this book studies gender sexuality and representation in the mahabharata drawing on feminist theory queer theory and deconstructivist theory it revisits the epic as a saga of agency empowerment and subversion and examines how it gives the gendered marginal the women and the queer a voice the authors argue that in a fluid text like the mahabharata there is ample scope for contradiction and conformation as well as conflict and resolution which gives the marginal an opportunity to document resistance they analyse the stories of draupadi kunti renuka ulupi and hidimba within an anti patriarchal non normative post modern theoretical framework they also examine liminal figures like shikhandi yuvanashwa sudyumna and bhangashwan who are uniquely placed in conversation involving queer space marginalization and resistance an important addition to the study of indian epics this book will be indispensable for scholars and researchers of cultural studies subaltern studies indian literature english literature gender studies sexuality studies queer studies women s studies exclusion studies and postcolonial studies

this book explores representations of same sex desire in indian literature and film from the 1970s to the present through a

detailed analysis of poetry and prose by authors like vikram seth kamala das and neel mukherjee and films from bollywood and beyond including onir s my brother nikhil and deepa mehta s fire oliver ross argues that an initially euro american homosexuality with its connotations of an essential psychosexual orientation is reinvented as it overlaps with different elements of indian culture dismantling the popular belief that vocal gay and lesbian politics exist in contradistinction to a sexually conservative india this book locates numerous alternative practices and identities of same sex desire in indian history and modernity indeed many of these survived british colonialism with its importation of ideas of sexual pathology and perversity in changed or codified forms and they are often inflected by gay and lesbian identities in the present in this account oliver ross challenges the preconception that in the contemporary world a grand narrative of sexuality circulates globally and erases all pre existing narratives and embodiments of sexual desire

kerala christian sainthood is an ethnography based study that celebrates the multi vocal function of saints drawing on pilgrim anecdotes shrine practices official hagiographies and regional lore author corinne dempsey demonstrates how the business of saints routinely extends beyond their capacity as earthly conduits of miraculous power saintly characters described in this book hailing from the religiously pluralistic south indian state of kerala tend not only to the health and happiness of individual devotees but help craft and express the multiple identities and complex power relations of their devotional communities as well throughout the study dempsey highlights the traditions of sr alphonsa of bharananganam 1910 1946 and st george the martyr two figures who reflect the many preoccupations of kerala sainthood sr alphonsa native of kerala and famous for her life of suffering and posthumous power stands in line to be canonized by the vatican st george the caped dragon slayer imported to kerala by syrian merchants and later by portuguese and british colonizers is today partially debunked by rome these two figures while differing dramatically in temperament nationality age of cult and vatican standing boast a vast popular appeal in kerala s kottayam district in examining sr alphonsa and st george dempsey shows how kerala s saint traditions reflect devotees hybrid identities in both colonial and postcolonial times this ethnography of christian sainthood within a hindu cultural context of foreign traditions adopted by native practice and of female sanctity negotiated through patriarchal expectation is poised at a number of intersections dempsey provides not only a comparative study of cultures religions and worldviews but also a unique grounding for contemporary ethnographic post colonial and feminist concerns

the book is a study of literature in india in the context of recent discussions on modernity and its theoretical extensions such as the everyday and the social imaginary it is a critique of the aesthetics and politics of modernity as they are embodied in indian bhasha literature of the past two centuries the primary objective of the book is to explore the trajectory of modernity after indian literature encountered colonialism in the early 19th century the intricate ways in which the bhasha imagination negotiated questions around concepts such as colonialism aesthetics the literary the historical and the social have received focused attention in the analysis although the study acknowledges the european provenance of modernity as a historical idea it also recognizes the inherent complexity of the concept and its equivocal connotations when used with reference to the polyphonic bhasha communities in india theoretical issues debated in relation to modernity such as its conceptual affinities with the western enlightenment project its ideological investment in european aesthetics and its implication for the evolution of what might be called the hermetic aesthetic are significant to this study the work also examines the regional strengths of the social imaginary that render a conventionally conceived modernity inadequate in explaining the uniquely modern strengths of the indian bhasha imagination

king governance and law in ancient india presents an english translation of kautilya's arthashastra as along with detailed endnotes when it was discovered in 1923 the arthashastra was described as perhaps the most precious work in the whole range of sanskrit literature an assessment that still rings true this new translation of this significant text the first in close to half a century takes into account a number of important advances in our knowledge of the texts inscriptions and archeological and art historical remains from the period in indian history to which the as belongs 2nd 3rd century ce although parts of it may be much older the text is what we would today call a scientific treatise it codifies a body of knowledge handed down in expert traditions it is specifically interested in two things first how a king can expand his territory keep enemies at bay enhance his external power and amass riches second how a king can best organize his state bureaucracy to consolidate his internal power to suppress internal enemies to expand the economy to enhance his treasury through taxes duties and entrepreneurial activities to keep law and order and to settle disputes among his subjects the book is accordingly divided into two sections the first encompassing books 15 deals with internal matters and the second spanning books 6 14 deals with external relations and warfare the as stands alone there is nothing like it before it and there is nothing after it if there were other textual productions within that genre they are now irretrievably lost even though we know of many authors who preceded kautilya none of their works have survived the success of the as being textually unique makes it difficult to understand and interpret difficult passages and terms we cannot look to parallels for help the as is also unique in that first it covers such a vast variety of topics and second it presents in textual form expert traditions in numerous areas of human and social endeavors that were handed down orally expert knowledge in diverse fields communicated orally from teacher to pupil from father to son is here for the first time codified in text these fields include building practices of houses forts and cities gems and gemology metals and metallurgy mining forestry and forest management agriculture manufacture of liquor animal

husbandry shipping and the management of horses and elephants and so on finally it is also unique in presenting a viewpoint distinctly different from the brahmanical party line we see in most ancient indian documents

the vibrant media landscape in the southern indian state of kerala where kiosks overflow with magazines and colorful film posters line roadside walls creates a sexually charged public sphere that has a long history of political protests the 2014 kiss of love campaign garnered national attention sparking controversy as images of activists kissing in public and dragged into police vans flooded the media in unruly figures navaneetha mokkil tracks the cultural practices through which sexual figures particularly the sex worker and the lesbian are produced in the public imagination her analysis includes representations of the prostitute figure in popular media trajectories of queerness in malayalam films public discourse on lesbian sexuality the autobiographical project of sex worker and activist nalini jameela and the memorialization of murdered transgender activist sweet maria showing how various marginalized figures stage their own fractured journeys of resistance in the post 1990s context of globalization by bringing a substantial body of malayalam language literature and media texts on gender sexuality and social justice into conversation with current debates around sexuality studies and transnational feminism in asian and anglo american academia mokkil reorients the debates on sexuality in india by considering the fraught trajectories of identity and rights
