the classic anthropological analysis of religion from a pioneer in the field from the preface scientific efforts to learn just what are the forms and functions of religion have not been few it is the purpose of this book to review some of them and to synthesize the suggestions and findings my own personal feeling is that sociological viewpoints including much of social anthropology tend to focus on the scaffolding and milieu of religion rather than on religion itself and that religion can be best understood from a combination of psychological and cultural points of view this book is not i think motivated by a need to destroy by dissection a way of thinking and acting that many educated people feel is of little use or is even disadvantageous in a world increasingly committed to the search for scientific and technological solutions of human problems rather i aim to preserve a friendly detachment in the asking of fundamental scientific questions about religion

in a culture increasingly focused on visual media students have learned not only to embrace multimedia presentations in the classroom but to expect them such expectations are perhaps more prevalent in a field as dynamic and cross disciplinary as religious studies but the practice nevertheless poses some difficult educational issues the use of movies in academic coursework has far outpaced the scholarship on teaching religion and film what does it mean to utilize film in religious studies and what are the best ways to do it in teaching religion and film an interdisciplinary team of scholars thinks about the theoretical and pedagogical concerns involved with the intersection of film and religion in the classroom they examine the use of film to teach specific religious traditions religious theories and perspectives on fundamental human values some instructors already teach some version of a film and religion course and many have integrated film as an ancillary to achieving central course goals this collection of essays helps them understand the field better and draws the sharp distinction between merely watching movies in the classroom and comprehending film in an informed and critical way

documentary as exorcism is an interdisciplinary study that builds upon the insights of postcolonial studies critical race theory theological and religious studies and media and film studies to showcase the role of documentary film as a system of signifying capable of registering complex theological ideas while pursuing the authentic aims of documentary filmmaking robert beckford marries the concepts of theology as visual practice and theology as political engagement to develop a new mode of documentary filmmaking that embeds emancipation from oppression in its aesthetic in various documentaries made for channel 4 and the bbc beckford narrates the complicit relationship of christianity with european expansion slavery and colonialism as a historic manifestation of evil in light of the cannibalistic practices of colonialism that devoured black life and the church s role in the subjugation and theological legitimization of black bodies beckford characterises this form of historic christian faith as colonial christianity and its malevolent or occult practices as a form of bewitchment that must be exorcised he identifies and exorcises the evil practices of colonialism and their present impact upon african caribbean christian communities in britain in films such as britain s slave trade and empire pays back through a deliberate process of encoding decoding the emancipatory impact of this form of documentary filmmaking is demonstrated by its ability to bring issues such as reparations to the public square for debate and its capacity to change a corporation s trade policies for the good of africans

is it true that christianity is being marginalised by the secular media at the expense of islam are the mass media islamophobic is atheism on the rise in media coverage media portrayals of religion and the secular sacred explores such questions and argues that television and newspapers remain key sources of popular information about religion they are particularly significant at a time when religious participation in europe is declining yet the public visibility and influence of religions seems to be increasing based on analysis of mainstream media the book is set in the context of wider debates about the sociology of religion and media representation the authors draw on research conducted in the 1980s and 2008 10 to examine british media coverage and representation of religion and contemporary secular values and to consider what has changed in the last 25 years exploring the portrayal of christianity and public life islam and religious diversity atheism and secularism and popular beliefs and practices several media events are also examined in detail the papal visit to the uk in 2010 and the ban of the controversial dutch mp geert wilders in 2009 religion is shown to be deeply embedded in the language and images of the press and television and present in all types of coverage from news and documentaries to entertainment sports reporting and advertising a final chapter engages with global debates about religion and media

this volume examines and discusses selected bible documentaries and academically informed dramatizations of the bible with a major focus on recent productions in uk mainline television within the past 15 years the contributors also engage with productions from the usa after a critical introduction by helen k bond charting and reflecting on the use of the bible on television in recent years the book falls into three sections first a number of influential filmmakers and producers including ray bruce and jean claude bragard discuss their work in relation to the context and constraints of television especially religious television programming the volume then moves to reflections of various academics who have acted as talking heads historical consultants and presenters allowing discussion of different aspects of the process including the extent to which they had influence and how their contributions were used finally a number of scholars assess the finished products discussing what they tell us about the modern reception of the bible with additional

consideration of how these productions influence biblical scholars and contribute to the scholarly agenda

religion is of enduring importance in the lives of many people, yet the religious landscape has been dramatically transformed in recent decades. established churches have been challenged by eastern faiths, revivals of christian and islamic fundamentalism, and the eclectic spiritualities of the new age. religion has long been regarded by social scientists and psychologists as a key source of identity formation, ranging from personal conversion experiences to collective association with fellow believers. this book addresses the need for a reassessment of issues relating to identity in the light of current transformations in society as a whole, and religion in particular, drawing together case studies from many different expressions of faith and belief: hindu, muslim, roman catholic, anglican, new age. leading scholars ask how contemporary religions or spiritualities respond to the challenge of forming individual and collective identities in a nation context marked by secularisation and postmodern

decentring of culture as well as religious revitalisation the book focuses on Britain as a context for religious change but asks important questions that are of universal significance for those studying religion how is personal and collective identity constructed in a world of multiple social and cultural influences what role can religion play in creating reinforcing or even transforming such identity

the body is crucial to religious life but there has been little practical attention to how to make a helpful reality of this fact strong forms of philosophical dualism have been widely abandoned by post war theologians in favour of a more integrated view of human nature but guidance on the role of the body in Christian spirituality remains fragmentary focusing particularly on drawing out practical implications for religious life and ministry this book will survey the many ways in which the body plays an important role in religions and spiritual life drawing on scientific research theology and philosophy

religion and the rise of Jim Crow in New Orleans examines a difficult chapter in American religious history the story of race prejudice in American Christianity focusing on the largest city in the late nineteenth century South it explores the relationship between churches black and white Protestant and Catholic and the emergence of the Jim Crow laws statutes that created a racial caste system in the American South the book fills a gap in the scholarship on religion and race in the crucial decades between the end of Reconstruction and the eve of the civil rights movement drawing on a range of local and personal accounts from the post Reconstruction period newspapers and church records Bennett's analysis challenges the assumption that churches fell into fixed patterns of segregation without a fight in sacred no less than secular spheres establishing Jim Crow constituted a long slow and complicated journey that extended well into the twentieth century churches remained a source of hope and a means of resistance against segregation rather than a retreat from racial oppression especially in the decade after Reconstruction churches offered the possibility of creating a common identity that privileged religious over racial status a pattern that black church members hoped would transfer to a national American identity transcending racial differences religion thus becomes a lens to reconsider patterns for racial interaction throughout southern society by tracing the contours of that hopeful yet ultimately tragic journey this book reveals the complex and mutually influential relationship between church and society in the American South placing churches at the center of the nation's racial struggles

a great deal of attention has been given to the sociopolitical and theological importance of black religion however of less academic concern up to this point is the aesthetic qualities that define much of what is said and done within the context of black religion recognizing the centrality of the black body for black religious thought and life this book proposes a conversation concerning various dimensions of the aesthetic considerations and qualities of black religion as found in various parts of the world including the Americas the Caribbean Africa and Europe in this respect black religion is simply meant to connote the religious orientations and arrangements of people of African descent across the globe
