an audience of artists turns this time line for the postwar new york art world on its head presenting a new pedigree for these artistic movements drawing on an array of previously unpublished material catherine craft reveals that neo dada far from being

a reaction to abstract expressionism actually originated at the heart of that movement's concerns about viewers' originality and artists' debts to the past and one another furthermore she argues the original dada movement was not incompatible with abstract expressionism in fact dada provided a vital historical reference for artists and critics seeking to come to terms with the radical departure from tradition that abstract expressionism seemed to represent tracing the activities of artists such as Robert Motherwell, Barnett Newman and Jackson Pollock alongside Marcel Duchamp's renewed embrace of dada in the late 1940s Craft explores the challenges facing artists trying to work in the wake of a destructive world war and the paintings, objects, writings and installations that resulted from their efforts jacket

this bold globe spanning survey is the first book to thoroughly explore the radical long standing interdependence between art and homosexuality it draws examples from the full range of the western tradition including classical renaissance and contemporary art with special focus on the modern era it was in the modern period when arguments about homosexuality and the avant garde were especially public that our current conception of the artist and the homosexual began to take shape and almost as quickly to overlap not a chronology of gay or lesbian artists the book is a fascinating and sophisticated account of the ways two conspicuous identities have

fundamentally informed one another art and homosexuality discusses many of modernism's canonical figures painters like Courbet Picasso and Pollock writers like Whitman and Stein and issues such as the rise of abstraction the avant garde's relationship to its patrons and the political exploitation of art it shows that many of the core ideas that define modernism are nearly indecipherable without an understanding of the paired identities of artist and homosexual illustrated with over 175 b/w and color images that range from high to popular culture and from ancient Greece to contemporary America art and homosexuality punctures the platitudes surrounding discussions of both aesthetics and sexual identity and takes our understanding of each in stimulating new directions

The Davidsons assembled an extraordinary collection of American drawings dating from 1960 to the present showcasing the continuing currency of realism and humanism featuring such artists as William Bailey Jack Beal William Beckman Rackstraw Downes Janet Fish Alex Katz Alfred Leslie Michael Mazur Alice Neel and Philip Pearlstein the collection has been given to the Art Institute of Chicago which is exhibiting 125 of its finest examples this beautiful volume includes biographies of the artists and an important critical essay by Ruth E. Fine 126 colour illustrations

One hundred years after the founding of the *École coloniale supérieure* in Antwerp the adjacent Middelheim Museum invites Sandrine Colard researcher and curator to conceive an exhibition that probes silenced histories of colonialism in a site specific way for Colard the term *Congoville* encompasses the tangible and intangible urban traces of the colony not on the African continent but in 21st century Belgium a school building a park imperial myths and citizens of African descent in the exhibition and this adjoining publication the concept *Congoville* is the starting point for 15 contemporary artists to address colonial history and ponder its aftereffects as black flâneurs walking through a postcolonial city due to the multitude of perspectives and voices this book is both a catalogue and a reference work comprised of artistic and academic contributions together the participating artists and invited authors unfold the blueprint of *Congoville* an imaginary city that still subconsciously affects us but also encourages us to envision a decolonial utopia een eeuw na de oprichting van de

an illustrated feast for the eye and intellect dutch art explores developments in art art history art criticism and cultural history of the netherlands from the artists workshops for the utrecht dom in 1475 to the latest movements of the 1990s it is lavishly illustrated with 147 black and white photographs and 16 pages in full color more than 100 internationally recognized scholars museum professionals artists and art critics contributed signed essays to this monumental work including historians sociologists and literary historians

this is a much needed important collection a goldmine of sources for scholars and students the texts articulate the key primitivist aesthetic discourses of the period offering crucial insight into the complex and always changing nexus between culture politics and representation because of the breadth of the materials covered and the controversies they raise this anthology is one of the all too rare volumes that not only will provide reference materials for years to come but also will feature centrally in classroom discussions suzanne preston blier author of african vodun art psychology and power for almost a century art historians have fretted about the notion of primitivism in the arts this comprehensive in both senses of the word anthology is a peerless source of the history of responses to works categorized as primitive in its range the book touches upon all the troubling questions formal

anthropological political historical that have bedeviled the study of the arts of oceania africa and north and south america and provides the grounds at last for intelligent pursuit of keener distinctions i regard this book as a superb contribution to the study of modern art in fact indispensable dore ashton author of *noguchi east and west* an extraordinarily useful and complete collection of primary documents many translated for the first time into english and almost all unlikely to be encountered elsewhere without serious effort its five sections each with a lively and scholarly introduction reveal the diverse views of artists and writers on primitive art from matisse picasso and fry to many far less known and sometimes surprising figures the book also uncovers the politics and aesthetics of the major museum exhibitions that gained acceptance for art that had been both reviled and mythologized recent texts included are all germane this book will be invaluable for any college course on the topic shelly errington author of *the death of authentic primitive art* and *other tales of progress* an exceptionally valuable anthology of seventy documents most heretofore unavailable in english on the ongoing controversies surrounding primitivism and modern art insightfully chosen and annotated the collection is brilliantly introduced by jack flam s essay on the historical progression contexts and cultural complexities of more than one hundred years ideas about primitivism rich timely illuminating herbert m cole author of *icons ideals and power in the art of africa*

the first major work to examine joseph cornell s relationship to american modernism joseph cornell 1903 1972 is best known for his exquisite and alluring box constructions in which he transformed found objects such as celestial charts glass ice cubes and feathers into enchanted worlds that blur the boundaries between fantasy and the commonplace situating cornell within the broader artistic cultural and political debates of midcentury america this innovative and interdisciplinary account reveals enchantment s relevance to the history of american modernism in this beautifully illustrated book marci kwon explores cornell s attempts to convey enchantment an ephemeral experience that exceeds rational explanation in material form examining his box constructions graphic design projects and cinematic experiments she shows how he turned to formal strategies drawn from movements like transcendentalism

and romanticism to figure the immaterial kwon provides new perspectives on cornell's artistic and graphic design career bringing vividly to life a wide circle of acquaintances that included artists poets writers and filmmakers such as mina loy lincoln kirstein frank o'hara and stan brakhage cornell's participation in these varied milieus elucidates enchantment's centrality to midcentury conversations about art's potential for power and moral authority and reveals how enchantment and modernity came to be understood as opposing forces leading contemporary artists such as betye saar and carolee schneemann turned to cornell's enchantment as a resource for their own anti racist feminist projects spanning four decades of the artist's career enchantments sheds critical light on cornell's engagement with many key episodes in american modernism from abstract expressionism 1930s folk art and the emergence of new york school poetry and experimental cinema to the transatlantic migration of symbolism surrealism and ballet

photography possesses a powerful ability to bear witness aid remembrance shape and even alter recollection in beyond memory soviet nonconformist photography and photo related works of art the general editor diane neumaier and twenty three contributors offer a rigorous examination of the medium's role in late soviet unofficial art focusing on the period between the mid 1950s and the late 1980s they explore artists unusually inventive and resourceful uses of photography within a highly developed soviet dissident culture during this time lack of high quality photographic materials complimented by tremendous creative impulses prompted artists to explore experimental photo processes such as camera and darkroom manipulations photomontage and hand coloring photography also took on a provocative array of forms including photo installation artist made samizdat self published books photo realist painting and many other surprising applications of the flexible medium beyond memory shows how innovative conceptual moves and approaches to form and content echoes of soviet society's coded communication and a russian sense of absurdity were common in the soviet cultural underground collectively the works in this anthology demonstrate how late soviet artists employed irony and invention to make positive use of difficult circumstances in the

process the volume illuminates the multiple characters of photography itself and highlights the leading role that the medium has come to play in the international art world today beyond memory stands on its own as a rigorous examination of photography's place in late soviet unofficial art while also serving as a supplement to the traveling exhibition of the same title

diego rivera dorothea lange adolfo pérez esquivel art and activism have long been intertwined and the political fallout has resulted in an artistic canon riddled with historical holes one of the most glaring omissions from most listings of american art masters is ad reinhardt 1913-67 an artist who had significant ties to the american communist movement and leftist political organizations reinhardt and his contributions to modern art have been largely pushed out of the spotlight for political reasons but in this unprecedented in depth study of reinhardt's life and work michael corris returns the artist to his rightful place in the history of modern art and culture a pioneering avant garde artist with fierce political beliefs reinhardt immersed himself in the vibrant left wing political and cultural circles of the 1930s and 40s only to be marginalized by the social and cultural conservatism that arose in postwar

america corris examines reinhardt s work against this historical background charting the development of his entire oeuvre ranging from his abstract paintings to his popular graphic artwork illustrations and cartoons ad reinhardt also re evaluates reinhardt s role and influence in the art world chronicling his time as an artist and educator at the california school of fine arts university of wyoming yale university and hunter college and examining his influence on younger artists who created successive avant garde movements such as minimal and conceptual art a long awaited examination of a less heralded american master ad reinhardt is a fascinating portrait of an artist whose political radicalism infused his art with a poignant resonance that stretches through this rediscovery into the present

in 1970 photography curator peter c bunnell organized an exhibition called photography into sculpture for the museum of modern art new york the project which brought together twenty three photographers and artists from the united states and canada was among the first exhibitions to recognize work that blurred the boundaries between photography and other mediums at once an exhibition catalogue after the fact an oral history and a critical reading of exhibitions and experimental photography during the 1960s and 1970s the photographic object 1970 proposes precedents for contemporary artists who continue to challenge traditional practices and categories mary statzer has gathered a range of diverse materials including contributions from bunnell eva respini and drew sawyer erin o toole lucy soutter and rebecca morse as well as interviews with ellen brooks michael de courcy richard jackson jerry mcmillan and other of the exhibition s surviving artists featuring seventy nine illustrations most of them in color this volume is an essential resource on a groundbreaking exhibition

when it comes to viewing art living in the information age is not necessarily a benefit so argues michael findlay in this book that encourages a new way of looking at art much of this thinking involves stripping away what we have been taught and instead trusting our own instincts opinions and reactions including reproductions of works by mark rothko paul klee joan miró jacob lawrence and other modern and contemporary masters this book takes readers on a journey through modern art chapters such as what is a work of art can we look and see at the same time and real connoisseurs are not snobs not only give readers the confidence to form their own opinions but also encourages them to make connections that spark curiosity intellect and imagination the most important thing for us to grasp writes findlay is that the essence of a great work of art is inert until it is seen our engagement with the work of art liberates its essence after reading this book even the most intimidated art viewer will enter a museum or gallery feeling more confident and leave it feeling enriched and inspired
