sam raimi s the evil dead 1981 is one of the most inventive and energetic horror movies of the last 40 years released during a period in which the stalk and slash cycle had blunted the horror genre of much of its creative edge raimi s debut feature transcends its small budget and limited resources to deliver a phantasmagoric roller coaster ride a wildly absurd and surreal assault on the senses still original enough to stand on its own and be considered as a genre classic this book will explain its long lasting appeal and impact after detailing the unique circumstances of its origin lloyd haynes goes on to analyse key aspects of the film s abiding success the evil dead is one of a number of horror films which locate their terrors in a single setting and limited time frame haynes argues that it creates a bad dream effect in which the nightmare is never ending and increasingly horrific and how the cabin in the woods location is also a fine example of the bad place motif which stretches back to the gothic novels of the 18th century the book goes on to consider what character traits ash williams the evil dead s macho male hero shares with carol clover s final girl model and how effective he is as a final guy finally it explores the critical approaches to the film in particular its notorious reputation in britain as a video nasty

how digital technology from facebook tributes to qr codes on headstones is changing our relationship to death facebook is the biggest cemetery in the world with countless acres of cyberspace occupied by snapshots videos thoughts and memories of people who have shared their last status updates modern society usually hides death from sight as if it were a character flaw and not an ineluctable fact but on facebook and elsewhere on the internet we can t avoid death digital ghosts electronic traces of the dead appear at our click or touch on the internet at least death has once again become a topic for public discourse in online afterlives davide sisto considers how digital technology is changing our relationship to death

this ground breaking study the first of its kind outlines a theory of publishing that allows publishing houses to focus on their core competencies in times of crisis tracing the history of publishing from the press works of fifteenth century germany to twenty first century silicon valley via venice beijing paris and london and fusing media theory and business experience the content machine offers a new understanding of content publishing and technology and defiantly answers those who contend that publishing has no future in a digital age

chas johnson sons a venerated rare bookstore in urban chicago has been a family operation for three generations grandfather father and son but when it comes time for gabe johnson to take the reins of the business the world of books has changed and the combination of the internet and inner city rents forces the store to close but instead of folding his hand gabe decides to risk everything he has and reopen the shop and in a sense restart his life in a small town on the shores of lake michigan haunted his entire life by an obsession with a former lover he finds her again only to be faced with yet another even more difficult challenge that threatens the well being of the revival of the bookstore as well as the fate of his rekindled relationship it is rare indeed to find fiction that is both passionate and erudite and in his previous books robert hellenga brought us tales of love learning and of loss but now with love death rare books he celebrates an industry that has brought us the written word and his novel is a paean to the independent bookseller

deadheads may disagree on which grateful dead concert was their best ever but no one would argue that their performance at englishtown on sept 3 1977 was something special for jim daley who saw the band for the first time on that date it was a life changing experience that he looks back on with fondness more than forty years later like many others he does n t remember much about that day but he sure does remember the music in this tribute to the band he loves so much the author commemorates the landmark concert by sharing memories from those who were there together the tapestry of recollections reveals a detailed picture of what that day was like and why it was a defining moment for the band some people remember the day quite vividly while others are a little foggy on details for most people however the music is at the forefront of their recollections discover what it was really like on that hot humid day at raceway park in old bridge new jersey and how at least for the day the grateful dead got everything just exactly perfect

this book describes and analyses the structure and performance of tibetan buddhist death rituals and situates that performance within the wider context of buddhist death practices generally drawing on a detailed and systematic comparative survey of existing records of tibetan funerary practices including historical travel accounts anthropological and ethnographic literature tibetan texts and academic studies it demonstrates that there is no standard form of funeral in tibetan buddhism although certain elements are common the structure of the book follows the twin trajectories of benefiting the deceased and protecting survivors in the process it reveals a rich and complex panoply of activities some handled by religious professionals and others by lay persons this information is examined to identify similarities and differences in practices and the degree to which tibetan buddhist funeral practices are consistent with the mortuary rituals of other forms of buddhism a number of elements in these death rites which at first appear to be unique to tibetan buddhism may only be tibetan in their surface characteristics while having roots in practices which pre date the transmission of buddhism to tibet filling a gap in the existing literature on tibetan buddhism this book poses research challenges that will engage future scholars in the field of buddhism tibetan buddhism and anthropology
