the induction of Dōgen into the modern academic world or perhaps more accurately the academic world's first real engagement with Dōgen came about 1924 when Watsuji Tetsurō 1889-1960 published a provocative essay entitled *Shaman Dōgen* it was this essay that to many of Watsuji's contemporaries seemed to rescue Dōgen from what they considered to be his entrapment for nearly seven centuries in the sectarian embrace of the Sōtō school Watsuji insisted that Dōgen no longer should be thought of as belonging exclusively to the monastic

community claiming instead that dōgen belongs to mankind watsuji with this declaration initiated the non sectarian study of this thirteenth century figure and in effect commenced what are called dōgen studies dagen kenkyū in modern times as one way of exploring what it might possibly mean to say that dōgen belongs to mankind the kuroda institute held a conference on dōgen at tassajara springs california from october 8 to 10 1981 the essays of this volume are a part of its result

this book is a collection of short essays by infanta eulalia of spain expressing her views on education women s independence social equality religion marriage and traditions born into the royal family her controversial views on these topics caused conflict with the monarchy particularly with her nephew king alfonso xiii who demanded that she suspend the book s publication until he had seen it and given permission eulalia refused to comply making the book a bold statement of her beliefs overall the book offers a glimpse into the progressive ideas of a member of a traditionally conservative royal family

defy the foul fiend willoughby corbo is born the illegitimate son of an irresponsible and irascible nobleman lord ollebeare and is soon abandoned on the doorstep of his uncle neglected and mostly unloved to make his way in a somewhat tilted modern world

the house of ramesses is in the hands of an old man king merenptah wants to leave the kingdom to his younger son seti but northern tribes in egypt rebel and join forces with the sea peoples invading from the north in the south the king s eldest son messuwy is angered at being passed over in favour of the younger son and plots to rid himself of his father and brother

will national independence bring to the peoples of south east asia liberty and democracy or will it mean corrupt government factional strife and insolvency or will it mean eventual absorption by totalitarian communism in this book first published in 1950 the author analyses these questions using the case history of indonesia since 1940 in which he played a leading role to illustrate his points he gives an outline of the history of south east asia its domination by the west and its convulsion by war and nationalism the seven nations of south east asia ceylon burma siam indo china malaya indonesia and the philippines have a great deal in common except for siam they are all struggling through the formative years of nationhood except for ceylon they were all occupied and pillaged by japan during the war they are of great value to other nations as a source of raw materials and foodstuffs their political and economic structure

is of vital importance both to themselves and to us and unless their new nationalism can be strengthened the free world may lose a valuable asset to its economy and an ally against totalitarianism in asia

the author is the main character of this work in which he travels through other dimensions and the origin of the universe is revealed to him
