the cast offs of modern urban society are driven out onto the edges of the city and left to make a life there for themselves they are not however in any natural wilderness but in a world of refuse and useless junk a place which denies any form of sustainable life here the unemployed the homeless the old and the bereft struggle to build shelters out of old tin cans scavenge for food and fight against insuperable odds there is the mysterious great wind that flattens their homes every night and cripples their children the industrial pollution from the factory which slowly disfigures them some of the lucky ones find work but are ruthlessly exploited denied everything except their pitiful wages all attempts at asserting their dignity are doomed to failure either by the outside world of cops lawyers thugs and businessmen or by their own frustration and anger and yet somehow they survive it seems that society thrives on the garbage hills because it has always been built on one in this dark fairy tale full of scenes taken from what has increasingly become a way of life for many inhabitants on this

planet latife tekin has written a grim parable of human destiny

just five miles west of new york city the meadowlands is an untamed vilified half developed and smelly tract of swampland it is home to rare birds and missing bodies tranquil marshes and a major sports arena burning garbage dumps and corporate headquarters the remains of the original penn station and possibly those of more than one mafioso acclaimed writer robert sullivan proves himself to be the perfect explorer historian and archaeologist for this fragile yet amazingly resilient region he tramps through the muck on foot and navigates the polluted rivers in a canoe all the while describing the industrial detritus with as much zeal as he observes the surprisingly rich diversity of wildlife the meadowlands is an ode to an overlooked american borderland a delightfully incongruous battleground marking the ongoing struggle between the forces of progress and nature

lektüren der literarisierung von müll und der vermüllung von literatur die das faible für unnütze details mit dem sammelnden lesen des völlig unbrauchbaren verknüpfen müll drängt sich seit dem letzten drittel des 19 jahrhunderts zunehmend auf die gewöhnlich in den städtischen peripherien zu müllbergen angehäuften dinge und substanzen übersieht auch die literatur nicht sie erzählt von ihnen lässt ihre figuren mit ihnen hantieren und setzt form und materialität ihrer texte zu ihnen ins verhältnis wozu interessieren sich literarische texte um 1900 für einen so formlosen gegenstand wie müll auf diese frage sucht die studie von david christopher assmann antworten in ihrem zentrum stehen lektüren von müll stellen in der literatur von der mitte des 19 jahrhunderts bis in die 1920er jahre welche darstellungsverfahren setzen literarische texte zwischen realismus und moderne ein um ihrem interesse an aussortierten oder weggeworfenen materialitäten zu entsprechen inwiefern partizipiert die literatur der jahrhundertwende an stadthygienischen bemühungen die müllbeseitigung in den griff zu bekommen und mit welchen folgen beobachtet ein literarischer text sich selbst als müll die studie plädiert für einen materialitätstheoretisch und sozialgeschichtlich informierten strukturalismus der es erlaubt müll als thema verfahren und material kurz als textmaterielle form von literatur zu untersuchen

the domination of single subjects in academic programmes and institutions has recently been called into question literary studies are currently opening themselves up to the epistemological renewal that other fields can offer they are increasingly borrowing theoretical tools from other subjects in order to analyse the historical socio political and institutional conditions of the production of literary texts to identify the general discursive circumstances in which they emerge and to study the relationship between literature and other media similarly while subjects such as sociology history and political science have always been closely related if not literally spinoffs from one another as in the case of sociology vis à vis anthropology what becomes of their specificities when they borrow from geography to address space related issues from psychology to understand social actors individual motivations or from literary studies to make sense of individual or collective narratives the present volume accounts for experiments in research that overstep disciplinary boundaries by analysing the new fields and methodologies

emerging in the contemporary globalised academic environment which puts a strong premium on synergism and linkages moreover it assesses current theoretical reflections on inter multi and transdisciplinarity as well as research grounded in it and measures their impact on the evolution of scholarship and curriculum in the fields of literature language and humanities

in this book prasad khanolkar offers a new way of thinking about slums and southern cities based on a grounded engagement with the relationship between media objects spaces and people in the everyday life of slum localities in mumbai india over the past few decades mumbai like many cities in the global south has experienced a series of overarching governmental missions to program it into an interoperable and profitable city its slums which house a majority of its population don t fit within the dominant registers and continue to be deemed as excess urban residents inhabiting mumbai s slum localities thus find themselves in the middle of missions policies and programs that are not of their making just as often that they find themselves localized by lack of resources caste system communal conflicts and territorial jurisdictions drawing on extensive fieldwork in slum localities of mumbai this book explores how its residents engage in different forms of play in order to extend and expand their field of possibilities despite the limitations and fixities the book attends to some of these playacts imparting stories with different thicknesses rehearsing roles on and offscreen engaging in deceptive performances experimenting with repetitive everyday rhythms and recycling matter and forms through these playacts urban residents explore the virtual abilities of different mediums to put bodies objects and spaces into new forms of relationships and create passages to depart from programmed urban futures by attending to these proliferating urban passages of different residents in slum localities the book makes a case for rethinking southern cities as mediums for urban lives to converge and depart without an overarching framework the book makes a significant contribution in the field of urban studies urban anthropology urban geography and urban sociology it will be of interest to scholars and students working on postcolonial cities southern urbanisms infrastructure studies and

urban planning in the global south

if you read one book about india read this one geeta anand pulitzer prize winner and author of the cure mountain tales is a remarkable feat of immersive reporting and story telling a deeply felt exploration of ideas and a gripping chronicle of the fates of the garbage pickers of mumbai i loved this book suzy hansen author of notes on a foreign country all of mumbai s memories and castaway possessions come to die at the deonar garbage mountains and among these vast teetering piles of discarded things medical waste rotten food old clothes broken glass and twisted metal a small forgotten community lives and works scouring the dump for whatever can be resold or recycled waste pickers also mark the familiar milestones of babies born love found illnesses suffered and recovered from like a mirror image their stories are shaped by the influx of unwanted things from the world outside but now as deonar s toxic halo becomes undeniable a change is coming and as officials try to close it the lives that the pickers have built on the mountain seem more fragile than ever

a snapshot of ecocriticism in action coming into contact collects sixteen previously unpublished essays that explore some of the most promising new directions in the study of literature and the environment they look to previously unexamined or underexamined aspects of literature s relationship to the environment including swamps internment camps asian american environments the urbanized northeast and lynching sites the authors relate environmental discourse to practice including the teaching of green design in composition classes the restoration of damaged landscapes the persuasive strategies of environmental activists the practice of urban architecture and the impact of human technologies on nature the essays also put ecocriticism into greater contact with the natural sciences including elements of evolutionary biology biological taxonomy and geology engaging both ecocritical theory and practice these authors more closely align ecocriticism with the physical environment with the wide range of texts and cultural practices that concern it and with the growing scholarly conversation that surrounds this concern

situated in northern new jersey the meadowlands region is one of stark contrasts as more than thirty square miles of protected wetlands sit close to metlife stadium and across the hudson from midtown manhattan from the time the dutch arrived in the 1600s the area has had a storied and mysterious history as fortunes were made and lost beloved performers like frank sinatra and bruce springsteen graced meadowlands stages and some of the most legendary athletes played its stadiums nearly destroyed by centuries of abuse meadowlands waterways are now reclaimed causing property values to soar and creating new communities that provide a good quality of life for residents local authors robert ceberio and ron kase present the fascinating story of this garden state region

this book foregrounds entanglement as a guiding concept in derrida s work and considers its implications and benefits for ecocritical thought ergin introduces the notion of ecological text to emphasize textuality as a form of entanglement that proves useful in thinking about ecological interdependence and uncertainty she brings deconstruction into a dialogue with social ecology and new materialism outlining entanglements in three strands of thought to demonstrate the relevance of this concept in theoretical terms ergin then investigates natural social entanglements through a comparative analysis of the works of the american poet juliana spahr and the turkish writer latife tekin the book enriches our understanding of complicity and accountability by revealing the ecological network of material and discursive forces in which we are deeply embedded it makes a significant contribution to current debates on ecocritical theory comparative literature and ecopoetics

this book demonstrates how city literature addresses questions of possibility in city literature ideas of possibility emerge primarily through two perspectives texts may focus on what is possible for cities and they may present the urban environment as a site of possibility for individuals or communities the volume combines reflections on urban possibility from a range of geographical and cultural contexts in addition to the english speaking world individual chapters analyse possible cities and possible urban lives in turkey israel finland germany russia and sweden moreover by engaging with issues such as city planning mass housing gentrification informal settlements and translocal identities the book shows imaginative literature at work outlining what possibility means in cities

the larion spell table has been dormant for nearly a thousand twinmoons it waits in a forgotten chamber in sandcliff palace the abandoned larion senate stronghold on eldarn s north sea the spell table holds the power to see the people of the five lands safely through the oppression and brutality that have haunted them for generations but without lessek s key it is a worthless slab of granite and lessek s key itself is just a nondescript stone steven taylor and mark jenkins overlooked on the night they fell through the far portal into eldarn retrieving the key and freeing eldarn s people rests with steven taylor the would be sorcerer from colorado who is racing across america with nerak the fallen larion dictator hot on his heels steven must reach idaho springs and find lessek s key before it falls into nerak s hands and is lost for ever and with it the lives of untold millions in both of steven s worlds

in 2003 the chinese xinhua news agency journalist wang jun published the bestseller beijing record the result of ten years of research on the urban transformation of beijing in the last fifty years home to more than 15 million people this ancient capital city not surprisingly has a controversial complicated history of planning and politics development and demolition the publication raises a number of unsettling questions why has valuable historical architecture such as city ramparts gateways old temples memorial archways and the urban fabric of the hutongs traditional alleyways and siheyuan courtyard houses been visibly disappearing for decades why are so many houses being demolished at a time of economic growth is no one prepared to stand up for the preservation of the city for his research wang went through innumerable archives read diaries and collected an unprecedented quantity of data accessing first hand materials and unearthing photographs that clearly document the city s relentless unprecedented physical makeover in addition he conducted more than 50 in person interviews with officials planners scholars and other experts wang s publication presents a survey of the main developments and government level both central and municipal decisions devoting a lot of attention to the 1950s and 1960s when beijing experienced a critical wave of transformative events shortly after its publication by sdx joint publishing company house in october 2003 beijing record ignited a firestorm of debate and discussion in a country where public interaction over such a sensitive subject rarely surfaces
