twelve stories by science fiction master stanisław lem nine of them never before published in english of these twelve short stories by science fiction master stanisław lem only three have previously appeared in english making this the first new book of fiction by lem since the late 1980s the stories display the full range of lem s intense curiosity about scientific ideas as well as his sardonic approach to human nature presenting as multifarious a collection of mad scientists as any reader could wish for many of these stories feature artificial intelligences or artificial life forms long a lem preoccupation some feature quite insane theories of cosmology or evolution all are thought provoking and scathingly funny written from 1956 to 1993 the stories are arranged in chronological order in the title story the truth a scientist in an insane asylum theorizes that the sun is alive the journal appears to be an account by an omnipotent being describing the creation of infinite universes until in a classic lem twist it turns out to be no such thing in an enigma beings debate whether offspring can be created without advanced degrees and design templates other stories feature a computer that can predict the future by 137 seconds matter destroying spores a hunt in which the prey is a robot and an electronic brain eager to go on the lam these stories are peak lem exploring ideas and themes that resonate throughout his writing

library quality hardcover book with dust jacket this book is a collection of short stories in naskapi that features the historical account traditional algonquian storytelling genre tipâchimûna stories it features some eyewitness accounts of tragic and exciting events on the land as well as a first person account of the storyteller s own

adventures and skill as a hunter and provider this is the fifth book in a series prepared for reading in naskapi and in english by the naskapi development corporation john peastitute 1896 1981 was a naskapi elder who was a well respected as a story keeper and storyteller his repertoire of both tipâchimûna and âtiyûhkinich was extensive and his performances engaging the tape recordings of his stories that have survived to be preserved processed and studied are a precious legacy the caught in a blizzard collection is the beginning of a series of true historical accounts of naskapi life by a naskapi speaker

the fourteen short stories collected in this volume were written between 1913 and 1921 most of them against the background of the 1914 18 war all but one were published in slightly different versions by magazines and periodicals on both sides of the atlantic ten were selected and revised by lawrence for his collection england my england published in 1922 in the united states and 1924 in britain some of the stories included in this volume are tickets please the blind man monkey nuts wintry peacock hadrian samson and delilah the primrose path the horse dealer s daughter and the last straw the texts aim to recover lawrence s own intentions which editors and publishers all too frequently ignored or altered where possible manuscripts and corrected typescripts are used as base texts the introduction traces the composition and revision of the stories setting them in the context of lawrence s life and work the textual apparatus gives variant readings and explanatory notes identify sources references and quotations the 1915 version of england my england is given in an appendix

sara the american wife of a french aristocrat has had two encounters with her compatriot cedric killian one a youthful idyll in north carolina and the other during the first world war when he was a soldier about to go to battle when years later and after the death of her husband cedric contacts her out of the blue sara finds herself eager to see him again against the wishes of her in laws and to find out the secret of this man she loves yet knows so little about a poignant tale of thwarted love the intimate strangers explores many of fitzgerald s favourite themes such as the constraints of social pressure on romance and the american fascination for old europe this volume also includes other lesser known stories he wrote from the mid 1930s until the end of his life revealing new facets to the author of the great gatsby and tender is the night

a bold walkabout across the land of vision imagination and reality the stories in this book are a combination of my imagination vision and experiences and contacts writes storyteller judith a lewis about this compelling collection of 65 stories about the australian outback the pacific india and traveling they came to me in vivid detail and i felt compelled to share these insights into a richer way of looking at our relationship to the earth her theme is the journey across landscapes through cultures or into the vivid realms of visionary experience lewis writes evocatively about traveling in spirit and body across aboriginal and cultural terrains from meeting kangaroo

spirits to long lost fathers but she writes with equal insight and warmth about the enigmas of the heart its secrets joys aspirations and epiphanies a twelve year old girl survives an illness by communing with the waratah in bloom a traveler in bombay is arrested by beauty amidst the frenetic urban haze two twins separated in early childhood journey towards each other a homeless man constantly walks the highways to bury his past an aboriginal medicine man named waramingo meets the dreamtime ancestors a lot of the visionary stories pertain to the land and its secrets and those who visit it from afar lewis says i believe that the earth is alive and awaiting our recognition as are the other dimensions that we all could inhabit i hope my stories help you remember what you already know that there is no separation that everything from stones to stars is part of us on this lovely planet

in our media saturated world the line between reality and fiction has grown thinner and more confusing with sharp clear prose and an insider s view of the media petrick s stories take us into a hall of mirrors where men and women struggle to understand themselves and their relationships with one another in a climate defined by images does love stand a chance when no one is certain what is real in the title story an accomplished skydiver goes airborne with a video camera to capture the love of his life but a small oversight upends his best intentions in sins of the father a man arriving in huntsville texas to commute his son s death sentence clashes with a documentary producer intent on chasing the story to its bitter end in telling time a corporate video producer conflicted by his own immoral conduct learns that sometimes the absolute truth is the most effective lie

short stories are but a slice of life yet they are complete even in few words although the endings are not always happy they are indeed endings these slices of life take us to many times and places where we meet people with a distinct set of problems and sometimes if they are very lucky solutions a lover s potion is an imaginative walk through fantasy and fiction in these collected stories we visit a small shire where witchcraft mania runs wild a peasant girl becomes pregnant with her aristocratic lover who presents her with a gift of jewellery confounding a team of modern archaeologists there is even a girl with incredibly long hair locked in a tower but she is not what she seems each story focuses on people and their fascination with one another all human beings share desires endeavors and loyalties through actions we reveal ourselves the characters in these stories each long for something and in some cases the characters aren t human at all read of compassion romance and revenge in this riveting collection of wiles and whimsy

in the cook s wedding and other stories anton pavlovich chekhov presents a masterful collection that encapsulates the nuances of human relationships and the complexities of everyday life in late 19th century russia chekhov s literary style characterized by his subtle realism and a keen eye for the intricacies of character delves

into themes of love class disparity and societal expectations through a blend of humor and poignancy the stories range from the contemplative to the tragicomic employing rich dialogue and vivid imagery that invite the reader to explore the depth of the characters' inner lives while reflecting broader social realities chekhov a physician by profession and a playwright by passion was deeply attuned to the human condition and societal ailments of his time his own experiences in provincial russia combined with a profound empathy for the struggles of the common man greatly influenced his storytelling the simplicity and authenticity evident in the cook's wedding are a testament to chekhov's ability to blend personal insight with universal themes making his works timeless and relatable for readers seeking an insightful exploration of human nature this collection is highly recommended chekhov's sharp wit and keen observations bring to life the mundane yet profound moments that shape our existence ensuring that each story resonates long after the last page is turned

rudyard kipling's 1865-1936 work is known and loved the world over by children and adults alike it has been translated into many languages and onto the cinema screen this volume brings together for the first time some 86 uncollected short fictions almost all of them will be unfamiliar to readers some are unrecorded in any bibliography some are here published for the first time most of them come from kipling's indian years and show him experimenting with a great variety of forms and tones we see the young kipling enjoying the exercise of his craft yet the voice that emerges throughout is always unmistakably his own changing the scene every time the curtain is raised

discovery and other stories is a third collection of short stories by thomas mccavour discovery is a story about the early vikings and their exploration of america and the northwest passage marcus and mark is a story about how two boxers in different eras deal with the problem of drug addiction bad habits is a story about the adopted son of a nun who becomes a priest in flanders fields recognizes the poet john mcrae true friends is a story about life in a retirement residence thanksgiving is a fun story about how tom turkey and rob rooster rescue thanksgiving acdc is a story about alex and dorothy cross growing old together the carroll family choristers tells about how fred carroll acquires a large family of singers dust to dust is a story about murder in a love triangle

as the great war raged and in its aftermath people created hundreds of legends and stories round it to speak of the sadness the heroism the deaths author helen watts and storyteller taffy thomas bring together this compelling moving collection of ghost stories and mysteries from both sides of the conflict from the haunted u boat to the ghost of the trenches

in 1898 henry james wrote a novella that would become one of the most famous and critically discussed ghost stories ever written the turn of the screw three other

examples of james s tales of the supernatural the altar of the dead the beast in the jungle and the jolly corner are included in this edition these texts reveal on both the thematic and narrative levels james s deepest concerns as a writer the texts in this edition are all drawn from the new york edition of james s works the introduction traces the extensive critical debate around the turn of the screw and situates the texts in contemporary discussions of the supernatural appendices include material on the tales reception james s writings on the supernatural and the study of the supernatural in the nineteenth century

a memoir in short stories starting from loomis chronicles the life of accomplished writer playwright poet and actor hiroshi kashiwagi in this dynamic portrait of an aging writer trying to remember himself as a younger man kashiwagi recalls and reflects upon the moments people forces mysteries and choices the things in his life that he cannot forget that have made him who he is central to this collection are kashiwagi s confinement at tule lake during world war ii his choice to answer no and no to questions 27 and 28 on the official government loyalty questionnaire and the resulting lifelong stigma of being labeled a no no boy after his years of incarceration his nonlinear multifaceted writing not only reflects the fragmentations of memory induced by traumas of racism forced removal and imprisonment but also can be read as a bold personal response to the impossible conditions he and other nisei faced throughout their lifetimes

i guess in truth reno by the in the lake is my autobiography light the material is indeed autobiographical in that little has been gleaned from any outside source and it is definitely light both in serious content and the serious nature often portrayed by an autobiography so read on just for fun reno beach was a magical place in the 1920s 30s 40s and 50s a resort town that never really quite reached its prime it had however attained great stature in the hearts and minds of all it entertained especially in the imagination of a young boy who could see adventure even in the smallest buttonhole or banal blemish in his mind a vegetable garden became a wilderness plantation an overturned rowboat became a fortress a pirate s treasure cave or a magician s maudlin mansion a willow tree only recently uprooted by the wind and waves of an angry possessive lake trying desperately to reclaim its own this became the perfect home for tarzan jimmie of the apes the fact that i m even writing this book belies the fact that the place and that little boy still live if only in my imagination the stories you re about to read are about that small waterfront community just east of toledo ohio on the western end of lake erie and how it s life death and frequent revitalizations affected the life of one small boy namely me the stories are absolutely true except as altered by an aging memory wishful thinking and delusions of grandeur not necessarily in that order and they represent some of the very best days of my life i ve been told that it s good to share your very best i hope you enjoy reading my stories nearly as much as i enjoyed living them the writing s been fun too some names and places may have been altered to protect the innocent and or the guilty but not many some may also be changed just because i ve forgotten or don t really know what i m talking about please forgive me many may recognize themselves a friend or family member in some of these

stories and each one probably deserves whatever treatment or attention they received either good or bad this book is intended to be a bathroom book this is not a negative for those unable to grasp this creative terminology i provide the following explanation in the form of a prescription take in small doses continuous exposure could be hazardous to your health and could lead to an abrasive situation requiring an immediate application of preparation h this does not imply that either you the reader or the writer is full of anything should you disapprove of any of the material in this book please feel free to remove the offending pages and put them to better use right there in the reading room solving the problems of the moment i m sure you understand enjoy life is short don t waste it on seriousness

these stories of myth and resurrection of uncanny events and violent impulse were with one exception written and published in the latter half of the 1920s

exposed to a high tech dust that can transport people from one dimension to another three travelers must try to escape the totalitarian philadelphia of 2118 when three people in philadelphia inhale dust developed by a scientist who has discovered parallel universes they are transported into an interdimensional no man s land that is populated by supernatural beings from there they go on to an alternate future version of philadelphia a frightening dystopian nation state in which citizens are numbered not named how will they escape in the heads of cerberus and other stories introduced by lisa yaszek you will find this world bending story as well as five others written by francis stevens the pseudonym of gertrude barrows bennett a pioneering science fiction and fantasy adventure writer from minneapolis who made her literary debut at the precocious age of 17 often celebrated as the woman who invented dark fantasy bennett possessed incredible range her groundbreaking stories produced largely between 1904 and 1919 suggest that she is better understood as the mother of modern genre fiction writ large bennett s work has anticipated everything from the work of philip k dick to superman comics to the hunger games making it as relevant now as it ever was francis stevens gertrude barrows bennett 1884 1948 was the first american woman to publish widely in fantasy and science fiction her five short stories and seven longer works of fiction all of which appeared in pulp magazines such as argosy all story weekly and weird tales would influence everyone from h p lovecraft to c l moore

a twisty collection of short stories from the master of classic crime fiction peter lovesey one of which stars his most popular creation peter diamond more than fifty years ago peter lovesey published a short story in an anthology that short story caught the eye of the great ruth rendell whose praise ignited lovesey s life long passion for short form crime fiction more than a hundred stories later peter lovesey has assembled this devilishly clever collection fifteen yarns of mystery melancholy and mischief inhabiting such deadly settings as a theatre a monastery and the book publishing industry the collection includes that first story that launched his story writing career as well as three new stories exclusive to this volume in addition lovesey fans will delight in a personal essay by the author about the historical

inspirations for his creation and in an appearance by the irascible bath detective peter diamond who has in the author s words bulldozed his way into this collection

peter bayer was seventy three he d taught at the school just up the road for most of his life and when the wall came down saw no reason to move nobody could say life had been easy and when it was built he d lost contact with many friends but he d learnt to enjoy life as best he could and had had the good fortune of a happy marriage to elsa it s 2006 peter bayer and his wife elsa live on the east side of berlin as they ve always done even when that wasn t an attractive proposition what limits peter s freedom nowadays isn t a concrete wall but often feels like one elsa has dementia and barely recognises him so his life is not only hard work but it s lonely what makes it lonelier is that his wife s illness has given her a distorted view of the past and one that would horrify the woman he married when helen a recently widowed english woman rents the flat peter owns nearby he experiences the kinds of conversations that used to be normal for him which makes his current reality all the more painful helen s come to berlin to find out more about her husband s past in the city and learns things from their german friends that she was unaware of when he was alive during her struggle to come to terms with her present life helen sees that the terrible demands on peter s life are almost impossible to endure other stories in the book show the toll of war as fear is passed from one generation to another and we see how the power of secrecy never disappears they also reveal how gratitude can take various forms and how intergenerational friendships really are all they re cracked up to be the writing on the wall and other stories is a collection of tales spanning the 1980s to the present day that will appeal to fans of anne tyler alan bennett and alice munro whom penny edwards takes

in a lively sparkling and sharp edged arthur goldhammer new translation guy de maupassant s most beloved works are reintroduced to twenty first century readers a parisian civil servant turned protégé of flaubert guy de maupassant is considered not only one of the greatest short story writers in all of french literature but also a pioneer of psychological realism and modernism who helped define the form credited with influencing the likes of chekhov maugham babel and o henry maupassant had at the time of his death at the age of forty two written six novels and some three hundred short stories yet in english maupassant has curiously remained unappreciated by modern readers due to outdated translations that render his prose in an archaic literal style in this bold new translation sandra smith the celebrated translator of irene nemirovsky s suite francaise brings us twenty eight of maupassant s essential stories and two novellas in lyrical yet accessible language that brings maupassant into vibrant english in addition to her sparkling translation smith also imposes a structure that captures the full range of maupassant s work dividing the collection into three sections that reflect his predominant themes nineteenth century french society the franco prussian war of 1870 71 and the supernatural smith creates an arrangement suggesting a culture of relation of structure of completion richard howard in tales of french life we see maupassant explore the broad swath of french society not just examining the lives of the affluent as was customary for writers in his day in the title story of the collection the necklace maupassant crafts

a devastating portrait of misplaced ambition and ruin in the emerging middle class the stories in tales of war emerge from maupassant's own experiences in the devastating franco prussian war and create a portrait of that disastrous conflict that few modern readers have ever encountered this section features maupassant's most famous novella boule de suif the last section tales of the supernatural delves into the occult and the bizarre while certain critics may attribute some of these stories and morbid fascination as the product of the author's fevered mind and possible hallucinations induced by late stage syphilis they echo the gothic horror of poe as well as anticipate the eerie fiction of h p lovecraft the result takes readers from marriage family and the quotidian details of life to the disasters of war and nationalism then to the gothic and beyond allowing us to appreciate maupassant in an idiom that matches our own times the necklace and other stories enables us to appreciate maupassant as the progenitor of the modern short story and as a writer vastly ahead of his time

the late victorians had an insatiable appetite for the macabre and sensational stories of murder and suspense ghosts the supernatural and the inexplicable were the stuff of life to them the two writers in this volume well represent the last decade of the nineteenth century and are of interest in themselves as well as for their contribution to the chilling of the victorian spine mrs alfred baldwin attempted as a child to contact her dead sister through a seance and took to writing when stricken by a mysterious illness six weeks after marriage she was also the mother of the prime minister stanley baldwin lettuce galbraith is herself no less mysterious than the stories she wrote she appeared on the literary scene in 1893 published a novel and two collections of stories in that year a further story the blue room in 1897 and then nothing more readers of the empty picture frame the case of sir nigel otterburne the trainer's ghost and the seance room will recognise the victorian spirit at its finest

the value of coconut macaroons other stories is a quick read with a deep message it is the story of an educator's journey in the academic field but it is much more it is the story of learners of all ages from youngsters in middle school to a grandmother who fulfills her dream of earning a high school diploma it reaches into the hearts of the individuals presented in the stories and shows the real people not just how one might perceive them to be the people featured in the value of coconut macaroons are from diverse backgrounds who teach the life lessons of resilience compassion generosity and caring through their relationships with one another it is a multicultural book based on learning loving and growing together as a human family this book isn't just for educators it appeals to all because it is a story of people it is unforgettable and will provide new meaning every time you read and reread the stories

emily's stitches the confessions of thomas calloway is a collection of interrelated short stories about a teenaged boy growing up in rural georgia and faced with the

challenges of approaching adulthood when he stumbles across a young homeless girl he must decide how best to protect her from the world despite the fact that he barely understands the world himself also included in this collection are five other short stories and three poems including requiem an authorized sequel of sorts to scott thompson s novel young men shall see other notable selections include negative space which tells the story of a recently divorced photographer who finds himself sharing thanksgiving dinner with his ex wife s family gods for sale cheap a humorous examination of the commercialization of american religion and misdirection the story of two down on their luck hitmen and their quest for identity
