los angeles and for our globalized world interweaving the natural history of san pedro into this all too human history tejani vividly describes how a wild coast was made into the engine of american power a story of imperial dreams and personal ambition a machine to move ocean and earth is necessary reading for anyone who seeks to understand what the united states was what it is now and what it will be

the american reaper adopts a network approach to account for the international diffusion of harvesting technology from north america from the invention of the reaper through to the formation of a dominant transnational corporation international harvester much previous historical research into industrial networks focuses on industrial districts within metropolitan centres but by focusing on harvesting a typically rural technology this book is able to analyse the spread of technological knowledge through a series of local networks and across national boundaries in doing so it argues that the industry developed through a relatively stable stage from the 1850s into the 1890s during which time many firms shared knowledge within and outside the us through patent licensing to spread the diffusion of the american style of machines to establishments located around the industrial world this positive cooperation was further enhanced through sales networks that appear to be early expressions of managerial firms the book also reinterprets the rise of giant corporations especially international harvester corporation ihc arguing that mass production was achieved in chicago in the 1880s where unprecedented urban growth made possible a break with the constraints felt elsewhere in the dispersed production system it unleashed an unchecked competitive market economy with destructive tendencies throughout the transnational american reaper networks a previously stable and expanding production system this is significant because the rise of corporate capital in this industry is usually explained as an outworking of national natural advantage as an ingenious harnessing of science and technology to solve production problems and as a rational solution to the problems associated with the worst forms of unregulated competition that emerged as independent firms developed from small scale artisanal production to large scale manufacturers on their own and within the separate and isolated us economy the first study dedicated to the development and diffusion of american harvesting machine technology this book will appeal to

and fictive kinship by the early 1800s debt peonage had emerged as a secondary form of coerced servitude in the southwest augmenting indian slavery to meet increasing demand for labor while indigenous captivity has received considerable scholarly attention the widespread practice of debt peonage has been largely ignored kiser makes the case that these two intertwined systems were of not just regional but also national importance and must be understood within the context of antebellum slavery the civil war emancipation and reconstruction kiser argues that the struggle over indian captivity and debt peonage in the southwest helped both to broaden the public understanding of forced servitude in post civil war america and to expand political and judicial philosophy regarding free labor in the reunified republic borderlands of slavery emphasizes the lasting legacies of captivity and peonage in southwestern culture and society as well as in the coercive african american labor regimes in the jim crow south that persevered into the early twentieth century
