there is a need to establish a baseline a reference point against which progress in the field of prevention science can be assessed this book serves all of these purposes the idea for this book grew from the observation in the early 1990s that after decades of attempts to develop effective interventions to prevent drug use among children and adolescents in the united states that we were finally having success particularly in addressing the initiation of use these successes are the result of research that has provided a better understanding of the factors and processes associated with the onset of substance use

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Anne Fausto-Sterling's "The Five Sexes": Rethinking Biological Sex
