this first full length study of the history of iranian anthropology charts the formation and development of anthropology in iran in the twentieth century the text examines how and why anthropology and culture became part of wider socio political discourses in iran and how they were appropriated and rejected by the pre and post revolutionary regimes the author highlights the three main phases of iranian anthropology corresponding broadly to three periods in the social and political development of iran the period of nationalism lasting approximately from the constitutional revolution 1906 11 and the end of the qajar dynasty until the end of reza shah s reign 1941 the period of nativism from the 1950s until the islamic revolution 1979 the post revolutionary period in addition the book places iranian anthropology in an international context by demonstrating how western anthropological concepts theories and methodologies affected epistemological and political discourses on iranian anthropology

ho addresses two fundamental theoretical questions about how best to practice ethnographic inquiries to obtain qualitative experience near and shareable accounts of human living the first question is regarding the epistemology of ethnography ho posits that writing is epistemologically prior to the researcher s fieldwork experience in the production of ethnographic knowledge this stance is developed using the theories of hermeneutics put forward by paul ricoeur and hans georg gadamer who both consider that once a text is produced its meaning is dissociated from the intention of the author the second question is what is the putative object that the ethnographer writes about ho argues that lived experience erlebnis offers such an ethnographic object since the

lived experience that an ethnographer experiences during fieldwork cannot be studied directly further theorizations of lived experience are necessary. It underscores both the non-discursivity and transcendence of lived experience in the lifeworld and the way power is clandestinely imbued in everyday life in shaping subjectivity and practice. This theorization brings together Alfred Schütz's lifeworld theory and Michel Foucault's power/knowledge nexus. The result is a general theory of experience that is pertinent for ethnographic inquiries by addressing these two fundamental questions and offering novel angles from which to answer them. This book offers refreshed epistemological guidelines for conducting ethnographic research for scientific reasoning. More importantly, this book also provides a crucial knowledge base for comprehending the current epistemological debates inherent in the production of ethnographic knowledge and furthering discussions in the field.

Focusing on the case of the Hazaras, a population from central Afghanistan, this book shows how migration studies and transnationalism are at the heart of theoretical and methodological debates which animate anthropology.

During the past three decades, feminist scholars have successfully demonstrated the ubiquity and omnirelevance of gender as a sociocultural construction in virtually all human collectivities. Past and present intrapsychic, interactional, and collective social processes are gendered, as are micro, meso, and macro social structures. Gender shapes and is shaped in all arenas of social life, from the most mundane practices of everyday life to those of the most powerful corporate actors. Contemporary understandings of gender emanate from a large community of primarily feminist scholars that spans the gamut of learned disciplines and also includes non-academic activist thinkers. However, while incorporating some cross-disciplinary material, this volume focuses specifically on sociological theories and research concerning gender, which are discussed across the full array of social processes, structures, and institutions. As editor, I have explicitly tried to shape the contributions to this volume along several lines that reflect my long-standing views about sociology in general and gender sociology in particular. First, I asked authors to include cross-national and historical material as much as possible. This request reflects my belief that understanding and evaluating the here and now and working realistically for a better future can only be accomplished from a comparative perspective. Too often, American sociology has been both temperate and ethnocentric. Second, I have asked authors to be sensitive to within-gender differences along class, racial, ethnic, sexual preference, and age cohort lines.

this volume presents the results of the archaeological investigations in the oasis of fewet sw libyan sahara carried out by the archaeological mission in the sahara of the sapienza university of rome evidences of an ancient rural village were identified under

the houses of the modern town of tan afella and a large necropolis dated to the garamantian times spread at the fringes of the modern settlement until 1997 very little was known on the garamantian period in the wadi tanezzuft area and on the transition from the pastoral to the early historical phase this period witnessed the gradual sedentarisation of human groups in the oases and the development of caravan routes with the flourishing of an intra and trans saharan trade these processes also influenced by significant alterations in climate which led to the agricultural exploitation of the limited areas where water resources were available the oases were archaeologically unknown as far as settlements were concerned the archaeological surveys and excavations carried out in the area of fewet were particularly promising and are here analysed in a multidisciplinary perspective which takes into consideration environmental and anthropological studies in the attempt to reconstruct the culture and the life of people inhabiting the southern fezzan region in early historical times the historical archaeology of the sahara remains an underdeveloped field of research especially for the pre islamic period the most significant exception to this rule has for long concerned the people known as the garamantes who inhabited the central saharan region coincident with libya s south west province fezzan this volume is a marvelous addition to the small corpus of published research on the pre islamic oasis societies of the sahara and provides a complementary perspective on the world of the garamantes to the anglo libyan work i have directed from their heartlands in the wadi el ajal c 400 km to north east of ghat prof david j mattingly university of leicester uk

stéphen rostain s book is a culmination of 25 years of research on the extensive human modification of the wetlands environment of guiana and how it reshapes our thinking of ancient settlement in lowland south america and other tropical zones rostain demonstrates that populations were capable of developing intensive raised field agriculture which supported significant human density and construct causeways habitation mounds canals and reservoirs to meet their needs the work is comparative in every sense drawing on ethnology ethnohistory ecology and geography contrasting island guiana with other wetland regions around the world and examining millennia of pre columbian settlement and colonial occupation alike rostain s work demands a radical rethinking of conventional wisdom about settlement in tropical lowlands and landscape management by its inhabitants over the course of millennia
