in 1856 the church of jesus christ of latter day saints employed a new means of getting converts to great salt lake city who could not afford the journey otherwise they began using handcarts thus initiating a five year experiment that has become a legend in the annals of mormon and north american migration only one in ten mormon emigrants used handcarts but of those 3 000 who did between 1856 and 1860 most survived the harrowing journey to settle utah and become members of a remarkable pioneer generation others were not so lucky more than 200 died along the way victims of exhaustion accident and for a few starvation and exposure to late season wyoming blizzards now candy moulton tells of their successes travails and tragedies in an epic retelling of a legendary story the mormon handcart migration traces each stage of the

journey from the transatlantic voyage of newly converted church members to the gathering of the faithful in the eastern nebraska encampment known as winter quarters she then traces their trek from the western great plains across modern day wyoming to their final destination at great salt lake the handcart experiment was the brainchild of mormon leader brigham young who decreed that the saints could haul their own possessions pushing or pulling two wheeled carts across 1 100 miles of rough terrain much of it roadless and some of it untrodden the lds church now embraces the saga of the handcart emigrants including even the disaster that befell the martin and willie handcart companies in central wyoming in 1856 as an educational faith inspiring experience for thousands of youth each year moulton skillfully weaves together scores of firsthand accounts from the journals letters diaries reminiscences and autobiographies the handcart pioneers left behind depth of research and unprecedented detail make this volume an essential history of the mormon handcart migration

the james g willie edward martin handcart companies were the last to emigrate to utah in 1856 after leaving liverpool england with such high hopes to make it in the salt lake valley they ran into snow storms starvation death in the foothills of the wind river mountains in wyoming they were finally rescued but not before over 200 perished of exhaustion starvation freezing to death included are the hunt hodgett wagon trains as they followed the martin handcart company experienced much of the same cold hunger freezing the book is 6 x 9 hardcover 230 pages indexed includes the daily emigrating journals of all four companies genealogical information including birth marriage death dates of most of the emigrants several histories photographs of historical sites including mississippi platte sweetwater green bear rivers chimney rock fort laramie fort bridger rocky ridge rock creek others to order call or write lynne s turner 1871 condie drive taylorsville ut 84119 5501 801 969 2278

follow the fascinating true stories of one family through the mormon pioneer era stories that follow four generations and several of the author s family lines as they and their fellow pioneers help shape the early history of the mormon church the american west and even mexico this memorable journey is the culmination of fifteen years of painstaking research as the author carefully reconstructs the pioneer struggles from before 1830 to 1918 using information from family journals memoirs histories and letters volume ii pioneering the west defending zion 1847 1880 continues the history by recounting the family s involvement in the opening and colonization of the great basin it recounts in detail the dangerous crossing of the plains in covered wagons with handcarts and on foot it tells of explorations of planting tiny settlements in remote regions eating roots and rawhide to survive and fighting insect hordes and hostile indians volume ii also tells how the mormons faced off the u s army and how they helped build the railroad across the plains my own pioneers is an important work

illuminating the legacy of the mormon pioneers it is a compilation of true chronological accounts through which their lives their sacrifices and their considerable accomplishments despite terrible hardship may be honored with its extensive index this book provides an excellent research tool for academics as well as history enthusiasts and it uplifts every reader by showcasing the enduring strength and mighty faith of these pioneers

the willie handcart company of 1856 was a trial and a miracle you will feel a part of the company as you follow three of its members in a moving masterpiece that will take you from the green fields of denmark to the icy peaks of the rockies in a saga that elevates and enriches those that it touches

the story of a mormon pioneer who triumphed over hardship came to a new land established a settlement in a new territory became a renowned musician and teacher local businessman and church leader includes a sketch of his life written by his son alfred m durham and thomas durham s personal journal covering the years 1854 to 1871

church history study guide pt 3 latter day prophets since 1844 this volume is the third of three on church history and the doctrine and covenants it covers church history during the administration of all of its prophet prophets since joseph smith it begins with the succession of the apostles after joseph smith s martyrdom the building of the nauvoo temple and the trek to the west of the latter day saint pioneers we follow them through iowa winter quarters and on to utah we witness the colonization of the state of deseret while the rest of the country suffered from civil war then we follow events through the administrations of all of the 19th century 20th century and 21st century prophets from john taylor to thomas s monson we become familiar with the early lives missions marriages and callings of each of these prophets seeing how the lord prepared them for the particular time that they led the church we finish with a look toward the future as we await the second coming of our lord the cover features a beautiful photograph of the salt lake temple taken at dusk during the christmas season from the roof of the joseph smith memorial building

fourteen year old george harrison emigrated from england to utah in 1856 he was part of a mormon family relocating to zion for both religious and economic reasons the young man suffering from malaria and extreme food shortages in the martin handcart company abandoned his family and spent a winter with a compassionate indian family that saved him from starvation soon after at fort laramie harrison served as a civilian cook for an army surgeon he accompanied troops during the march into salt lake city in 1858 and cooked at camp floyd upon the camp s closure in 1861 he cooked at an overland stage and pony express station george harrison subsequently worked as a freighter and served in the black hawk war in mid life he built a small restaurant and

hotel in springville utah harrison s cooking singing and story telling attracted drummers traveling salesmen who gave the restaurateur the name of beefsteak because of the quality of his steaks

it is unparalleled in history the procession of latter day saints pushing handcarts from iowa city and florence omaha to their promised zion by the great salt lake many of the three thousand hardy souls who trudged across thirteen hundred miles of prairie desert and mountain from 1856 to 1860 were european converts to the mormon faith without funds for wagons and oxen they carried their possessions in two wheeled carts powered and aided by their own muscle and blood some of the weary travelers would finally be welcomed by their brethren in salt lake city others would go to wayside graves or get caught in early winter storms in the rockies and hope to be rescued by the parties sent out by brigham young the migration is described in handcarts to zion which draws on diaries and reports of the participants rosters of the ten companies and a collection of the songs sung on the trail and at the gathering leroy r hafen and ann w hafen dedicated the book to his mother mary ann hafen who wrote about the long journey in recollections of a handcart pioneer of 1860 a woman s life on the mormon frontier also a bison book

though the restored church is comparatively young it has a rich and vivid history with more artifacts being uncovered constantly this second volume highlights the history of the church through 50 more sacred objects gathered throughout the church s history from its beginning with joseph smith and the first vision the restoration has spread across the globe and every piece of historic evidence tells the stories of the latter day saints in this volume you will find photos and commentary of objects such as a fragment of the original book of mormon manuscript wilford woodruff s journal the first latter day saint hymnbook from 1836 a lace doily from armenian refugee saints joseph fielding smith s typewriter the kabul afghanistan military district conference dvd tom trails filmstrips from the 1960s a seawall stone from moroni high school in kiribati these relics of days past testify of the hardships joys and testimonies of latter day saints throughout the history of the church through these small glimpses of history you can interact with your forebears and be inspired by their stories of faith

why do thousands of mormons devote their summer vacations to following the mormon trail why does the church of jesus christ of latter day day saints spend millions of dollars to build monuments and visitor centers that believers can visit to experience the history of their nineteenth century predecessors who fled westward in search of their promised land why do so many mormon teenagers dress up in little house on the

prairie style garb and push handcarts over the highest local hills they can find and what exactly is a traveling zion in pioneers in the attic sara patterson analyzes how and why mormons are engaging their nineteenth century past in the modern era arguing that as the lds community globalized in the late twentieth and early twenty first centuries its relationship to space was transformed following their exodus to utah nineteenth century mormons believed that they must gather together in salt lake zion their new center place they believed that zion was a place you could point to on a map a place you should dwell in to live a righteous life later mormons had to reinterpret these central theological principles as their community spread around the globe but to say that they simply spiritualized concepts that had once been understood literally is only one piece of the puzzle contemporary mormons still want to touch and to feel these principles so they mark and claim the landscapes of the american west with versions of their history carved in stone they develop rituals that allow them not only to learn the history of the nineteenth century journey west but to engage it with all of their senses pioneers in the attic reveals how modern day mormons have created a sense of community and felt religion through the memorialization of early mormon pioneers of the american west immortalizing a narrative of shared identity through an emphasis on place and collective memory

the 1856 presidential race was the most violent peacetime election in american history war between proslavery and antislavery settlers raged in kansas a congressman shot an irish immigrant at a washington hotel and another congressman beat a us senator senseless on the floor of the senate but amid all the violence the campaign of the new republican party headed by famed explorer john c frémont offered a ray of hope a major party dedicated to limiting the spread of slavery for the first time women and african americans actively engaged in a presidential contest and the candidate s wife jessie benton frémont played a central role in both planning and executing strategy and was a public face of the campaign even enslaved blacks in the south took hope from frémont s crusade the 1856 campaign was also run against the backdrop of a country on the move with settlers continuing to spread westward facing unimagined horrors a terrible natural disaster that took hundreds of lives in the south and one of the most famous supreme court cases in history which set the stage for the civil war frémont lost but his strong showing in the north proved that a sectional party could win a national election blazing the trail for abraham lincoln s victory four years later

for more than a century american communities erected monuments to western pioneers although many of these statues receive little attention today the images they depict sturdy white men saintly mothers and wholesome pioneer families enshrine prevailing notions of american exceptionalism race relations and gender identity pioneer mother monuments is the first book to delve into the long and complex history of remembering forgetting and rediscovering pioneer monuments in this book historian

cynthia culver prescott combines visual analysis with a close reading of primary source documents examining some two hundred monuments erected in the united states from the late nineteenth century to the present prescott begins her survey by focusing on the earliest pioneer statues which celebrated the strong white men who settled and conquered the west by the 1930s she explains when gender roles began shifting new monuments came forth to honor the pioneer mother the angelic woman in a sunbonnet armed with a rifle or a bible as she carried civilization forward an iconic figure resonated particularly with mormon audiences while interest in these traditional monuments began to wane in the postwar period according to prescott a new wave of pioneer monuments emerged in smaller communities during the late twentieth century inspired by rural nostalgia these statues helped promote heritage tourism in recent years americans have engaged in heated debates about confederate civil war monuments and their implicit racism should these statues be removed or reinterpreted far less attention however has been paid to pioneer monuments which prescott argues also enshrine white cultural superiority as well as gender stereotypes only a few western communities have reexamined these values and erected statues with more inclusive imagery blending western history visual culture and memory studies prescott s pathbreaking analysis is enhanced by a rich selection of color and black and white photographs depicting the statues along with detailed maps that chronologically chart the emergence of pioneer monuments

the cannibal within offers an evolutionary account of the propensity of human beings in extreme circumstances to eat other human beings despite the strong western taboo against such practices what sets this volume apart from the large body of literature on cannibalism both popular and anthropological is the underlying premise cannibalism as an alternative to starvation is tacitly condoned by the same biological morality that would condemn cannibalism of other sorts in non threatening situations deep as the taboos may be the survival instinct runs even deeper the title of the book reflects the author s belief that cannibalism is not a pathology that erupts in psychotic individuals but is a universal adaptive strategy that is evolutionarily sound the cannibal is within all of us and cannibals are within all cultures should the circumstances demand cannibalism s appearance and usage petrinovich s work is rich in historical detail and rises to a level of theoretical sophistication in addressing a subject too often dealt with in sensationalist terms the major instances in which survival cannibalism has occurred convinced the author that there is a consistent pattern and a uniform regularity of order in which different kinds of individuals are consumed in considering who eats whom when and under what circumstances this regularity appears and it is consistent with what would be expected on the basis of evolutionary or darwinian theory in short he concludes that starvation cannibalism is not a manifestation of the chaotic psychotic behavior of individuals who are driven to madness but reveals underlying characteristics of evolved human beings lewis petrinovich is professor emeritus in the

department of psychology of the university of california riverside and is currently a resident of berkeley california

hosea stout witnessed and influenced many of the major civil and political events over fifty years of lds history but until the publication of his diaries he was a relatively obscure figure to historians hosea stout lawman legislator mormon defender is the first ever biography of this devoted follower who played a significant role in mormon and utah history stout joined the mormons in missouri in 1838 and followed them to nauvoo where he rose quickly to become a top leader in the nauvoo legion and chief of police a position he also held at winter quarters he became the first attorney general for the territory of utah was elected to the utah territorial legislature and served as regent for the university of deseret which later became the university of utah and as judge advocate of the nauvoo legion in utah in 1862 stout was appointed us attorney for the territory of utah by president abraham lincoln in 1867 he became city attorney of salt lake city and he was elected to the utah house of representatives in 1881 but stout s history also had its troubled moments known as a violent man and aggressive enforcer he was often at the center of controversy during his days on the police force and was accused of having a connection with deaths in nauvoo and utah ultimately however none of these allegations ever found traction and the leaders of the lds community especially brigham young saw to it that stout was promoted to roles of increasing responsibility throughout his life when he died in 1889 hosea stout left a complicated legacy of service to his state his church and the members of his faith community

saints vol 2 no unhallowed hand covers church history from 1846 through 1893 volume 2 narrates the saints expulsion from nauvoo their challenges in gathering to the western united states and their efforts to settle utah s wasatch front the second volume concludes with the dedication of the salt lake temple

the enduring saga of mormonism is its great trek across the plains and understanding that trek was the life work of stanley b kimball master of mormon trails this final work a collaboration he began and which was completed after his death in 2003 by his photographer writer wife violet explores that movement westward as a social history with the mormons moving as villages on wheels set in the broader context of transcontinental migration to oregon and california the mormon trek spanned twenty two years moved approximately 54 700 individuals many of them in family groups and left about 7 000 graves at the trailside like a true social history this fascinating account in fourteen chapters explores both the routines of the trail cooking cleaning laundry dealing with bodily functions and the dramatic moments encountering indians and stampeding buffalo giving birth losing loved ones to death dealing with rage and injustice but also offering succor kindness and faith religious observances were simultaneously an important part of creating and maintaining group cohesiveness but

working them into the fabric of the grueling day to day routine resulted in adaptation including a sliding sabbath the role played by children and teens receives careful scrutiny not only did children grow up quickly on the trail but the gender boundaries guarding their separate spheres blurred under the erosion of concentrating on tasks that had to be done regardless of the age or sex of those available to do them unexpected attention is given to african americans who were part of this westering experience and violet also gives due credit to the four legged heroes who hauled the wagons westward

leonard arrington who died in 1999 is considered by most if not all serious scholars of mormon and western history as the single most important figure to write on lds history great basin kingdom is perhaps his greatest work a classic in mormon studies and western history great basin kingdom offers insights into the underdeveloped american economy a comprehensive treatment of one of the few native american religious movements and detailed exciting stories from little known phases of mormon and american history this edition includes thirty new photographs and an introduction by ronald w walker that provides a brief biography of arrington as well as the history of the work its place in mormon and western historiography and its lasting impact

maxine noe is a precocious child with a vivid imagination and a decided flair for the dramatic they are traits that serve the young vagabond well moving about as she does with her single mother during the 1920s when her mother lands a job in 1930 as a cook in a miners hotel in a small company owned mining camp ten year old maxine finds both the security she craves and the perfect backdrop for more adventure tucked away in utah s castle country so named because of the area s castle like rock formations the little town of kenilworth was given its name by an early immigrant miner who saw in its rugged towering outcrops the old and crumbling castle kenilworth in his native england the town s colorful history magical setting and diverse residents provide a rich environment for a young girl coming of age and color as well the challenges sorrows and triumphs that shape the little town s life this is a true story of hardship tragedy and love the events of maxine s young life portray both the fragility and tenacity of family and the castle hills that shelter her nourish her dreams and steel her character for the challenges she will surely meet beyond their rugged walls

in this tale people scattered throughout the world are woven together in the valleys of the rocky mountains forty years after napoleon s defeat the development of modern warfare on the crimean peninsula sends reverberations across the globe alerting all of the growth in technology the precursor of the us civil war in weapons and tactics as well as the needs of multitudes of dispossessed and underrepresented the shrinking planet is growing crowded the bumping into one another becomes increasingly violent women and men stand to be counted molded of numerous talents and abilities striving for relief and equality demanding rights and opportunity slavery reservations women s

suffrage polygamy and manifest destiny are swirled into the murky vat of the united states protesting members of the church of jesus christ of latter day saints known derisively as mormons are challenged over religious freedom despite the continued criticism heaped upon them for their unique doctrines missionary work and its effects spread throughout the nation and the earth the 1850s see the homeland of deseret plowing against bloody kansas buchannan s blunder mountain meadows the sevastopol policy the pony express and the transcontinental telegraph these ventures combine with similar troubles and shove the nation into the red hot furnace of civil war

this manual covers the historical period of the church from joseph smith to president gordon b hinckley for institute courses religion 341 342 and 343 also useful for individual and family study

in 1857 president james buchanan ordered u s troops to utah to replace brigham young as governor and restore order in what the federal government viewed as a territory in rebellion in this compelling narrative award winning authors david l bigler and will bagley use long suppressed sources to show that contrary to common perception the mormon rebellion was not the result of buchannan s blunder nor was it a david and goliath tale in which an abused religious minority heroically defied the imperial ambitions of an unjust and tyrannical government they argue that mormon leaders had their own far reaching ambitions and fully intended to establish an independent nation the kingdom of god in the west long overshadowed by the civil war the tragic story of this conflict involved a tense and protracted clash pitting brigham young s nauvoo legion against colonel albert sidney johnston and the u s army s utah expedition in the end the conflict between the two armies saw no pitched battles but in the authors view buchannan s decision to order troops to utah his so called blunder eventually proved decisive and beneficial for both mormons and the american republic a rich exploration of events and forces that presaged the civil war the mormon rebellion broadens our understanding of both antebellum america and utah s frontier theocracy and offers a challenging reinterpretation of a controversial chapter in mormon annals

what begins with simple observations from a utah transplant to wyoming becomes an ode to family and place and perhaps an elegy for it all jeffe kennedy author of wyoming trucks true love and the weather channel in this unconventional memoir kevin holdsworth vividly portrays life in remote unpredictable country and ruminates on the guts or foolishness it takes to put down roots and raise a family in a merciless environment growing up in utah holdsworth couldn t wait to move away once ensconced on the east coast however he found himself writing westerns and dreaming of the mountains he d skied and climbed fed up with city life he moved to a small wyoming town in big wonderful he writes of a mountaineering companion s death the difficult birth of his son and his father s terminal illness encounters with mortality that

sharpened his ideas about risk care and commitment he puts a new spin on mountaineering literature telling wild tales from his reunion with the mountains but also relating the surprising willpower it took to turn back from risks he would have taken before he became a father he found he needed courage to protect and engage deeply with his family his community and the wild places he loves holdsworth s essays and poems are rich with anecdotes characters and vivid images readers will feel as if they themselves watched a bear destroy an entire expedition s food walked with his great great grandmother along the icy mormon trail and tried to plant a garden in wyoming s infamous wind readers who love the outdoors will eagerly partake as holdsworth invites us to sit down at his literary campfire and listen to vivid unforgettable stories high country news
