marco frascari believed that architects should design thoughtful buildings capable of inspiring their inhabitants to have pleasurable and happy lives a visionary italian architect academic and theorist frascari is best known for his extraordinary texts which explore the intellectual theoretical and practical substance of the architectural discipline as a student in venice during the late 1960s frascari was taught and mentored by carlo scarpa later he moved to north america with his family where he became a fulltime academic throughout his academic career he continued to work on numerous architectural projects including exhibitions competition entries and designs for approximately 35 buildings a small number of which were built as a means of re constructing the theatre of imaginative theory within which these buildings were created sam ridgway draws on a wide selection of frascari s texts including his richly poetic book monsters of architecture to explore the themes of representation demonstration

and anthropomorphism three of frascari s delightful buildings are then brought to light and interpreted revealing a sophisticated and interwoven relationship between texts and buildings
