barrie gilbert s fascination with grizzly bears almost got him killed in yellowstone national park he recovered returned to fieldwork and devoted the next several decades to understanding and protecting these often maligned giants he has spent thousands of hours among wild grizzles in yosemite and yellowstone national parks alberta coastal british columbia and along brooks river in alaska s katmai national park where hundreds of people gather to watch dozens of grizzlies feast on salmon his research has centered on how bears respond to people and each other with a focus on how to keep humans and bears safe drawn from his decades of experience one of us a biologist s walk among bears explodes myths that depict grizzlies as bloodthirsty beasts that kill for pleasure and reveals the intelligent adaptable side of these astonishingly social animals he also explains their pivotal role in maintaining and protecting their fragile ecosystems accordingly gilbert pulls no punches when outlining threats to bear conservation most importantly this book extolls a new way of appreciating grizzly bears the same way we regard wolves whales chimpanzees and gorillas

this essay appeared originally in the atlantic monthly for may 1883 during the thirty years which have elapsed since it was written the manifestations of the colonial spirit then apparent in the united states have not only altered in character but i am glad to say have weakened diminished and become less noticeable since 1883 also there has been much achieved by americans in art and literature in painting in sculpture in music and particularly in architecture success in all these fields has with few exceptions been won by men working in the spirit which is not colonial but which it was the purpose of this essay to inculcate as the true one to which alone we could look for fine and enduring achievement i have called attention to the date at which the essay was written in order that those who read it may remember that it applies in certain points to the conditions of thirty years ago and not to those of the present day

beatrice edwards executive director of the organization representing edward snowden and four other nsa whistleblowers argues that we now live in a corporate security state where the government is more interested in protecting the companies that serve it than the citizens who support it hheavy domestic surveillance political persecution of dissenters the threat of indefinite detention codified into law how did we get here and is there a way out edwards details how intelligence agencies took advantage of 9 11 to illegitimately extend the government s reach corporations she shows were only too eager to sell them expensive surveillance technology as well as share data on customers and employees using the bogus threat of an imminent cyber war this is why the justice department isn t going after the institutions responsible for the financial collapse of 2008 government and business are partners in crime but edwards offers a plan to fight back and restore transparency to government keep private information private and make democracy a reality once again

how the immigration policies and popular culture of the 1980 s fused to shape modern views on democracy in the 1980s amid increasing immigration from latin america the caribbean and asia the circle of who was considered american seemed to broaden reflecting the democratic gains made by racial minorities and women although this expanded circle was increasingly visible in the daily lives of americans through tv shows films and popular news media these gains were circumscribed by the discourse that certain immigrants for instance single and working mothers were feared censured or welcomed exclusively as laborers in the cultural politics of u s immigration leah perry argues that 1980s immigration discourse in law and popular media was a crucial ingredient in the cohesion of the neoliberal idea of democracy blending critical legal analysis with a feminist media studies methodology over a range of sources including legal documents congressional debates and popular media such as golden girls who s the boss scarface and mi vida loca perry shows how even while multicultural immigrants were embraced they were at the same time disciplined through gendered discourses of respectability examining the relationship between law and culture this book weaves questions of legal status and gender into existing discussions about race and ethnicity to revise our understanding of both neoliberalism and immigration

this book carries out a comparative study of the us response to popular uprisings in the middle east as an evaluation

of president barack obama s foreign policy commitments in 2009 obama publicly pledged a new beginning in us muslim relations causing eager expectation of a clear shift in us foreign policy after the election of the 44th president of the united states however the achievement of such a shift was made particularly difficult by the existence of multiple and sometimes conflicting us interests in the region which influenced the obama administration s response to the popular uprisings in five muslim majority countries egypt bahrain yemen libya and syria after providing a detailed analysis of the traditional features of both us foreign policy rhetoric and practice this book turns its focus to the obama administration s response to the 2011 arab awakening to determine whether obama s foreign policy has indeed brought about a new beginning in us muslim relations

w e b du bois was a public intellectual sociologist and activist on behalf of the african american community he profoundly shaped black political culture in the united states through his founding role in the naacp as well as internationally through the pan african movement du bois s sociological and historical research on african american communities and culture broke ground in many areas including the history of the post civil war reconstruction period du bois was also a prolific author of novels autobiographical accounts innumerable editorials and journalistic pieces and several works of history black reconstruction in america tells and interprets the story of the twenty years of reconstruction from the point of view of newly liberated african americans though lambasted by critics at the time of its publication in 1935 black reconstruction has only grown in historical and literary importance in the 1960s it joined the canon of the most influential revisionist historical works its greatest achievement is weaving a credible lyrical historical narrative of the hostile and politically fraught years of 1860 1880 with a powerful critical analysis of the

harmful effects of democracy including jim crow laws and other injustices with a series introduction by editor henry louis gates jr and an introduction by david levering lewis this edition is essential for anyone interested in african american history

this book examines the geography of partisan polarization or the reds and blues of the political landscape in the united states it places the current schism between democrats and republicans within a historical context and presents a theoretical framework that offers unique insights into the american electorate the authors focus on the demographic and political causes of polarization at the local level across space and time this is accomplished with the aid of a comprehensive dataset that includes the presidential election results for every county in the continental united states from the advent of jacksonian democracy in 1828 to the 2016 election in addition coverage applies spatial diagnostics spatial lag models and spatial error models to determine why contemporary and historical elections in the united states have exhibited their familiar but heretofore unexplained political geography both popular observers and scholars alike have expressed concern that citizens are becoming increasingly polarized and as a consequence that democratic governance is beginning to break down this book argues that once current levels of polarization are placed within a historical context the future does not look quite so bleak overall readers will discover that partisan division is a dynamic process in large part due to the complex interplay between changing demographics and changing politics

while the natural splendor of nepal has been celebrated in many books very little of the substantial body of nepal literature has appeared in english translation himalayan voices provides admirers of nepal and lovers of literature with their first glimpse of the vibrant literary scene in nepal today an introduction to the two most developed genres of modern nepali literature poetry and the short story this work profiles eleven of nepal s most distinguished poets and offers translations of more than eighty poems written from 1916 to 1986 twenty of the most interesting and best known examples of the nepali short story are translated into english for the first time by michael hutt all provide vivid descriptions of life in twentieth century nepal although the days when nepali poets were regularly jailed for their writings have passed until 1990 the strictures of various laws governing public security and partisan political activity

still required writers and publishers to exercise a certain caution in spite of these conditions poetry in nepal remained the most vital and innovative genre in which sentiments and opinions on contemporary social and political issues were frequently expressed while the nepali short story adapted its present form only during the early 1930s it has rapidly developed a surprisingly high degree of sophistication these stories offer insights into the workings of nepali society into caste agrarian relations social change the status of women and so on such insights are more immediate than those offered by scholarly works and are conveyed by implication and assumption rather than analysis and exposition this book should appeal not only to admirers of nepal but to all readers with an interest in non western literatures himalayan voices establishes for the first time the existence of a sophisticated literary tradition in nepal and the eastern himalaya
