this book addresses practical issues in connoisseurship and authentication as well as the legal implications that arise when an artwork's authenticity is challenged in addition the standards and processes of authentication are critically examined and the legal complications which can inhibit the expression of expert opinions are discussed the notion of authenticity has always commanded the attention of art market participants and the general art minded public alike coinciding with this forgery is often considered to be the world's most glamorous crime packed with detective stories that are usually astonishing and often bizarre the research includes findings by economists sociologists art historians lawyers academics and practitioners all of which yield insights into the mechanics and peculiarities of the art business and explain why it works so differently from other markets however this book will be of interest not only to academics but to everyone interested in

once the us was the only country in the world to offer a doctorate for studio artists however the phd in fine art disappeared after pressures established the mfa as the terminal degree for visual artists subsequently the phd in fine art emerged in the uk and is now offered by approximately 40 universities today the doctorate is offered in most english speaking nations much of the eu and countries such as china and brazil using historical political and social frameworks this book investigates the evolution of the fine art doctorate in the uk what the concept of a phd means to practicing artists from the us and why this degree disappeared in the us when it is so vigorously embraced in the uk and other countries data collected through in depth interviews examine the perspectives of professional artists in the us who teach graduate level fine art these interviews disclose conflicting attitudes toward this advanced degree and reveal the possibilities and challenges of developing a potential doctorate in studio art in the us

examines the role of the sacred in art and makes a compelling case for its continued contemporary relevance

exploring key issues for the anthropology of art and art theory this fascinating text provides the first in depth study of community art from an anthropological perspective the book focuses on the forty year history of free form arts trust an arts group that played a major part in the 1970s struggle to carve out a space for community arts in britain turning their back on the world of gallery art the fine artist founders of free form were determined to use their visual expertise to connect through collaborative art projects with the working class people excluded by the established art world in seeking to give the residents of poor communities a greater role in shaping their built environment the artists aesthetic practice



would be transformed community art examines this process of aesthetic transformation and its rejection of the individualized practice of the gallery artist the free form story calls into question common understandings of the categories of art expertise and community and makes this story relevant beyond late twentieth century and early twenty first century britain

in art language international robert bailey reconstructs the history of the conceptual art collective art language situating it in a geographical context to rethink its implications for the broader histories of contemporary art focusing on its international collaborations with dozens of artists and critics in and outside the collective between 1969 and 1977 bailey positions art language at the center of a historical shift from euro american modernism to a global contemporary art he documents the collective s growth and reach from transatlantic discussions on the nature of conceptual art and the establishment of distinct working groups in new york and england to the collective s later work in australia new zealand and yugoslavia bailey also details its publications associations with political organizations and the internal power struggles that precipitated its breakdown analyzing a wide range of artworks texts music and films he reveals how art language navigated between art worlds to shape the international profile of conceptual art above all bailey underscores how the group s rigorous and interdisciplinary work provides a gateway to understanding how conceptual art operates as a mode of thinking that exceeds the visual to shape the philosophical historical and political

although numerous studies have examined biblical and theological rationales for using the visual arts in worship this book by lisa j deboer fills in a piece of the picture missing so far the social dimensions of both our churches and the various art worlds represented in our congregations the first part of the book looks at orthodoxy catholicism and protestantism in turn including case studies of specific congregations showing how each tradition s use of the visual arts reveals an underlying ecclesiology deboer then focuses on six themes that emerge when orthodox catholic and protestant uses of the visual arts are examined together the arts as expressions of the church s local and universal character the meanings attributed to particular styles of art for the church the role of the arts in enculturating the gospel and more deboer s visual arts in the worshiping church will focus and deepen the thinking of pastors worship leaders artists students and laypeople regarding what the arts might do in the midst of their congregations

the question of whether seventeenth century painters such as rembrandt and rubens were exclusively responsible for the paintings later sold under their names has caused many a heated debate despite the rise of scholarship on the history of the art market much is still unknown about the ways in which paintings were produced assessed priced and marketed during this period which leads to several provocative questions did contemporary connoisseurs expect masters such as rembrandt to paint works entirely by their own hand

the films of john waters b 1946 are some of the most powerful send ups of conventional film forms and expectations since luis buñuel and salvador dali s un chien andalou in attempting to reinvigorate the experience of movie going with his shock comedy waters has been willing to take the chance of offending nearly everyone his characters have great dignity and resourcefulness taking what s different or unacceptable or grotesque about themselves heightening it and turning it into a handmade personal style the interviews collected here span waters s career from 1965 to 2010 and include a new one exclusive to this edition waters began making films in his hometown of baltimore in 1964 demonstrating an innate talent at capturing the hideous and crude and elevating it to art he reached international acclaim with his outrageous shock comedy pink flamingos this landmark film redefined cinema and became a cult classic appearing in this and many of waters s early films his star divine would consistently challenge gender definitions with polyester waters entered the mainstream the film starred divine as an unhappy housewife who romances a former teen idol played by tab hunter waters s commercial breakthrough hairspray told the story of baltimore s televised sock hop program the corny collins show and how one brave girl ricki lake used her platform as a dancer to end segregation in her town from serial mom and pecker to cecil b demented waters continued to infiltrate the mainstream with his unique approach to filmmaking as a visual artist he was given a retrospective at the new museum of contemporary art in 2004 which was shown at galleries around the world
