for the palestinians who live in the narrow coastal strip of gaza the israeli invasion of december 2008 was a nightmare of unimaginable proportions in the 22 day long action 1 400 gazans were killed several hundred on the first day alone and yet while nothing should diminish palestinian suffering through those frightful days it is possible something redemptive is emerging from the tragedy of gaza for as norman finkelstein details in a concise work that melds cold anger with cool analysis the profound injustice of the israeli assault was widely recognized by bodies that it is impossible to brand as partial or extremist amnesty international human rights watch and the un investigation headed by richard goldstone in documenting israel s use of indiscriminate and intentional force against the civilian population during the invasion 100

palestinians died for every one israeli have had an impact on longstanding support for israel jews in both the unites states and the united kingdom for instance have begun to voice dissent and this trend is especially apparent among the young such a shift finkelstein contends can create new pressure capable of moving the middle east crisis towards a solution one that embraces justice for palestinians and israelis alike this new paperback edition has been revised throughout and includes an extensive afterword on the israeli attack on the gaza freedom flotilla which resulted in the deaths of nine activists and further strained the loyalty of many of israel s traditional allies around the world it also contains a brand new appendix in which finkelstein dissects the official israeli investigation of the flotilla attack

this book extends the study of homelessness beyond the need of shelter philosophical exploration exposes the fragility of human fulfillment in contemporary society the authors weave the moral fabric of what it means to be human they show how economic and political values compromise the dignity of homeless persons they argue for recognition of rights for the homeless who otherwise would be voiceless and without membership in the moral community this pioneering contribution instills our moral sensitivity to the homeless condition and justifies our moral responsibility to change that condition

this new and expanded edition of g john m abbastno s anthology the ethics of homelessness underscores what is ignored in plain sight people without a home or dwelling are also without privacy and dignity it is argued that they lack moral standing the chapters uncover the harsh realities of poverty where economic value overrides competing human values naomi zack argues that homelessness is symbolic of society s materialistic values it has a tendency to resist sufficient charity and perpetuates conditions of injustice uma narayan questions whether the homeless have protection under the u s constitution other authors present an enlarged sphere of homeless to include runaway children refugees adoptees and the disabled the book demonstrates the value of applied philosophy

in the time beneath the concrete nasser abourahme argues that settler colonialism is always as much an attempt to conquer time as it is to conquer land taking as his primary object palestinian refugee camps created in the fallout of the eliminatory violence of israel s founding abourahme shows how these camps become the primary place where settler colonial attempts to dominate space and time encounter indigenous refusal seen from the camps israel becomes a settler colonial project

defined by its inability to move past the past a project stuck at its foundational moment of conquest at the same time the palestinian insistence on return is a refusal to abide by the closure of the past into settler futurity palestinian struggle does not just happen in the open time of dispossession it happens over this time that struggle aboutahme demonstrates is a form of anticolonial refusal that draws its power not from any decisive finality but precisely from irresolution and keeping time open duke university press scholars of color first book award

this book brings together testimonials from people of different nationalities and professions who are pro palestinian whether as scholars film makers artists musicians activists or ngo workers using what oral historians call the focused life history renowned scholar rosemary sayigh invites her contributors to describe the experiences events motives and feelings that led them to support the palestinian cause the book is the first of its kind in palestiniography and includes voices from countries across the world a chapter is dedicated to each country and contributors are asked to reveal how they discovered palestine given that palestine is rarely mentioned in school textbooks or university courses whether by travel friendship study membership in a political party or book group they are also asked to detail what specific forms their engagement has taken ranging scholarly creative militant or charitable and what their hopes are for the international solidarity movement finally each contributor reflects on if they feel a just and equitable solution can ever be achieved for palestinians and if they accept the label pro palestinian or would rather define their relationship to the palestinians in some other way with testimonies from both high profile and grassroots activists the book is a rich and personal selection that reflects the diversity dynamism and global nature of the movement for palestine

homeless heritage describes the process of using archaeological methodologies to collaboratively document how contemporary homeless people use and experience the city drawing on fieldwork undertaken in bristol and york the book first describes the way in which archaeological methods and theory have come to be usefully applied to the contemporary world before exploring the historical development of the concept of homelessness working with homeless people the author undertook surveys and two excavations of contemporary homeless sites and the team co curated two public heritage exhibitions with surprising results complementing a growing body of literature that details how collaborative and

participatory heritage projects can give voice to marginalised groups homeless heritage details what it means to be homeless in the twenty first century

this collection of fifteen essays deals with the literary memoirs of major twentieth century writers and focuses on the spiritual physical and moral devastation of 20th century life they are comparative and cross cultural there is no other collection of essays with this range brought under one cover

this oral history collection brings together extended interviews with fifteen women illuminating the part that gender roles play in ensnaring women in cycles of domestic abuse and homelessness and highlighting the physical stresses it also challenges liberal myths about homeless people and homeless women in particular

this book first published in 1987 examines british american and israeli practices in the middle east it explains these countries attitudes in the united nations towards the palestinian problem and the role of the united states regarding every arab israeli war it attempts to acquaint the reader with the reasons why so many years were years of no decision and why the debates were mere exercises in futility

despite many attempts at regional and international negotiations since the time of the mandate the conflict has persisted and the palestinians still do not have a state the continuation of the palestinian question within the more general context of this issue places it at the heart of the conflict and this is the reason why i centered my analysis on the israelis and just the palestinians instead of all the arab states in the region lack of a solution to the arab israeli conflict may thus be associated with absence of a state for the palestinians my case study begins with a brief introduction to trends in negotiations after which i come to my central research question why despite all these attempts at negotiation had the arab israeli conflict not been resolved i had a feeling the problem might have to do with beliefs that is both sides to the conflict held and some still hold maximalist beliefs about having the whole of what was mandated palestine for themselves both sides have made advances toward peace but the conflict continues and the palestinians still do not have a state i assumed that unless both sides changed their beliefs regarding territory there would be no resolution to the conflict in my view change was not a matter of eliminating a belief but changing the priority of one belief over another i e to believe in peace instead of believing in having all the land of palestine before developing some ideas about beliefs in the next section i reviewed some of the literature in international relations that dealt with conflict analysis two of the more popular ones are the realist approach and organizational theory realist theorists hans morgenthau and kenneth waltz examine conflict in terms of maximizing interests in particular power see introduction their approaches can explain situations where interests are clear cut but power cannot always impose itself as is seen by international attempts at negotiation or even israel s efforts to impose a solution on the palestinians organizational theory does not necessarily explain situations where state or government bureaucracies don t exist e g with the palestinians during the time of the mandate i then decided to go ahead and see what beliefs had to offer to conflict analysis in the section following the realist and organization discussion i looked at beliefs from the standpoint of belief system theorists in international relations and from the psychological approaches that influenced them in order to better examine beliefs and be able to use them to explain this conflict and perhaps others later i formulated four questions and then looked at what belief system theorists and psychologists had to say about them how were beliefs formed were they consistent with behavior could they change and if so how two of the major theories in psychology were looked at attribution and learning see introduction for more on these approaches from these two approaches we can learn much about how

beliefs are formed and in so doing how they can change for example in interpreting incoming information individuals tend to attribute causes to explaining event this causation process implies some reasoning ability and facilitates learning one problem with attribution theory is that it indicates what an individual should do but the person is not always so careful in causal analysis still the approach is valuable to understanding beliefs these theories also highlight the importance of experience as the past is so often the source of recurrent behavior for any successful negotiation communicat

greed kills the cat the greed of the right wing of the israeli jewish public is the greatest threat facing regional peace and stability their inability to control their avarice and to be satisfied will only lead to corruption and war not a day passes without new decisions for expanding existing settlements or creating new ones this is in addition to the imposition of israeli sovereignty on the occupied syrian golan and occupied arab jerusalem this book documents the price already paid by the palestinian people for the creation of the jewish state palestinians find themselves uprooted from their country with over 418 towns and villages obliterated from the face of the earth and jews exclusively living in their homes under the pretext of absentee property the remaining palestinians find themselves living in ghetto areas reservations surrounded by walls and gates the main culprit for the gradual liquidation of historical palestine is the more than thirty years of british colonial rule from 1917 to 1948 without making britain and the jewish state accountable for their crimes committed against the palestinian people the palestinian authority will not be able to realize a palestinian state in the west bank and gaza nor is the palestinian tragedy over given the insatiable greed of the right wing of the jewish public these jews are now calling for the annexation of more than a third of the area of the west bank what remained of palestine after 1948 and stand against the creation of a palestinian state in the context of a two state solution whereas the jewish holocaust ended in 1945 the liquidation of palestine at the hands of the victims of the holocaust has not ended to this day

this definitive biography of george antonius tells the life story of a man who lived during a dramatic period of history amid challenge that remains unresolved the palestine Zionist conflict betrayal of palestine is an important and innovative work about the continuing controversy of empire and nationalism this book traces antonius s contribution and ideas on nation building and good governance and resonates for contemporary seekers of peace in the middle east as an archaeology of

ideas and meaning the book will be of great significance for the millennium it speaks to the paradigm of a conqueror's code and to the ever present danger of special interests capturing public policy and corrupting good governance by rediscovering antonius's message about institutions and nation building and the true meaning of morality conscience and public service betrayal of palestine speaks to contemporary people in a voice that reconnects the past with the present the book offers hope to a region where many solutions have failed and a reminder that the solutions have been there all along in the people and traditions of the middle east but they have been obscured by a conqueror's code of empire and nationalism it is a reminder of the genius of democracy and the power of first principles that ordinary people are important that power must be shared and that society as nation transcends tribalism and its more virulent contemporary form nationalism

the best of hard times explores the gendered identities of two generations of men in the shatila palestinian refugee camp in beirut gustavo barbosa compares the fida iyyin the men who served as freedom fighters to reconquer palestine in the 1970s to the shabab their sons who lead seemingly mundane lives with limited access to power while the fida iyyinn displayed their masculinity through active resistance and fighting to return to their homeland the shabab have a more nuanced relationship to palestine and articulate their gender belonging in alternative ways through vivid ethnographic stories barbosa critically engages with certain trends in feminism calling attention to their limits and considering nimble views on gender instead of presenting the shabab as emasculated or experiencing a crisis of masculinity the book shows the pliability of masculinity in time and space and argues that gender has limited purchase to capture the experiences of today's youth from shatila based on two years of fieldwork the best of hard times answers the burgeoning demand for anthropological literature on arab masculinities and portrays refugees as inventive actors rather than agentless victims of circumstances beyond their control the best of hard times is a tour de force combining highbrow theory with gripping ethnography challenging many of the stereotypes on gender power statehood and the role of islam in the middle east

time transforms the way we see world politics and insinuates itself into the ways we act in this groundbreaking volume agathangelou and killian bring together scholars from a range of disciplines to tackle time and temporality in international relations the authors critical theorists artists and poets theorize and speak from the vantage point of the anticolonial

postcolonial and decolonial event they investigate an array of experiences and structures of violence oppression neocolonization slavery war poverty and exploitation focusing on the tensions produced by histories of slavery and colonization and disrupting dominant modes of how we understand present times this edited volume takes it in a new direction defatalizing the ways in which we think about dominant narratives of violence peace and liberation and renewing what it means to decolonize today's world it challenges us to confront violence and suffering and articulates another way to think the world arguing for an understanding of the present as a vulnerable space through which radically different temporal experiences appear and it calls for a disruption of the everyday politics of expediency in the guise of neoliberalism and security this volume reorients the ethical and political assumptions that affectively imaginatively and practically captivate us simultaneously unsettling the familiar but dubious promises of a modernity that decimates political life re animating an international political the authors evoke people's struggles and movements that are neither about redemption nor erasure but a suspension of time for radical new beginnings

israel and palestine were worlds apart during the pandemic that claimed over five million lives globally while palestinians were forced to adopt crude survival measures and endure economic privations israel was praised as a vaccination world leader this book demonstrates how israel utilized the pandemic to tighten surveillance and control over palestine and the palestinians drawing on theories of settler colonialism and the concept of necropolitics the book is a vital testament to the reality of the israeli settler colonial project today the author uses case studies and interviews with palestinians from the gaza strip hebron kufr aqab and the jalazon refugee camp to understand the lived experiences of palestinians the newest colonial policies are discussed including how israel activated a counter terrorism database that could track citizens and ensure they adhered to lockdown regulations it also shows how israel destroyed palestinian infrastructure essential for water sanitation and hygiene leaving palestinians unable to fight the virus the book shows that for palestinians the pandemic was simply the latest in a long line of national catastrophes in a context where settler colonialism prevails

the palestinian refugee issue remains a central component of the arab israeli conflict this book explores the demographic and developmental challenges which the return of refugees to a future palestinian state would generate

crumbled shells of mosques in iraq the bombing of british cathedrals in world war ii the fall of the world trade center towers on september 11 when architectural totems such as these are destroyed by conflicts and the ravages of war more than mere buildings are at stake the destruction of memory reveals the extent to which a nation weds itself to its landscape robert bevan argues that such destruction not only shatters a nation's culture and morale but is also a deliberate act of eradicating a culture's memory and ultimately its existence bevan combs through world history to highlight a range of wars and conflicts in which the destruction of architecture was pivotal from cortez's razing of aztec cities to the carpet bombings of dresden and tokyo in world war ii to the war in the former yugoslavia the destruction of memory exposes the cultural war that rages behind architectural annihilation revealing that in this subliminal assault lies the complex aim of exterminating a people he provocatively argues for the fatally intertwined experience of genocide and cultural genocide ultimately proposing the elevation of cultural genocide to a crime punishable by international law in an age in which frank gehry i m pei and frank lloyd wright are revered and yet museums and temples of priceless value are destroyed in wars around the world bevan challenges the notion of collateral damage arguing that it is in fact a deliberate act of war

this title brings together vivid first hand descriptions with primary sources offering readers a comprehensive portrayal of the on the ground realities and providing a new framework for understanding the seemingly unending israeli palestinian conflict

a haunting memoir of war genocide displacement and a daughter's search for the literary works of her mother's murdered twin grieving the death of her mother in 2013 author isa milman embarked on a heart wrenching journey to unravel a family mystery the whereabouts of her aunt's long lost poems published in poland in the early 1930s which evolved into a broader investigation of her family's life before during and after the holocaust this powerful memoir chronicles a lesser known chapter of the second world war through the story of two sisters sabina isa's mother who survived the war and basia sabina's twin who did not exploring themes of loss and displacement regeneration and resilience isa discovers how her own story is woven into the immense yet intricate tapestry of the jewish experience as she delves into her family's history accompanied by her husband a native british columbian she travels to contemporary poland ukraine and germany and tries to reconcile her shifting appreciation of people and place in a world where anti semitism and other forms of extremism are on the rise

drawing on urban and community resilience literature urban preppers and the pandemic in new york city class resilience and sheltering in place offers a detailed qualitative analysis of the impact of the covid 19 pandemic on new york city and on the philosophy and practices of the city s urban prepper subculture with a special focus on the height of the pandemic in new york this book considers the city s unique position as the pandemic s first epicenter in the united states it also explores the lived experience of enduring the pandemic as reflections of class division considering key themes including the exodus of the wealthy sheltering in place for the middle class the inability to leave high risk neighborhoods for the poor and sheltering in place practices and community resilience efforts by new york preppers it analyzes the importance of good government and an engaged citizenry in developing an agenda for the city s continued recovery and its future underscoring the need for cities to develop disaster management approaches that expand traditional command and control models to make space for local knowledge and resources at its core urban preppers and the pandemic in new york city class resilience and sheltering in place is about understanding new york city s pandemic experience and how self reliance evolves into community resilience outside of institutions it is vital reading for scholars and students of sociology anthropology geography and urban studies with interests in subcultures ethnography and the sociology of disasters
