emphasizes the conservative bent that guided the young statesman s remarkable political evolution revealing a lincoln who was increasingly driven by his antislavery sentiments and fear for the republic in the hands of the democrats like stephen douglas as much as if not more than his own political ambition

abraham lincoln grew up with little more than a second grade education his father thought school was a waste of time and wanted young abe to learn carpentry and farming instead even so lincoln developed a love of reading so great that he would often walk five miles just to borrow a book in time his reading would help to shape a sharp mind a keen sense of humor and a kind heart lincoln carried these qualities with him from a dirt floor cabin in kentucky all the way to the white house as president he would fight to keep our country from breaking apart and he would ultimately free 4 000 000 slaves however there would be a price to pay for these triumphs a very high price indeed publisher

at his induction into the baseball hall of fame former negro league player buck leonard said now we in the negro leagues felt like we were contributing something to baseball too when we were playing we loved the game but we thought that we should have and could have made the major leagues the negro leagues had some of the best talent in baseball but from their earliest days the players were segregated from those leagues that received all the recognition this history of the negro leagues begins with the second half of the 19th century and the early attempts by african american players to be allowed to play with white teammates and progresses through the gentleman s agreement in the 1890s which kept baseball segregated the establishment of the first successful negro league in 1920 is covered and various aspects of the game for the players discussed lodgings travel accommodations families difficulties because of race off season jobs play and life in latin america in 1960 the birmingham black barons went out of business and took the negro leagues with them there are many stories of individual players owners umpires and others involved with the negro leagues in the u s and latin america along with photos appendices notes bibliography and index

how good was negro league baseball 1920 1948 some experts maintain that the quality of play was equal to that of the american and national leagues some believe the negro leagues should be part of major league baseball s official record and that more negro league players should be in the hall of fame skeptics contend that while many players could be rated highly nl organizations were minor league at best drawing on the most comprehensive data available including stats from more than 2 000 interracial games this study finds that black baseball was very good indeed negro leaguers beat the big leaguers more than half the time in head to head contests demonstrated stronger metrics within their own leagues and excelled when finally allowed into the majors the authors document the often duplicitous manner in which mlb has dealt with the legacy of the negro leagues and an appendix includes the scores and statistics from every known contest between negro league and major league teams

nebraska is not usually thought of as a focal point in the history of black baseball yet the state has seen its share of contributions to the african american baseball experience this book examines nine of the most significant including the rise and fall of the lincoln giants satchel paige s adventures in the cornhusker state a visit from jackie robinson and the maturation of bob gibson both on and off the field also recollections are featured from individuals who participated in or witnessed the african american baseball experience in the omaha area

this third volume of the pan african chronology set covers 1914 through 1929 a time of two seminal events world war i and the black awakening in world war i people of african descent fought for both sides earning distinction on the battlefields of france as well as in the jungles and deserts of africa the black awakening a period from 1919 through 1929 marked the dawning of global awareness of the contributions of african people to the culture of the world the book is arranged by year and events of each year are grouped by region it also has two special biographical divisions for w e b dubois and marcus garvey

the first african american to play in baseball s recognized major leagues william edward white appeared in 1879 followed by brothers fleetwood and welday walker in 1884 the fourth african american jackie robinson did not make his major league debut until 1947 this sixty three year gap has become known as the era of black baseball a time when two generations of african american players were excluded from the existing major leagues this anthology provides insights into black baseball during this extraordinary time spotlighting players who characterized its special flavor and spirit based on 40 years of research and hundreds of interviews with surviving participants and observers these essays preserve a crucial time in our country s history and provide a thoughtful perspective on the negro leagues

painstakingly researched and documented this volume is a comprehensive year by year reference work giving important yet often obscure dates in negro league history from the negro leagues organized beginning in 1920 through their steep decline immediately after jackie robinson s 1947 breaking of the color barrier entries cover league meetings noteworthy games the commentary of columnists and important events on and off the field controversies that defined the experience of black baseball organizers such as player rights disputes failure to adhere to league schedules and violations of league rules are also included here

now in paper the only single source collection of over 950 teams in 36 major professional leagues baseball football soccer basketball and hockey this book also contains the first genealogy ever compiled on all these leagues giving each team franchise and its past and present names section 1 is an alphabetical listing by the designation city state province or region used by the team this main entry section explains how the team got its name section 2 the family tree contains a separate listing of the

teams in each of the 36 leagues who they were and who they became section 3 is an alphabetical listing of all the team names in sections 1 and 2 with bibliography and index

before they were the stars of the negro leagues before the negro leagues even began outstanding african american players like rube foster charles grant and pop lloyd competed against the leading players of cuba in the early years of the 20th century winners of the colored championship in the united states traveled to cuba to compete against the top cuban league teams amateur clubs and all star squads part of the american series that brought teams from the major minor and negro leagues to the island nation for more than six decades these games are arguably the most important in a baseball relationship that was vital to the game's history since the end of cuban professional baseball in 1961 games like those of the american series have become a distant memory scores and statistics are difficult to track down and few could say who played in those long ago contests fortunately dedicated baseball historian severo nieto has spent a lifetime accumulating and preserving the facts and figures of cuban baseball here he presents box scores statistics rosters and summaries of the games as well as biographical information for the players of the american series from 1900 through 1945

this work examines the historical significance of the state of new jersey in the negro league legacy especially the black baseball players teams owners and managers and their struggles against not just segregation and their accomplishments the book includes photographs appendices records of new jersey negro league teams 1923 1948 and a chronology notes a bibliography of research sources an annotated list of suggested further readings and an index

the giants' accomplishments took place against an historical backdrop of a change in the african american experience the original players from jacksonville florida joined the northward black migration during world war i the team was named after harry bacharach an atlantic city politician running for mayor as a way to keep his name before the city's black community the giants were immediately successful and soon played the best semi professional teams in their region as well as the top black teams from the east and midwest they entered the first negro league on the east coast in 1923 and won the league championship twice before the decade ended this book chronicles the giants' pivotal role in the development of black baseball in prohibition era atlantic city and the careers of the men who made it possible

though they played in the years before rube foster formed the first negro league the st paul gophers and their bitter crosstown rivals the minneapolis keystones had the talent bench depth and determination to rival many of those later better known teams the gophers in fact beat chicago's celebrated leland giants in 1909 laying claim to blackball's western championship focusing on these two clubs author peterson lays out the early history of african american baseball in the upper midwest included are new statistics and more than 50 rarely seen photographs

an irony of enshrinement at the baseball hall of fame is that it's no guarantee of lasting name recognition the sport's history stretches too far back as today fans scratch their heads about athletes and owners who were among the most celebrated public figures of their time who was more renowned than george wright baseball's greatest star during the transition from amateur to professional play who was more feared than big dan brouthers maybe it was amos rusie who threw so hard that some say the rules makers increased the pitching distance just to make things fair of the 256 players managers and executives in the hall of fame the names that are known well ty cobb connie mack willie mays account for a small minority this book a follow up to ghosts in the gallery at cooperstown 2004 provides chapter length biographies on 16 hall of famers from baseball's distant past award winning biographer david fleitz covers in detail the lives and careers of negro league hilton smith and pre negro league greats cristobal torriente and smokey joe williams big leaguers from the 19th century wright brouthers rusie mickey welch tommy mccarthy tim keefe joe kelley billy hamilton and sam thompson and stars from the deadball era through the second world war jimmy collins sam rice kiki cuyler arky vaughan for some it is the first time their stories appear in print

this volume presents carefully selected and annotated articles about major leaguers serving at home and overseas in the u s armed forces during world war i some continued to play ball in the military others fought the germans in the trenches in the air and at sea several lost their lives in combat or to disease a few became heroes from future hall of famers to journeymen and unknowns each did his duty

since 1971 35 negro league baseball players and executives have been admitted to the hall of fame the negro league hall of fame admissions process which has now been conducted in four phases over a 50 year period can be characterized as idiosyncratic at best drawing on baseball analytics and surveys of both negro league historians and veterans this book presents an historical overview of nlhof voting with an evaluation of whether the 35 nl players selected were the best choices using modern metrics such as wins above replacement war 24 additional negro leaguers are identified who have hall of fame qualifications brief biographies are included for hof quality players and executives who have been passed over along with reasons why they may have been excluded a proposal is set forth for a consistent and orderly hof voting process for the negro leagues

the hilldale club of darby pennsylvania was the dominant team in black baseball during the 1920s their success came about largely through the efforts of hilldale president and manager edward bolden bolden s professionalism and reputation for fair play were instrumental in his forming the eastern colored ec league in 1922 this absorbing story highlighted with vivid photographs chronicles the origins and development of black baseball

as the companion volume to black baseball entrepreneurs 1860 1901 operating by any means necessary lomax s new book continues to chronicle the history of black baseball in the united states the first volume traced the development of baseball from an exercise in community building among african americans in the pre civil war era to a commercialized amusement and a rare and lucrative opportunity for entrepreneurship within the black community in this book lomax takes a closer look at the marketing and promotion of the negro leagues by black baseball magnates he explores how race influenced black baseball s institutional development and shaped the business relationship with white clubs and managers lomax analyzes the decisions that black baseball magnates made to insulate themselves from outside influences he explains how this insulation may have distorted their perceptions and ultimately led to the negro leagues demise the collapse of the negro leagues by 1931 was lomax argues a dream deferred in the overall african american pursuit for freedom and self determination

in 1924 after the hilldale giants captured the league crown in the new eastern colored league and the kansas city monarchs won out in the four year old negro national league the two teams met in a best of nine series for the world championship but a 13 inning tie in game 4 and alternating wins throughout would force a tenth and deciding game making it the longest world series black or white in the modern era this heavily illustrated volume provides a comprehensive account of the first championship series played between teams from two all black professional leagues it provides commentary records and full statistics for each club s regular season performance along with biographical profiles of the players coverage also includes position by position comparisons of the series combatants a breakdown of the attendance gate receipts and team shares game by game summaries comments from the players and complete statistics including pitcher batter matchups for both teams

this is one of the most important baseball books to be published in a long time taking a comprehensive look at black participation in the national pastime from 1858 through 1900 it provides team rosters and team histories player biographies a list of umpires and games they officiated and information on team managers and team secretaries well known organizations like the washington s mutuals philadelphia pythians chicago uniques st louis black stockings cuban giants and chicago unions are documented as well as lesser known teams like the wilmington mutuals newton black stockings san francisco enterprise dallas black stockings galveston flyaways louisville brotherhoods and helena pastimes player biographies trace their connections between teams across the country essays frame the biographies discussing the social and cultural events that shaped black baseball waiters and barbers formed the earliest organized clubs and developed local regional and national circuits some players belonged to both white and colored clubs and some umpires officiated colored white and interracial matches high schools nurtured young players and transformed them into powerhouse teams like cincinnati s vigilant base ball club a special essay covers visual representations of black baseball and the artists who created them including colored artists of color who were also baseballists

america and baseball are rediscovering the game played by african americans before jackie robinson broke the color barrier in 1947 we now know a great deal about the negro leagues of 1920 on and their great stars satchel paige josh gibson and their contemporaries but what of the pre 1920 black game from the onset in the 1880s of the gentleman's agreement that barred blacks from playing in white leagues that game is nearly invisible financially shaky with sporadic media coverage even in black newspapers and completely overlooked by the mainstream negro teams of this era played on for love of the game and in hopes that their skills would receive their due in 1907 sol white a remarkable african american ballplayer successful manager and baseball loyalist wrote a small volume on the history of the black game part fund raising effort advertising brochure team hype celebration of black baseball and throughout an implicit and explicit challenge to racism sol white's history of colored base ball is the source of much of what we know of the events in the organized black game of that time the original was poorly printed and copies are exceedingly rare known and rumored copies number only four this edition republishes the full 1907 edition with the even rarer supplement completely reset for legibility and reproduces all the original's illustrations including the advertisements that speak volumes on the social world of the day fifteen additional documents from 1886 to 1936 augment the picture of the black game and our record of sol white himself the work is introduced by jerry malloy a recognized expert on the history of negro leagues who has spent years in painstaking research into this vanished world

among early 20th century baseball players john preston pete hill 1882 1951 was considered the equal of babe ruth ty cobb and tris speaker only skin color kept him out of the majors a capable manager hill captained the negro league's chicago based american giants led two expansion teams and retired from the sport as manager of the baltimore black sox drawing on contemporary newspaper accounts this first ever biography of hill recounts the career of a neglected hall of famer in the context of the turbulent issues that surrounded him segregation women's suffrage prohibition and the spanish flu

with the rise of stars such as hideo nomo ichiro suzuki and now daisuke matsuzaka fans today can easily name players from the island country of japan less widely known is that baseball has long been played on other pacific islands in pre statehood hawaii for instance and in guam samoa and the philippines for the multiethnic peoples of these u.s. possessions the learning of baseball was actively encouraged some would argue as a means to an unabashedly colonialist end as early as the deadball era pacific islanders competed against each other and against mainlanders on the diamond with teams like the hawaiian travelers barnstorming the states winning more than they lost against college semi pro and even professional nines for those who moved to the mainland baseball eased the transition helping asian pacific americans create a sense of community and purpose cross cultural borders and for a few achieve fame

under the guidance of leslie heaphy and an editorial board of leading historians this peer reviewed annual book series offers new authoritative research on all subjects related to black baseball including the negro major and minor leagues teams and players pre negro league organization and play barnstorming segregation and integration class gender and ethnicity the business of black baseball and the arts

as star players for the 1955 world champion brooklyn dodgers and prior to that as the first black players to be candidates to break professional baseball's color barrier jackie robinson and roy campanella would seem to be natural allies but the two men were divided by a rivalry going far beyond the personality differences and petty jealousies of competitive teammates behind the bitterness were deep and differing beliefs about the fight for civil rights robinson the more aggressive and intense of the two thought jim crow should be attacked head on campanella more passive and easygoing believed that ability not militancy was the key to racial equality drawing on interviews with former players such as monte irvin bank aaron carl erskine and don zimmer jackie and campy offers a closer look at these two players and their place in a historical movement torn between active defiance and passive resistance william c kashatus deepens our understanding of these two baseball icons and civil rights pioneers and provides a clearer picture of their time and our own

although andrew rube foster 1879 1930 stands among the best african american pitchers of the 1900s this baseball pioneer made his name as the founder and president of the negro national league the first all black league to survive a full season in
